ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the first three games for the first time since 2010 (won game four in 2010)...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships ... only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11)

and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)... have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

THE FIRST THREE GAMES: The A's have shutout the Rangers twice in the first three games, marking the first time in Athletics history (since 1901) the A's have shutout the opposition twice over the first three games of the season...the three runs allowed are the fewest in Athletics history over the first three games...have out scored the Rangers 19-3 and the run differential of 16 is second best in Athletics history after three games to the 1989 club (19, 25-6)...the Athletics have tripled in each of the first three games for the first time since at least 1914...have an Oakland record-tying four consecutive games with a triple dating back to the final game of 2014 (fifth time).

DEBUTS: Mark Canha had four RBI last night and Tyler Ladendorf had two, marking the first time since the RBI became an official stat in 1920 that a team had two players drive in two or more runs while making their Major League debut in the same game...both players recorded their first ML hit last night, the first time two A's had their first hit in the same game since April 24, 2000 (Terrence Long and Adam Piatt)...the last time the A's had two players record their first hit in their ML debuts was April 13, 1954 in the A's final season in Philadelphia (Spook Jacobs and Vic Power).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-1) and Seattle (three games)...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to Houston (three games), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Reddick, Thompson)...those are the most players on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

BEANE AND MELVIN: The A's have compiled a 1486-1269 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9)...Oakland has a 327-261 (.556) record since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is sixth best in the majors.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1,

.661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001. had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110.059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262) and third in most walks (104)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitching staff during the spring since at least 1991, topping the 247 from last year, and the ERA is second lowest (3.29 in 1994)...committed the third fewest errors in the CL (23).

OFF SEASON TRADES: Nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were acquired in a trade (Alvarez, Clippard, Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Lawrie, Phegley, Semien, Zobrist)...those are the most players on an A's Opening Day roster acquired via trade during the previous off-season since at least 1992, when Opening Day rosters are first available... the previous high was six in 2005...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players.

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...Tyler Ladendorf has been with the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from Minnesota for Orlando Cabrera, July 31, 2009.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's currently have four rookies on the roster (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman, Ladendorf)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster as Billy Burns was optioned to Nashville yesterday.... had no rookies on the Opening Day roster last year and used just two rookies the entire season (Anderson and Burns)...four players on the Opening Day roster had six or more years of service led by Scott Kazmir (8 years, 119 days)...the A's added a fifth yesterday in Cody Ross (9 years, 58 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...the A's roster features three players under the age of 25...R.J. Alvarez is the youngest at 23 years, 301 days...there were nine players on the Opening Day roster that were at least 30 years old.. Ben Zobrist was the oldest at 33 years, 314 days...Cody Ross, who joined the A's yesterday, was 34 years, 103 days on Opening Day.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after losing the season series last year, 10-9...went 2-7 in Oakland and 7-3 in Texas. the seven losses at home were the most in Oakland history against the Rangers and the seven wins on the road matched the most in Oakland history against Texas (1972, 2003, 2005)...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years...are 58-59 over the last seven years...are 324-335 all-time against the Texas Rangers... that breaks down to 171-159 in Oakland and 153-176 in Texas...have an all-time record of 421-417 against the Rangers/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha went 3-for-5 with two doubles and four RBI last night... since the RBI became an official stat in 1920, he is one of three Major Leaguers with at least three hits, two doubles and four RBI in their debuts...joins the A's Ben Grieve (Sept 3, 1997 vs. San Francisco) and the Phillies Ted Kazanski (June 25, 1953 vs. Chicago)...Sam Fuld has tripled in each of his first two games for the second consecutive season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1974 Joe Rudi ties an Oakland record with three doubles as the A's defeat Kansas City 6-4...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 8-6 win over Seattle...in 2008 Fernando Hernandez becomes the first reliever in Oakland history to record a win in his Major League debut when he pitches a scoreless eighth inning in the A's 6-3 win at Toronto.

'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-0, 3.86 ERA in 2014)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his A's debut...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training

2014 RECAP: Was named a Baseball America Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by Baseball America following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Céspedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against righthanded hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts, including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

LANSING: Began the season at Single-A Lansing where he went 2-0 with a 0.34 ERA in four starts...allowed a .126 batting average and opponents were hitless in 14 at bats with runners in scoring position...walked a season-high three batters in his first start April 6 at Lake County...then struck out a season-high seven in each of his next three starts...including April 18 at Beloit when he tossed a season-high 8.1 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...was named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 14 to 20.

DUNEDIN: Was promoted to Single-A Dunedin of the Florida State League April 30 and logged an 8-4 record and a 2.23 ERA in 16 starts...the wins tied for second most in the FSL during his stint there, which ran through July 27, while his ERA ranked seventh...went 4-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts at home...allowed a season-high four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Tampa...picked up the win in five consecutive starts from May 12 to June 3...compiled a 3.14 ERA during the winning streak...surrendered his first home run of the season May 22 against Ft. Myers and matched his season high by allowing four runs...would not al-

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Drew Pomeranz (5-4, 2.35 ERA in 2014): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including one start, against Seattle, all last year...spent most of the 2014 season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season... the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

- The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and third in the majors last year with a 2.91 ERA...it was the ninth lowest bullpen ERA in Oakland history.
- Converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).
