ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of the Seattle series after splitting a four-game series with Texas...have started the season 3-3 for the second consecutive year and have yet to put together consecutive wins or losses...have out-scored the opposition 30-0 in their three wins and have been out-scored 18-6 in their three losses... have an overall run differential of +18, which matches the largest in Oakland history over the first six games (also 1990)...hold a share of first place in the American League West and have held at least a share of first four of the first six days of the season...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year...this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

PITCHING: The A's have a Major League leading three shutouts over the first six games of the season...each of the A's shutouts have been by eight or more runs (8-0, 10-0, 12-0)...last year the A's had three shutouts of eight or more runs the entire season...have a 2.25 ERA, which ranks third in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in the four of the first six games and have a 2.56 ERA (11 er in 38.2 ip), which ranks fourth in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in four of the first six games and are batting .297, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in doubles (15) and rank second in triples (3) but have the second fewest home runs (3)...are one of four AL teams without a stolen base...A's pinch hitters are 0-for-4 with two walks.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed their seventh error of the season yesterday, which is tied for second most in the American League...have made at least one error in five of the first six games...have turned six double plays, which is tied for second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-1)...leave following the game today for a 10-game road trip to Houston (three games), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated today...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

WITH BEANE AS THE GENERAL MANAGER: The A's have compiled a 1487-1271 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager

following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9).

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...R.J. Alvarez was the youngest (23 years, 301 days) and Ben Zobrist was the oldest (33 years, 314 days) until Cody Ross joined the club on Wednesday (34 years, 103 days on Opening Day)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster after having none last year...however, two of those players have been optioned (Burns, Ladena-dorf), leaving the A's with three rookies currently (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman)...used just two rookies the entire season last year.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001...had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262) and third in most walks (104)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitching staff during the spring since at least 1991, topping the 247 from last year, and the ERA is second lowest (3.29 in 1994)...committed the third fewest errors in the CL (23).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2015 after losing the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 39-39 against Seattle since 2011...all-time, the A's are 322-246 (.567) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 177-108 in Oakland, 144-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is the only Athletic to hit safely in each of the first six games and is the only American Leaguer with a six-game hitting streak...**Mark Canha** has hit safely in each of the first four games of his career...has eight hits, which match the most in Oakland history by a player in his first four career games (Ramon Hernandez, 1999)...**Marcus Semien** has hit safely and driven in a run in five of his first six games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuffy" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (0-1, 4.50 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his second start as an Athletic... was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying seven hits...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

HAHN vs. SEATTLE: Was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 4-1 Padres win in San Diego last year on June 19, his third Major League start...shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first four innings before allowing an unearned run in the fifth... Cano had a RBI single following a Cabrera error...the Padres were shutout on two hits over the first six innings before scoring four times in the seventh for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts...also started in a minor league game April 1...allowed just run one in 10.1 innings over his final two starts (0.87 ERA) after logging a 6.14 ERA over his first three appearances...opponents batted .265 (18-for-68).

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 4-0 record and a 2.56 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...had a 2.14 ERA over the first five innings of a game, 6.75 from the sixth inning on...the Padres were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments..

MORE WITH SAN DIEGO: Was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time June 3 and made his ML debut that evening against Pitts-

burgh (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...was the losing pitcher in a 4-1 decision and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day... recalled for the second time June 14 and went 5-1 with a 1.46 ERA in six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...singled in the fourth inning off Zack Wheeler June 14 at New York (NL) for his first Major League hit...went 2-for-22 (.091) with a RBI as a hitter...struck out a career-high nine batters in 5.0 innings June 30 against Cincinnati, including a stretch of seven consecutive outs recorded via strikeout...became the first Padres pitcher since Jake Peavy on Aug. 27, 2007 to record seven consecutive outs via strikeout and the first Padres rookie to accomplish this feat since at least 1974...was 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in five starts in June...the wins tied for the most in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher (eighth time, first since Kevin Walker in August of 2000)...the opponents average was second lowest of any qualifying rookie pitcher in any month in Padres history, behind only the .188 mark put up by Eric Nolte in August of 1987...his ERA was 10th lowest by a rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history (min 25.0 IP) and the lowest since Justin Germano posted a 1.08 ERA in May 2007...recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3-30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...according to Stats Inc., his 36 strikeouts tied for eighth most by a NL pitcher through his first five career games since the start of the 1914 season, behind only Stephen Strasburg's 48 in 2010, Kerry Wood's 45 in 1998, Mark Prior's 43 in 2002, Jose DeLeon's 43 in 1983, Hideo Nomo's 40 in 1995, Gary Nolan's 39 in 1967 and Burt Hooton's 38 in 1971-72...then went 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts in July... allowed a .172 batting average and .230 slugging percentage, which were the lowest in franchise history during the month of July...was recalled the third time July 25 and went 2-1 with a 3.99 ERA in five starts before being optioned to San Antonio Aug. 19...won at Atlanta July 25, giving him four wins in his first four starts on the road...that was the longest such career-opening streak in Padres history...picked up his seventh win of the season in his ninth start on July 30 against St. Louis...his seven wins through nine career appearances were the most in Padres franchise history and tied for the third most by a Major League pitcher since the 1914 season, behind only Boston's Boo Ferriss in 1945 and Chicago-AL's John Whitehead in 1935, both of which had eight wins through nine career starts...allowed a sixth inning home run to Kennys Vargas Aug. 5 at Minnesota, snapping a 55.0-inning homerless streak dating back to June 14...it was the fourth longest homerless streak by a rookie in Padres history, trailing Dave Freisleben in 1974 (66.0 ip), Rick Sawyer in 1976 (60.2 ip) and Frank Seminara in 1992 (60.0 ip)...recalled for the final time Aug. 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever...appeared in just two games (5.40 ERA) and did not pitch after Sept. 6.

SAN ANTONIO: Spent the balance of the season pitching for Double-A San Antonio where he was 2-1 with a 1.91 ERA in 13 games, including 10 starts...yielded just one home run in 42.1 innings...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .169 (13-for-77) against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (21-for-77) against left-handers...surrendered just one extra base hit, a double, to righties for a .182 slugging percentage... opponents hit .194 with runners on base...allowed a .289 average to batters leading off an inning...compiled a 4.50 ERA in the first inning, a 1.11 ERA from the second inning on...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 10 starts...went 1-0 and did not allow a run over his first three appearances, all in relief (7.2 ip)...his final 10 outings came as a starter...was 2-1 with a 2.20 ERA in 10 games, seven starts, when San Diego called for the first time June 3...pitched just once during each of his final three minor league stints...had a no decision June 9 at Corpus Christi (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...was optioned to El Paso July 11 but did not pitch before being transferred to San Antonio for a July 21 start against Corpus Christi (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so)...was sent back to El Paso July 22 and he was recalled by the Padres July 25...made his final minor league start Aug. 26 against Midland (2.0 ip, 3 so).

CAREER: Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2014...had not pitched above Single-A before starting the 2014 season at Double-A San Antonio...is 6-4 with a 2.26 ERA (41 er in 163.1 ip) and .215 (131-for-608) opponents batting average in 47 games, 44 starts, in three seasons in the minors...has allowed just two home runs in 163.1 innings...was originally drafted by Tampa Bay in the sixth round of the 2010 draft but missed his first two professional seasons after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery... was traded to the Padres in a seven-player deal prior to the 2014 season and was dealt to the A's in a four-player trade following the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start...combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings and yielded just three hits in his first start last year... is now 5-0 with a 1.79 ERA in seven starts in April over the last two seasons...is 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA in seven career starts against Houston... went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts...opponents hit .161 (10-for-62)...won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts...had a career high in winning percentage (.625) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36).

- The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and third in the majors last year with a 2.91 ERA...it was the ninth lowest bullpen ERA in Oakland history.
- Converted 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).
