OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-2) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (1-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series with Texas to start the season and are 2-2 after four games for the third consecutive year...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships... only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals

(8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed an error in each of the first four games, which matches the longest season-opening streak by an A's team over the last 39 years (2011)...the last longer season-opening streak was a club record 10-game streak in 1976...lead the majors with six errors overall...allowed a season-high four home runs yesterday after surrendering no home runs over the first three games...have scored two runs in their two losses and 18 runs in their two wins.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (three games)...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to Houston (three games), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Reddick, Thompson)...those are the most players on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

BEANE AND MELVIN: The A's have compiled a 1486-1270 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9)...Oakland has a 327-262 (.555) record since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for sixth best in the majors.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001... had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262) and third in most walks

(104)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitching staff during the spring since at least 1991, topping the 247 from last year, and the ERA is second lowest (3.29 in 1994)...committed the third fewest errors in the CL (23).

OFF SEASON TRADES: Nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were acquired in a trade (Alvarez, Clippard, Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Lawrie, Phegley, Semien, Zobrist)...those are the most players on an A's Opening Day roster acquired via trade during the previous off-season since at least 1992, when Opening Day rosters are first available... the previous high was six in 2005...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players.

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...Tyler Ladendorf has been with the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from Minnesota for Orlando Cabrera, July 31, 2009.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's currently have four rookies on the roster (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman, Ladendorf)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster as Billy Burns was optioned to Nashville yesterday... had no rookies on the Opening Day roster last year and used just two rookies the entire season (Anderson and Burns)...four players on the Opening Day roster had six or more years of service led by Scott Kazmir (8 years, 119 days)...the A's added a fifth yesterday in Cody Ross (9 years, 58 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...the A's roster features three players under the age of 25...R.J. Alvarez is the youngest at 23 years, 301 days...there were nine players on the Opening Day roster that were at least 30 years old... Ben Zobrist was the oldest at 33 years, 314 days...Cody Ross, who joined the A's yesterday, was 34 years, 103 days on Opening Day.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 38-38 against Seattle over that span...all-time, the A's are 321-245 (.567) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 176-107 in Oakland, 144-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The official scorer has made a scoring change from Wednesday...in the fourth inning, credit Josh Phegley with a hit and take away the error from Elvis Andrus...the run that scored in that inning is still unearned...the change is reflected in today's stats...**Billy Butler** is the only Athletic to hit safely in each of the first four games and is the only American Leaguer with a four-game hitting streak...**Ike Davis** has drawn at least one walk in each of his three games and is tied for the Major League lead with four for the season...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run over his past 11 games and 11.1 innings against Seattle...has a 0.71 ERA (1 er in 12.2 ip) in 12 career appearances against the Mariners.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore... John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in **1975** Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in **1990** Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

year...retired the side in order in the 12th inning on April 3 in Oakland and picked up the win when Crisp homered to lead off the bottom of the 12th...retired the side in order in the seventh inning two days later...pitched an inning of relief at Seattle April 11 and allowed a solo home run to Miller (2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...his lone start came in Oakland on May 7 when he combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit, 2-0 shutout...tossed five innings and allowed two of the hits for the win...then pitched 3.0 scoreless innings of relief in Oakland on Sept. 2 in a 6-5 A's loss (1 h, 3 so).

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...has allowed 22 of his 25 career home runs against righties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .150 (12-for-80) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .153 (13-for-85) in that situation over the last two years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that... opponents hit .146 with two strikes

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 oppo-

nents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season... is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 8-17 with a 4.60 ERA (94 er in 184.0 ip) in 40 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 20-for-23 (87.0%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just one in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed five innings or fewer six of his 10 starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 10 of his 40 career starts, including just five with six or more innings...the A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 15-25 (.375) in his career...allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Began his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but was on his first Opening Day roster. started the season in the bullpen and made nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation...tossed at least one inning in all nine outings and did not allow a run six times...made his first start in the second game of a May 7 doubleheader against Seattle and combined with Otero and Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...combined on a shutout in each of his first three starts, including an 11-0 blanking of Chicago (AL) May 13 and a 3-0 shutout at Tampa Bay May 20...tossed 5.0 innings in each of the three shutouts and allowed three hits or fewer each time... joins Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...won all three starts for the first and only winning streak of his career...struck out a career-high eight in his outing against the White Sox...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings May 25 at Toronto...was 4-1 with a 0.94 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first 12 games, including three starts, through May 20...then went 1-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his next five starts before fracturing his right hand June 16...collected his fifth and final win of the season May 30 against Los Angeles (AL) despite allowing five runs in 5.1 innings...it was his first outing over 5.0 innings since July 27, 2012 against Cincinnati when he also tossed 5.1 innings...that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings pitched or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...finished May with a 4-1 record, a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts...tied for fourth in the AL in wins in the month...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 5 at New York (AL) and June 10 at Los Angeles (AL)...that snapped a streak of 24 consecu-tive starts dating back to July 15, 2012 in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak in the majors since at least 1914 (previous: 18, Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...allowed a career-high eight runs in 3.2 innings in a 14-8 loss to Texas June 16... fractured his right wrist following the game and was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day...made one rehab start with Sacramento before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 13...returned to Oakland Aug. 27 and started that day at Houston...allowed one unearned run in 5.1 innings but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...was optioned to Single-A Beloit the next day but did not appear in a game before returning to Oakland Sept. 2 when the Snappers season concluded... tossed 3.0 scoreless innings of relief that day against Seattle...would pitch just once more, a start for Jason Hammel when he left the team for the birth of his daughter...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit but had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Philadelphia Sept. 20.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...made his second consecutive Opening Day start on Monday against Texas and was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-0 victory (8.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...is the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...tossed a six-hit shutout in his final start of 2014 and now has a career-high 18.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...is 4-1 with a 2.36 ERA (45.2 ip, 34 h, 15 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 41 so, 3 hr) in seven career starts against Seattle...is 13-5 with a 2.19 ERA in 23 career appearances against American League West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA in 23 games against everyone else... went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four spring starts.

- The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and third in the majors last year with a 2.91 ERA...it was the ninth lowest bullpen ERA in Oakland history.
- Converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).
