OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-2-1) VS. CHICAGO CUBS (1-7-1)

FRIDAY, MARCH 13, 2015 – CASHMAN FIELD – 5:05 P.M. PT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight to improve to 7-2-1, which is the second best record in the Cactus League behind Kansas City (9-1)... are 5-1 at Hohokam and 2-1-1 on the road...rank second in the CL in batting (.292), slugging (.477) and on-base percentage (.367) to the Royals (.316/.508/.369)...are tied for the CL lead in doubles (29) and triples (5) and rank second in walks (41)...the pitching staff is tied for third in the CL in strikeouts (74)...have one tie game this spring after tallying five last year, which were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...now have 17 tie games over the last seven springs...are scheduled to play 35 games this spring, including 30 games in Arizona, two in Las Vegas against the Cubs (March 13-14) and three in the Bay Area against the Giants (April 2-4)...this is the A's 47th Spring Training in Arizona...return to Mesa for the first time since 1978...after training in Bradenton in Florida in 1968, the A's moved to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...the A's went 15-13-5 last spring, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight.

YESTERDAY: The A's recorded their second walk-off win of the spring with a 4-3 victory over Seattle...Billy Burns tripled to lead off the game and scored one batter later on a Sam Fuld sacrifice fly but the A's would not get another hit until the seventh inning...Scott Kazmir started for the A's and allowed two runs in 2.2 innings and Chad Smith allowed a run in the sixth to give the Mariners a 3-1 lead...the A's then scored three times in the ninth inning for the win...Mark Canha doubled and scored on a Jordy Lara error, Bryan Anderson tied the game with a RBI double and Kent Matthes drove in pinch runner Chad Pinder with a single for the win...Rudy Owens retired the side in order in the eighth and ninth innings for the win and Matt Buschmann (1.1 ip), Dan Otero (1.0) and Jim Fuller (1.0) tossed scoreless relief.

A's vs. CUBS: This is the second of four meetings between the A's and Cubs this spring...the two clubs played to a 2-2 tie in the first contest March 5 at Sloan Field...meet again here in Las Vegas tomorrow and square off at Hohokam March 24...the A's lost two of three last spring, splitting two games in Phoenix and losing at Mesa.

PLAYER NOTES: **Billy Burns** leads the Cactus League in triples (2) and is tied for fourth in hits (7)...is one of two Athletics to appear in all 10 games (Pridie)...has appeared in nine games in center field and four in left field...**Billy Butler** has two hits this spring, both home runs...is tied for third in the CL in home runs...has appeared in four games at designated hitter and two at first base...**Mark Canha** hit his second home run Tuesday against Arizona, which is tied for third in the Cactus League...is tied for fourth in runs (5)...has appeared in three games in right field, three in left field and two at first base...**Luke Carlin (NR)** has hit safely in four of his five games (4-for-11, .364)...**Ike Davis** had his second multiple hit game Tuesday against Arizona and has hit safely in three of his four games (5-for-10, .500)...**Sam Fuld** went 3-for-4 with a pair of doubles Tuesday against the Diamondbacks after going 2-for-13 (.154) over his first five games...is tied for fourth in the CL in runs (5)...has made all seven of his appearances in center field...**Craig Gentry** has appeared in three games in right field and three in center field...**Alex Hassan** has appeared in six games in left field and two in right field...**Tyler Ladendorf** has appeared in three games at second base, two in left field, two at third base and one at shortstop...**Max Muncy (NR)** is tied for second in the CL in doubles (3)...**Renato Nuñez** had two hits last Sunday against Chicago (AL) and is 3-for-6 (.500) over his last three games after going 0-for-4 over his first two contests...**Matt Olson (NR)** hit his first home run Monday at Texas and is 3-for-8 (.375) with three walks over his last three games after going 0-for-8 over his first four contests...is tied for fifth in the CL in walks (4)...**Andy Parrino (NR)** is tied for fifth in the CL in walks (4)...has appeared in six games at shortstop, four at second base and one at third base...**Josh Phegley** was 3-for-3 with three doubles and three RBI a week ago today at Arizona...is tied for second in the CL in doubles (3)...**Jason Pridie (NR)** is one of two Athletics to appear in all 10 games (Burns)...has appeared in nine games in right field and two in center field...**Marcus Semien** is tied for the Major League lead in RBI (7)...is tied for second in the CL in hits (8), tied for third in home runs (2), ranks fourth in batting (.444), tied for fourth in on-base percentage (.524) and runs (5), tied for fifth in total bases (14) and tied for seventh in slugging (.778)...has appeared exclusively at shortstop...**Eric Sogard** has appeared in four games at second base and three at shortstop...**Ben Zobrist** is tied for second in the CL in doubles (3)...has appeared in five games at second base and one in right field.

AT LAS VEGAS: The A's will face the Chicago Cubs in split squad action at Cashman Field in Las Vegas today at 5:05 pm and Saturday at 12:05 pm...today's game will be tape delayed on MLB Network at 9:00 pm and tomorrow's will air on the A's Radio Network...these will be the A's first Spring Training games in Las Vegas since 2000...Oakland also played the first six games of the 1996 season at Cashman Field as the Coliseum was still undergoing renovations for the return of the Raiders.

IN CAMP: The A's have 62 players in camp, which does not include two players on the 60-day disabled list (Griffin, Thompson)...that includes 40 players on the 40-man roster and 22 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 32 pitchers, six catchers, 17 infielders and seven outfielders.

OFF SEASON MOVES: The A's made nine trades this offseason involving 27 players...15 of the 17 players the A's acquired in those trades are in camp...the two exceptions are Yunel Escobar, who was traded four days after being acquired, and Franklin Barreto, who is in the A's minor league camp...in addition to the players acquired in trades, the A's also signed free agent Billy Butler to a three-year contract and claimed Alex Hassan, Chad Smith and Taylor Thompson off waivers.

HOW THE A'S WERE BUILT: Of the 40 active players on the 40-man roster, only two were drafted by the A's (Doolittle, compensation pick following the 1st round in 2007, and Gray, 1st in 2011)...one other (Nuñez) was signed as a non-drafted free agent...five were claimed off waivers (Freiman, Hassan, Otero, Scribner, Smith) and four were signed as free agents (Butler, Crisp, Kazmir, O'Flaherty)...the other 28 were all acquired in trades.

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Seven of the A's top 10 prospects according to Baseball America are in major league camp this spring: Matt Olson (#2), Renato Nuñez (#4), Chris Bassitt (#5), Kendall Graveman (#6), Sean Nolin (#7), Rangel Ravelo (#8) and Raul Alcantara (#10)...the other three are Franklin Barreto (#1), Matt Chapman (#3) and Dillon Overton (#9)...five of the top 10 were acquired in trades this offseason.

MINOR LEAGUE DATES: Minor League pitchers and catchers have reported...position players report today, with the first workout scheduled for Saturday...Triple-A and Double-A games begin tomorrow and Single-A games start March 21.

A's MEDIA ALERTS: The A's Media Relations Department will provide as up-to-date information as possible through its media-only Twitter account...for clubhouse hours, interview times and various media alerts, please follow @AsMediaAlerts...player transactions and other relevant game information will continue to be posted at @Athletics.

A's ON THE AIR: The A's radio network and flagship station 95.7 FM The Game will broadcast 12 games this spring, including nine from Arizona and all three games against San Francisco in the Bay Area in April...the schedule includes all Saturday and Sunday games and the night game against the Giants on March 26...Ken Korach returns for his 20th year in the broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (10th) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 30th season in the booth...Comcast SportsNet California has one remaining telecast on April 2 against the Giants in San Francisco (7:15 pm)...Glen Kuiper joins Fosse in the broadcast booth...all games not broadcast over the air can be heard live via the club's web site...in addition, 15 games will be televised by MLB Network...12 of those will air in the Bay Area, including five live broadcasts and six tape delayed.

RETURN TO HOHOKAM: The A's and the City of Mesa reached a 20-year agreement for the team to return to Mesa in March of 2013...Oakland also holds two five-year options that could extend the contract to 30 years...the deal includes \$26.9 million in renovations to Hohokam Stadium and Fitch Park...Hohokam Stadium will seat 10,000 fans, including approximately 7,500 seats and space for approximately 2,500 additional fans to sit on the grass berms surrounding the outfield...among Hohokam Stadium's many new amenities will be the largest HD scoreboard in the Cactus League (26 x 56 feet).

STARTING PITCHER #13 DREW POMERANZ LHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his second appearance and start of the spring...had a no decision in his first start last Sunday against Chicago (AL)...spent most of the 2014 season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304)...his opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...has allowed 22 of his 25 career home runs against righties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs.

#48 RYAN COOK RHP (0-0, 1 save, 4.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring...retired the side in order in the ninth inning Tuesday against Arizona for the save (1.0 ip, 1 so) after allowing a run in his first appearance last Saturday against Los Angeles-AL (1.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...appeared in 54 games with the A's in 2014 despite two stints on the disabled list and was 1-3 with a save and a 3.42 ERA...the games pitched were his fewest in his three seasons with the A's and his ERA was his highest...struck out 50 batters in 50.0 innings...has 204 strikeouts in 198.1 career innings, an average of 9.26 per nine innings...allowed three home runs and has surrendered just nine in 198.1 career innings, an average of 0.41 per nine innings...allowed a .184 opponents batting average, which included a .138 (15-for-109) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .262 (17-for-65) against left-handers...had 13 walks and 13 strikeouts against lefties, nine walks and 37 strikeouts against righties...has a .180 (74-for-412) career average against right-handers, .236 (73-for-309) against left-handers...opponents hit .181 with the bases empty, .188 with runners on...allowed 12-of-29 (41.4%) inherited runners to score...has allowed 36-of-86 (41.9%) inherited runners to score in his career, which is the highest mark in the majors since 2011 when he made his Major League debut...yielded a .265 batting average against first batters faced.

#68 ARNOLD LEON RHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring...has not allowed a run in his first two games (2.0 ip), including his last appearance Sunday against Chicago-AL (1.0 ip, 1 h)...spent the entire 2014 season at Triple-A Sacramento with the exception of a one day stay with Oakland...was recalled as the 26th man for the May 7 doubleheader against Seattle...did not pitch and was sent back to Sacramento following the game...went 10-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 27 starts with the River Cats...tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League in wins and ranked seventh in strikeouts (128)...also tied for third in games started...ranked third in the A's farm system in strikeouts, tied for third in wins and fifth in innings pitched (145.0)...led Sacramento in wins, starts, innings and strikeouts...had career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, hits (170), runs (84), earned runs (80), walks (51), wild pitches (14) and balks (2)...allowed a .295 opponents batting average, including .290 (78-for-269) against left-handed hitters compared to .300 (92-for-307) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 12 home runs to righties but issued 32 of his 51 walks to lefties...pitched for Culiacan in the Mexican Pacific Winter League following the season and went 4-2 with a 2.05 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in 10 starts.

#39 ERIC O'FLAHERTY LHP (1-0, 4.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring...has allowed one run in each of his two appearances, including his last outing Tuesday against Arizona when he picked up the win (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr)...was 1-0 with a save and a 2.25 ERA in 21 games with the A's last year in his comeback from May 21, 2013 Tommy John surgery...struck out 15 and walked just four for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.75...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs (also 2012)...allowed a .205 opponents batting average, including .186 (8-for-43) against right-handed hitters compared to .233 (7-for-30) against left-handers...did not allow an extra-base hit to a left-hander...righties slugged .419...has not allowed a home run to a left-handed hitter since Aug. 14, 2011 against Chicago-NL (Carlos Pena)...issued three of his four walks to lefties...yielded a .107 batting average with runners on base compared to .267 with the bases empty...all three of the home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents batted .067 with runners in scoring position and were 0-for-8 with RISP and two outs...began the season on the 60-day disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...started his rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 6 against High Desert (1.0 ip, 3 so)...was transferred to Triple-A Sacramento June 11 and had a loss and a 4.32 ERA in seven games with the River Cats.

#74 PAT VENDITTE SHP (0-0, 9.00 ERA)

The non-roster invitee is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring...allowed two runs in his last outing Sunday against Chicago-AL (0.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so) after not allowing a run over his first two appearances (1.2 ip)...began the 2014 season at Double-A Trenton and went 0-1 with a save and a 0.82 ERA in 15 relief appearances before he was promoted to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre May 17...went 2-5 with a 3.36 ERA in 26 games, including two starts, with the Yankees Triple-A affiliate...combined for a 2-6 record and a 2.64 ERA in 41 games overall...struck out 83 batters in 78.1 innings for an average of 9.54 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed a .222 opponents batting average, including .206 (20-for-97) against left-handed pitching compared to .230 (45-for-196) against right-handers...surrendered five of his six home runs to righties...left-handers had just three extra base hits (two doubles) for a .258 slugging percentage...opponents went 0-for-17 with runners in scoring position at Trenton and hit .186 overall in that situation...including .154 with RISP and two outs...yielded a .250 batting average and four of his six home runs with the bases empty, .188 with runners on base...allowed 3-of-19 (15.8%) inherited runners to score...compiled a 1.74 ERA in nine games during the day, 2.97 in 32 night games.
