### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-2) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (1-3)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first game of the Seattle series last night after splitting a fourgame series with Texas...have out-scored the opposition 30-0 in their three wins and have been out-scored 13-2 in their two losses...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships... only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than

the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

SHUTOUTS: The A's tossed their third shutout of the season last night. marking the first time in Athletics history the A's have three shutouts over the first five games of the season...since 1914, only five other Major League teams tossed three shutouts in their first five games (1954 Phillies, 1963 Cardinals, 1980 Reds, 2002 Yankees, 2013 Dodgers)...each of the A's shutouts have been by three or more runs (8-0, 10-0, 12-0)...last year the A's had three shutouts of eight or more runs the entire season.

THE FIRST FIVE GAMES: The A's have out-scored the opposition 32-13 over the first five games and the +19 run differential is the largest in Athletics history over the first five games (previous: +18 in 1904)...the A's pitching staff has walked two batters or fewer in each of the first five games, matching the longest season-opening streak by an A's team since 1914 (1923, 1929)...each of the A's first five games have been 2 hours and 55 minutes or quicker...that is the longest season-opening streak by an A's team since the 1973 club did it in their first seven games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-0)...leave following the game tomorrow for a 10-game road trip to Houston (three games), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's began the season with eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Reddick, Thompson)...those are the most players on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

BEANE AND MELVIN: The A's have compiled a 1487-1270 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9)...Oakland has a 328-262 (.556) record since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for fifth best in the majors.

ROSTER NOTES: Nine of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster were acquired in a trade (Alvarez, Clippard, Davis, Graveman, Hahn, Lawrie, Phegley, Semien, Zobrist)...those are the most players on an A's Opening Day roster acquired via trade during the previous off-season since at least 1992, when Opening Day rosters are first available... the previous high was six in 2005...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...R.J. Alvarez was the youngest (23 years, 301 days) and Ben Zobrist was the oldest (33 years, 314 days) until Cody Ross joined the club on Wednesday (34 years, 103 days on Opening Day)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster after having none last year...used just two rookies the entire season.

**TENURE:** Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...Tyler Ladendorf has been with the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from Minnesota for Orlando Cabrera, July 31, 2009.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001... had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262) and third in most walks (104)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitching staff during the spring since at least 1991, topping the 247 from last year, and the ERA is second lowest (3.29 in 1994)...committed the third fewest errors in the CL (23).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2015 last night after losing the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 39-38 against Seattle since 2011...all-time, the A's are 322-245 (.568) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 177-107 in Oakland, 144-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo

Billy Butler is the only Athletic to hit safely in each of the first five games and is the only American Leaguer with a five-game hitting streak. Mark Canha has six RBI, matching the most by an Athletic over his first three games since the RBI became an official stat in 1920 (Ben Grieve, 1997)...he has seven hits, matching the most by an Athletic over his first three games since 1914...Dan Otero has not allowed a run over his past 11 games and 11.1 innings against Seattle...has a 0.71 ERA (1 er in 12.2 ip) in 12 career appearances against the Mariners.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1993** Rickey Henderson's eighth inning home run was the 200th of his career...in **1994** Henderson collects his 231st double in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 289 doubles...in 2012 Jonny Gomes is hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the 12th inning to force in the winning run in a 5-4 win over Kansas City...it is the first of 14 "walk-off" wins for the A's in 2012

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-0, 0.00 ERA)**

**OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made his second consecutive Opening Day start on Monday against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day... he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

**SCORELESS STREAK:** Tossed a six-hit shutout in his final start of 2014 and now has a career-high 18.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...his previous high was 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

**20 CAREER WINS:** His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 13-5 with a 2.19 ERA (38 er in 156.1 ip) in 23 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against everyone else.

**IN APRIL:** Is 5-1 with a 1.67 ERA (8 er in 43.0 ip) in six career starts in April...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and was named American League Pitcher of the Month...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

LAST START: He combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day last Monday...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball).

**GRAY vs. SEATTLE:** Is 4-1 with a 2.36 ERA (45.2 ip, 34 h, 15 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 41 so, 3 hr) in seven career starts...the wins are second only to his five against Texas...is 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA (3 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts at Safeco Field and 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (9 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...went 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (33.2 ip, 29 h, 13 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 26

so) in five starts last year...the first win came in a 6-3 A's win in Oakland April 6...was charged with two unearned runs in the second and a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good...won again in a 3-1 victory at Seattle April 12...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...defeated the Mariners 4-1 at Seattle July 13...his own error led to an unearned run in the first inning...then blanked the Mariners on four hits and a walk over the next six innings... was charged with his first loss in a 6-5 decision in Oakland on September 2...allowed two runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings and left after five innings trailing 6-0...then had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Seattle Sept. 13...allowed a run in the third inning on a Taylor RBI single to give the Mariners a 1-0 lead...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cano in the bottom of the seventh.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four starts... also started in a minor league game March 31...allowed a .354 (21-for-65) opponents batting average...yielded six runs in his final Cactus League start (2.2 ip) after surrendering six runs in his first three starts (11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA).

**2014 RECAP:** Spent the entire season in the starting rotation in his first full season with the A's and went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts...led the A's in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched, losses, hits (187), runs (84) and walks (74) and tied for the lead in earned runs (75).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Tied for second in the American League in shutouts (2), ranked fifth in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.327), tied for sixth in complete games (2), seventh in innings pitched (219.0), eighth in ERA, tied for eighth in games started and ninth in strikeouts (183)...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was seventh lowest in the Al

STRIKEOUTS AND INNINGS: His 183 strikeouts were the 10th highest single season total in Oakland history...they were third most in Oakland history by a pitcher 24-years old or younger behind Vida Blue (301 strikeouts in 1971 at age 21) and Barry Zito (205 strikeouts in 2001 at age 23)... his 219.0 innings pitched were third most by an Oakland pitcher 24-years old or younger since 1981...they were the most by any A's pitcher since Joe Blanton tossed 230.0 innings in 2007.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Was 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and tied for seventh in wins at the break...then went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA in 14 starts after the break...tied for third in the AL in post-break losses.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .232 opponents batting average included a .221 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .245 against right-handers...allowed 10 of his 15 home runs to left-handers...13 were solo shots and 14 of his 19 career home runs have come with the bases empty...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .169 batting average and .270 slugging percentage, both of which ranked second lowest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title...the batting average and slugging percentage were fourth lowest in Oakland history...now has a .176 (21-for-119) batting average and .277 slugging percentage against the clean-up hitter in his career... yielded a .215 average to batters leading off an inning, which was ninth lowest in the AL...had the sixth lowest slugging percentage in that situation (.317)...has a .207 (57-for-275) career average against batters leading off an inning and a .287 slugging percentage.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 6-3 with a 2.51 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in 15 starts on the road compared to 8-7 with a 3.60 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts in Oakland...allowed just five home runs in 104.0 innings on the road...had the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL and the fifth lowest ERA...his road ERA was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez in 1976 (2.50).

**INNING BY INNING:** Compiled a 3.45 ERA over the first five innings of the game compared to a 1.98 ERA from the sixth inning on...now has a 3.38 career ERA (82 er in 218.2 ip) over the first five innings of the game compared to 1.49 (12 er in 72.1 ip) from the sixth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 16 of his 33 starts and was 1-10 in those games...was 13-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-12 with two runs or fewer, 18-1 with three or more...the A's were 18-15 (.545) in his starting assignments and are 25-19 (.568) when he starts in his career.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (0-1, 4.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start as an Athletic...was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 3-1 A's loss to Texas on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Seattle, a 4-1 Padres win in San Diego last year on June 19 (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts, during the spring...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts.

0-0, 1.32 ERA (2 er in 13.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 0-for-0 (0.0%)

- The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and third in the majors last year with a 2.91 ERA...it was the ninth lowest bullpen ERA in Oakland history.
- Converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).

- Is on his fourth career Opening Day roster (2011-12 with Houston, 2014 with Oakland)...has pitched twice in openers (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 1 hr).
- Was 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA in nine appearances during the spring...opponents hit .188.
- Has faced Seattle seven times in his career and has not allowed a run in six of seven games (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1.29 ERA).
- Did not allow a run in April last year (10.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 11 so).
- Last night was his 200th career appearance.
