TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude their visit with the Athletics with the final game of a three-game set in Oakland (1-1)...won on Opening Day but dropped 2 of 3 to the Angels to open the season...following this three-game set in Oakland, will have a three-game series at Los Angeles Dodgers (Mon- Wed)...today's game will be televised in the Mariners TV market on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...are 2-3 on the season...won yesterday which snapped 3-game losing streak...12 of first 18 games of the season will be played at Safeco Field with only current 6-game trip mixed in.

- Young & Old Fernando Rodney was the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster at 38 years, 19 days...Taijuan Walker was the youngest player at 22 years, 236 days.
- First Opening Day Tyler Olson (LHP), Jesus Sucre (C), Carson Smith (RHP) and Taijuan Walker (RHP - on DL last year) made their first Opening Day rosters...was the 10th Opening Day rosters for Felix Hernandez and Robinson Canó.
- 2014 Review completed the 2014 season 87-75 (.537), 7th-most wins in club history...were 51-44 before the All-Star break and 36-31 after the break...posted a 24-23-6 record in series, including 11 sweeps...finished one game back of Oakland for the second AL Wild Card.
- Road Warrior Felix Hernandez ranked 2nd in A.L. with 2.21 road ERA (Garrett Richards, 2.11 ERA).

MILLER TIME...Brad Miller had the game-winning double last night and through 5 games this season is hitting .333 (5x15)...over his last 27 games (since Aug. 31) he is hitting .348 (24x69) with 12 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and a .969 OPS...his .453 slugging percentage since May 29, 2014 is the 2nd-highest amongst Major League shortstops in that span (min. 250 PA) behind Minnesota's Danny Santana.

HOMEGROWN WIN...reliever Tyler Olson (Spokane/Gonzaga) earned his first Major League win in yesterday's 5-4 win in Oakland...he's the 32nd Mariners player who was born/raised in the state of Washington and just the 8th pitcher to get his first MLB win while pitching for Seattle joining Sean White (2007), Eric O'Flaherty (2007), Robert Ramsay (2000), Russ Swan (1990), Mike Campbell (1987), Karl Best (1984) and Larry Andersen (1981).

<u>WAITING FOR POP</u>...8 of the Mariners 12 runs scored this season have come via home home run (**Dustin Ackley** 2 HR; **Kyle Seager** 2-run HR; **Brad Miller** HR; **Nelson Cruz** 3-run HR), including 7 of the last 8 runs in the last 3 games.

ATHLETICALLY SPEAKING...Felix Hernandez is making his 36th career start vs. the A's today in the series finale...is 19-7 with a 2.58 ERA vs. Oakland, including a 10-2, 2.62 mark at O.co Coliseum...6-2, 2.44 ERA in last 10 starts vs. the A's (since 9/7/12) and 6-0, 2.18 in last 10 starts at O.co Coliseum (since 5/18/10)...went 4-0, 2.22 ERA in 6 starts vs. the A's last season (2-0, 1.99 in 3 GS at O.co).

OWNING THE COLISEUM...Felix Hernandez is 6-0, including winning 4 of his last 5 starts, with a 2.72 ERA (26 ER, 86.0 IP) in 12 starts at O.co Coliseum since April 11, 2009...overall is 10-2 with a 2.62 ERA (37 ER, 127.0 IP) in 18 starts at Oakland...his 10 wins are the most for an active opposing pitcher at O.co.

RACKING UP A'S K'S...Felix Hernandez has struck out 233 A's hitters in his career, the most among active pitchers (John Lackey, 165)...his 19 wins against Oakland tied with Lackey for the most and his 2.60 ERA ranks 3rd (E. Santana, 2.12 & J. Weaver, 2.49) among qualifying players (min. 140.0 IP).

WINS UNDER THE SUN...Seattle has won both of its day games this season...the Mariners won on Opening Day this season on Monday and yesterday and have dropped three games at night...last season ranked 2nd in the American League in day time winning percentage (30-22/.577) behind the Angels (21-15/.583)...Seattle led the American League (3rd in MLB) with a 3.07 ERA (158 ER, 462.2 IP) with 420 strikeouts last season.

BIRTHDAY BOYS...starter **Hisashi Iwakuma** (34, 1981) and outfielder **Justin Ruggiano** (33, 1982) are both celebrating birthday's today...left-hander **Edgar Olmos**, who is currently on the disabled list (25, 1990), is also celebrating his birthday.

ROAD WARRIORS...the Mariners continue their first road trip of the season after a successful season away from Seattle in 2014...went 46-35 (.568) on the road last season, tying for the 2nd-best road winning percentage in the American League...2nd-best road record in club history behind the 2001 team (59-22/.728)...secured first winning road season since going 43-38 in 2003, the 7th Mariners club with a winning season on the road, joining 2001 (59 wins), 2002 (45), 1997 (45), 2000 (44), 2003 (43) & 1996 (42).

FEELS LIKE HOME...Robinson Canó ranked 3rd in the American League in 2014 in road batting average...on the road, he hit .320 (101x316) with 21 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs and 47 RBI...he ranked only behind Detroit's **Victor Martinez** (.346) and **J.D. Martinez** (.325)...his .313 career road average ranks 4th in the Majors since his first season in 2005 behind Cincinnati's **Joey Votto** (.319), Detroit's **Miguel Cabrera** (.318) and Minnesota's **Joe Mauer** (.318).

AS YOU KNOW...Dustin Ackley has hit a home run in two of his three games this season...AND YOU MAY KNOW...that he has hit 12 home runs in his last 49 games dating back to July 31, 2014...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that in that span, his 12 home runs ranks T5th (with Nelson Cruz) in the A.L. and 10th in the Majors?...only Houston's Chris Carter (16), Toronto's Jose Bautista (15), Minnesota's Oswaldo Arcia (13) & Los Angeles' Mike Trout (13) have hit more in the A.L.
