OAKLAND ATHLETICS (86-73) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (66-93)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and seven of the last 10 games...are 14-29 (.326) dating back to August 10 when they had a four-game lead in the West, an 11-game lead in the Wild Card and were a season-high 28 games over .500...that is the second worst record in the majors over that

span (Arizona, 12-30)...are 8-19 (.296) dating back to August 28 (first game of the four-game series at Los Angeles), which is the worst record in the majors...are 27-37 (.422) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Boston for second worst in the AL (Minnesota, 24-41)...are in sole possession of the second Wild Card, one game behind the first Wild Card (Kansas City) and two games ahead of the third place team (Seattle)...are in second place in the AL West for the 31st consecutive day and 37th time in the last 39 days...trail the Angels by 12 games...have 119 days alone in first place in the West, eight days tied for first, 40 days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had 112 straight days with at least a share of first from April 24 to August 17 (including 106 consecutive days alone from April 28 to August 15)...the A's largest lead in the West was six games as late as June 21 and the largest lead in the Wild Card was 11½ games on July 18.

MAGIC NUMBERS: The A's have a magic number of two to clinch a Wild Card spot...have a magic number of five to clinch home field for the Wild Card game and Kansas City has a magic number of two for home field (Kansas City owns the tiebreaker)...have lost the season series to Detroit (2-5), Kansas City (2-5) and Seattle (9-10)...were officially eliminated in the American League West September 17 in game 151.

OFFENSE: The A's have been shut out five times in the last 26 games last night and are batting .213 (184 for 865) with 78 runs scored (3.00 per game) over that span...were shut out just six times over the first 133 contests...**lead the majors** in walks (580) and have the second fewest strikeouts (1087)...are tied for the AL lead in triples (32), have the second lowest batting average (.244) and are tied for third in runs (715).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a .291 opponents on-base percentage...that is the lowest by a Major League team since 1988 (NYM, .291) and the lowest by an AL team since 1972 (BAL, .282 and OAK, .284)...have compiled a 2.78 ERA (44 er in 142.1 ip) over the last 16 games...now have a 3.24 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Seattle, 3.23) and third lowest in the majors...the last time the A's finished the season with an ERA under 3.48 was in 1990 (3.18)...also rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.357) and have the third fewest walks (406)...walked 428 last year, which was second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (415 in 1976)...have set an Athletics record with 1223 strikeouts, breaking the previous mark of 1183 set last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-8 with a 2.66 ERA (41 er in 138.2 ip) over the last 21 games...have a 3.39 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...the last time A's starters had an ERA under 3.47 was in 1989 (3.34)...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (6) and rank third in innings pitched (973.0).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 110 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 114)...A's outfielders have 35 assists, which is tied with Minnesota for second in the AL (Boston, 37).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final road trip of the season to Texas...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Chicago (1-3) and Seattle (2-1) and have lost 17 of their last 23 road games...are 38-40 (.487) on the road for the season...went 3-6 on their final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3), Philadelphia (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...have posted on a losing record on back-to-back homestands after 11 consecutive homestands with a winning record...lost 10 of their last 14 home games...went 48-33 (.595) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this is the A's fifth consecutive season with a winning record at home.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 83 of 101 (82.2%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland

record is 80.7% set in 2008...opponents have been successful in 98 of 124 (79.0%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors...the Oakland record is 81.3% in 2005.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12 for their last 87 (.138) after going 19 for their first 64 (.297)...**lead the American League** in doubles (8) and walks (24), rank second in hits (31), extra base hits (11) and plate appearances (180), tied for second in home runs (3) and third in RBI (22)...the eight doubles match the most by an Oakland team in the designated hitter era (1983, 1999)...the Oakland record is nine in 1972...the 24 walks and 11 extra base hits are second most in the DH era (26 walks in 1997, 12 extra base hits in 1978).

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-8 (.619) in extra inning games...the wins and games (21) are both one short of the Oakland record...had 14 wins in 1988 and 22 games in 1969 and 1976...are tied for the Major League lead in extra inning games and tied for second in wins...have 10 walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the American League...are 24-18 in games decided in the last at bat, which are tied for the second most last at bat wins in Oakland history (26 in 2004)...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and rank third in last at bat games...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (13) and eight innings (8), are tied for the lead in losses when leading after eight innings (7) and tied for second in losses when leading after seven innings (9)...the wins when trailing after seven innings are an Oakland record (previous: 12 in 1969) and the wins when trailing after eight innings are second most in Oakland history (10 in 1971)...the losses when leading after eight innings match the second most in Oakland history (9 in 1980).

ONE AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's are 31-40 (.437) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 21-27 (.438) in one-run games...the one-run losses are the A's most since 1987 when they also had 27...have not lost more than 27 one-run games since 1986 (29)...are 55-33 (.625) in games decided by three runs or more, which is second best in the AL (Los Angeles, 54-30, .643).

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors with a run differential of +150 (Los Angeles-AL, +148)...have used just two rookies (Anderson, Burns) and neither was a pitcher...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team to go an entire season without using a rookie pitcher since Toronto in 1981...the A's have used just 25 replay challenges, which is the fewest in the majors...have an average time of game of 3 hours and 5 minutes, which is second longest in Oakland history, but fourth quickest in the American League this year.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail the season series 9-7 with three games remaining...went 2-7 in Oakland and are 5-2 in Texas...the seven losses at home are the most in Oakland history against the Rangers (previous: six, seven times)...have won each of the previous two season series after losing five of the previous six...are 28-26 over the last three years...are 320-333 all-time against the Texas Rangers...have an all-time record of 417-415 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have an attendance of 2,003,628 at home, which marks the first time Oakland has drawn 2,000,000 since 2005 (2,109,118)...**Josh Donaldson** has 42 double plays, which is one short of the Oakland record for a third baseman (Eric Chavez, 2006)...**Adam Dunn** has 462 home runs, which is tied with Jose Canseco for 35th in Major League history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell, who struck out 302 batters in 1903 and 349 the following season, as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in 1974 Catfish Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins, 2-1...it is his 25th win, which establishes an Oakland record, and is also his fourth straight 20-win season...in 2002 the A's clinch their second AL West title in the last three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200th hit of the season in that game to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (14-9, 3.63 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with an 8.58 ERA (27 er in 28.1 ip) and .322 (39 for 121) opponents batting average over his last six starts...has walked 14 batters in 28.1 innings (4.45 per nine innings)...the losing streak matches the A's season high and is his only losing streak of the season...it is his longest losing streak since August 13-September 14, 2010 when he dropped five in a row.

SINCE JUNE 24: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts entering play on June 24 and was leading the American League in ERA...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and is 5-7 with a 5.30 ERA (52 er in 88.1 ip) and .280 (97 for 346) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts...his ERA since June 24 is third highest in the AL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth in the American League in complete games (20), has the seventh highest run support (5.50) and is tied for 10th in opponents grounded into double plays (19).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION: Has allowed a .198 (26 for 131) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .085 (5 for 59) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP and two outs is second lowest by a Major League pitcher with 162 or more innings pitched since 1974, which is the earliest year complete data is available...his

complete data is available...his average with RISP is fifth lowest in the American League this year among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-6 with a 5.86 ERA (43 er in 66.0 ip) and .300 (79 for 253) opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 11-3 with a 2.38 ERA and .206 opponents average in 19 starts before the break...his post-break ERA is second highest in the majors (Danks, CWS 6.31) and the losses are tied for fifth in the American League.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-4 with a 5.12 ERA (33 er in 58.0 ip) in 11 starts against American League West competition compared to 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA (41 er in 125.1 ip) in 20 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 10-5 with a 4.30 ERA (46 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest compared to 4-4 with a 2.90 ERA (28 er in 87.0 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA (25 er in 75.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day compared to 9-6 with a 4.08 ERA (49 er in 108.0 ip) in 19 starts at night...has allowed just two home runs in 75.1 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 3.11 ERA (45 er in 130.1 ip) in 22 starts during the day over the last two years, 14-13 with a 4.27 ERA (100 er in 211.0 ip) in 38 starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .142 (51 for 360) batting average with two strikes, which ranks fifth in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has surrendered 14 of his 16 home runs this year and 30 of his 35 over the last two years to righties...has held the number eight hitter in the order to a .129 (9 for 70) batting average, which is second lowest in the majors.

CAREER NOTES: Has career highs in wins (14) and complete games (2)...this is his seventh season with 10 or more wins...had just one complete game in 208 career starts entering the season...has nine losses and has reached double figures in losses once in his career (15 in 2010)...is scheduled to make his 32nd start today, which are his most in seven years (34 in 2007 with Tampa Bay)...has 183.1 innings pitched, which is the third highest total of his career and his most since tossing a career-high 206.2 in 2007...his .296 opponents on-base percentage and .360 slugging percentage are currently career-lows (.305 OBP in 2006, .374 SLG in 2005)...his 2.45 walks per nine innings are also a career low (2.68 in 2013).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 20-11 (.645) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 24 of his 31 starts and has tossed six or more innings 22 times...has four starts of three innings or fewer, which are second most by an A's starter over the last 14 years (5, Lenny DiNardo in 2007)...has two starts of 1.1 innings or fewer, which match the most by an A's pitcher over the last 20 years (last: Jimmy Haynes in 1999)...was named to his third American League All-Star team and entered the game to start the sixth inning (0.2 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...has not allowed a run in three career All-Star Game appearances (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 2 so), including a win in 2008.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6, 10-inning win over Philadelphia last Sunday in Oakland...allowed 11 hits in 5.1 innings, which were his most in a game since July 10, 2010 at Oakland (also 11)...allowed a RBI double to Byrd in the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...allowed a two-run double to Byrd in the third but the A's scored once in the bottom of the inning to take a 4-3 lead...allowed a RBI double to Ruiz in the fourth but the A's scored twice in the fifth to take a 6-4 lead...allowed a RBI triple to Galvis and a RBI single to Revere in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings with the scored tied 6-6.

KAZMIR vs. TEXAS: Is 8-5 with a 3.47 ERA (98.2 ip, 99 h, 47 r, 38 er, 28 bb, 95 so, 9 hr) in 17 career starts...is 5-3 with a 3.34 ERA (22 er in 59.1 ip) in 10 starts in Texas and 3-2 with a 3.66 ERA (16 er in 39.1 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks...is 2-1 with a 5.65 ERA (14.1 ip, 23 h, 11 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year...the first win came in a 9-3 victory at Texas April 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...also picked up the win in another 9-3 victory at Texas July 27...the A's scored five times in the second inning and he allowed two runs in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Rosales...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on September 16...allowed a two-run home run to Smolinski and a RBI single to Robertson in the fourth...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the fourth, but he was charged with three runs, one earned, in the fifth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jeff Samardzija (5-5, 2.92 ERA): Is 2-2 despite a 1.40 ERA over his last six starts dating back to August 25...has struck out 47 and walked just three while allowing three home runs...his ERA since August 25 is eighth lowest in the American League...has a streak of 23.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run...has struck out 90 and walked just 12 in 104.2 innings with the A's...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.50 is the highest in Athletics history and sixth in AL history among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...his average of 1.03 walks per nine innings is second lowest in Athletics history among pitchers with 100 or more innings...is scheduled to make his 33rd start of the season, which matches his career high from last year...with 212.2 innings, needs 1.1 more for a new career high from last year...with 212.2 innings, needs 1.1 more for a new career high...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) on Monday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance a start in the A's 6-1 loss in Oakland earlier this month on September 17 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 10 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

26-23, 2.93 ERA (151 er in 464.1 ip) **Saves/Opportunities:** 31-for-52 (59.6%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 15 runs in 24.0 innings (5.63 ERA) over its last nine games after allowing three runs in 14.2 innings over its previous six games (1 er, 0.61 ERA).
- Has converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save chances, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...has the second fewest saves...is 3-for-10 (30.0%) in save chances since August 24.
- Leads the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.280) and is second in batting average (.223), slugging percentage (.331) and ERA (2.93)...is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (41).
