OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-1) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (1-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of the season for the eighth time in the last 11 years...have started each of the previous four seasons 1-2 (were 2-1 after three games in 2010)...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and

Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span... have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships... only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8622-9048 (.488) in their previous 114 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to Houston (three games), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THIS AND THAT: The A's allowed their first run of the season in the third inning last night, snapping a season-opening 11-inning scoreless streak... that was the longest such streak in Oakland history and tied for fifth longest in Athletics history...it was the longest since 1958 (12 innings)...have tripled in each of the first two games for the second time in Oakland history (1983)...snapped their Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak with an 8-0 win Monday night.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Reddick, Thompson)...those are the most players on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

BEANE AND MELVIN: The A's have compiled a 1485-1269 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9)...Oakland has a 326-261 (.555) record since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is sixth best in the majors.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001... had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and

walks (112), third in triples (14), tied for third in home runs (33) and fewest grounded into double plays (22), fourth in hit by pitches (12) and strikeouts (255) and fifth in batting (.280)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262) and third in most walks (104)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitching staff during the spring since at least 1991, topping the 247 from last year, and the ERA is second lowest (3.29 in 1994)...committed the third fewest errors in the CL (23).

OFF SEASON TRADES: Nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were acquired in a trade (Alvarez, Clippard, Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Lawrie, Phegley, Semien, Zobrist)...those are the most players on an A's Opening Day roster acquired via trade during the previous off-season since at least 1992, when Opening Day rosters are first available... the previous high was six in 2005...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players.

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...Tyler Ladendorf has been with the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from Minnesota for Orlando Cabrera, July 31, 2009.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's currently have four rookies on the roster (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman, Ladendorf)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster as Billy Burns was optioned to Nashville today...had no rookies on the Opening Day roster last year and used just two rookies the entire season (Anderson and Burns)...four players on the Opening Day roster had six or more years of service: Scott Kazmir (8 years, 119 days), Ben Zobrist (7 years, 134 days), Billy Butler (7 years, 102 days) and Eric O'Flaherty (7 years, 62 days)...the A's added a fifth today in Cody Ross (9 years, 58 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...the A's roster features three players under the age of 25...R.J. Alvarez is the youngest at 23 years, 301 days and he is followed by Kendall Graveman (24 years, 105 days) and Marcus Semien (24 years, 200 days)...there were nine players on the Opening Day roster that were at least 30 years old...Ben Zobrist was the oldest at 33 years, 314 days...he is followed by Sam Fuld (33 years, 136 days) and Jesse Chavez (31 years, 227 days)...Cody Ross, who joins the A's today, was 34 years, 103 days on Opening Day.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have split the first two games of 2015 after losing the season series last year, 10-9...went 2-7 in Oakland and 7-3 in Texas...the seven losses at home were the most in Oakland history against the Rangers and the seven wins on the road matched the most in Oakland history against Texas (1972, 2003, 2005)...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years...are 57-59 over the last seven years...are 323-335 all-time against the Texas Rangers... that breaks down to 170-159 in Oakland and 153-176 in Texas...have an all-time record of 420-417 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sam Fuld has tripled in each of his first two games for the second consecutive season...is the only player in Oakland history to triple in each of his first two games in a season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** the A's and the Phillies meet in a City Series game before 15,000 fans at Shibe Park for the first legal Sunday baseball game ever played in Philadelphia...in **1982** Rickey Henderson ties a club record with five walks but the A's lose to California 8-6 in 16 innings...in **2003** Barry Zito extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 2-1 win at Texas, the fifth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...in **2006** Zito combines with the A's bullpen on a one-hit shutout in a 3-0 win at Seattle after the A's pitching staff tosses a two-hit shutout against the Mariners the night before...the three hits allowed in consecutive games sets an Oakland record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (15-9, 3.55 ERA in 2014)

AGAINST THE WEST: Compiled a 4-4 record and a 4.71 ERA in 12 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA in 20 starts against everyone else...over the previous two years, he is 7-7 with a 5.08 ERA (60 er in 106.1 ip) in 20 starts against the AL West, 18-11 with a 3.20 ERA (86 er in 242.0 ip) in 41 starts against all other teams.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in a minor league game between his March 17 and 28 starts...opponents hit .161 (10-for-62)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in two of his four starts...is 3-0 with a 1.30 ERA (5 er in 34.2 ip) in eight starts in two springs with the A's.

KAZMIR vs. TEXAS: Is 9-5 with a 3.32 ERA (105.2 ip, 103 h, 49 r, 39 er, 28 bb, 100 so, 9 hr) in 18 career starts...is 6-3 with a 3.12 ERA (23 er in 66.1 ip) in 11 starts in Texas and 3-2 with a 3.66 ERA (16 er in 39.1 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks... went 3-1 with a 4.22 ERA (21.1 ip, 27 h, 13 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in four starts last year...the first win came in a 9-3 victory at Texas April 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...the A's then scored five times in the fifth to make the score 9-1...he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on an Andrus RBI groundout and a Fielder RBI single... also picked up the win in another 9-3 victory at Texas July 27...the A's

scored five times in the second inning and he allowed two runs in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Rosales...blanked the Rangers on three hits over his final three innings and was relieved by O'Flaherty to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-2...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on September 16...allowed two hits and walked one over the first three innings but did not allow a run...then allowed a two-run home run to Smolinski and a RBI single to Robertson in the fourth...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the fourth, but he was charged with three runs, one earned, in the fifth...Beltre scored on a Lowrie error and he allowed a RBI single to Chirinos before he was relieved by Cook who allowed a RBI single to Odor...picked up his third win in a 6-2 A's victory at Texas Sept. 26...allowed a RBI double to Rua in the bottom of the first but the A's scored six unanswered runs to take a 6-1 lead...allowed another run in the bottom of the fifth on a Martin RBI groundout.

2014 RECAP: Won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts... had career highs in winning percentage (.625) and opponents grounded into double plays (19) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36)...had two complete games after tallying just one in 208 starts over his first nine seasons...his starts and innings pitched (190.1) were second most in his career to his 34 starts and 206.2 innings with Tampa Bay in 2007.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for eighth in the AL in wins...also had the sixth highest run support (5.58), tied for sixth in complete games, ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.357) and tied for 10th in games started.

FIRST 15 STARTS/LAST 17 STARTS: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts and was leading the AL in ERA entering play June 24...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and went 6-7 with a 5.00 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over his final 17 starts...his ERA from June 24 through the end of the season was fourth highest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, including .227 (123-for-541) against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (48-for-176) against left-handers...yielded 14 of his 16 home runs to righties...has surrendered 30 of his 35 home runs over the last two years to righties...held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...ranked sixth in the AL among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...rank second in the AL with a .123 opponents average against the number eight hitter and a .169 average against the number two hitter...walked just seven batters to lead off an inning...yielded a .188 batting average with two outs, .261 with no or one outs...allowed a .239 batting average the first time through the lineup, .236 the second time and .240 after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 12 starts during the day compared to 10-6 with a 3.91 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 20 starts at night...surrendered just two home runs in 75.1 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 3.11 ERA (45 er in 130.1 ip) in 22 starts in day games over the last two years compared to 15-13 with a 4.17 ERA (101 er in 218.0 ip) in 39 starts in night games.

THIS AND THAT: Posted a 1.97 ERA in the first inning, which ranked fourth in the AL...was 3-1 with a 4.45 ERA in five interleague starts...tied for fifth in interleague wins...is now 14-6 with a 4.52 ERA (75 er in 149.1 ip) in 27 career interleague starts...went 11-5 with a 4.09 ERA in 17 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 2.90 ERA in 15 starts on five days rest or more... opponents were successful in 18-of-20 (90.0%) stolen bases off him and he had just one pickoff...the stolen base percentage was second highest in the AL (Hughes, MIN 93.3%) and the stolen bases tied for seventh most... ranked sixth in the AL in fewest pitches per game (93.2) and tied for sixth in sacrifice hits allowed (5)...the A's were 21-11 (.656) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 25 of his 32 starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (0-0, 3.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his A's debut...went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...has never faced the Rangers in his career...was named a Baseball America Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson.

- The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and third in the majors last year with a 2.91 ERA...it was the ninth lowest bullpen ERA in Oakland history.
- Converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).
