ABOUT THE A'S: Have won consecutive games for the first time this season...have out-scored the opposition 42-1 in their five wins and have been out-scored 26-13 in their four losses...are 5-4 for the season and in sole possession of first place in the American League West by one game over Texas...have held at least a share of first six of the first nine days of the season...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year... this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where

they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

PITCHING: The A's recorded their **Major League leading** fourth shutout last night...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1910, the A's are **the first American League team** with four shutouts in their first nine games...three of the four shutouts have been by eight or more runs (4-0, 8-0, 10-0, 12-0)...last year, the A's had three shutouts of eight or more runs the entire season...have a 2.14 ERA (20 er in 84.0 ip), which **ranks first in the majors.**..A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of the first nine games and have a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip), which ranks second in the AL...opponents are hitting .174 (34 for 195) against A's starters, which is also second in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in six of the first nine games and are batting .299, which ranks third in the American League and fourth in the majors...lead the AL in doubles (24) and are tied for first in triples (4) but are tied for the third fewest home runs (6)...recorded their first stolen base of the season last night (Lawrie)...A's pinch hitters are 1-for-6 with two walks.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors on the season, which is tied for second most in the majors...made at least one error in six of the first seven games...have turned 10 double plays, which is second most in the Al

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on their 10-game road trip to Houston (2-0), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record... posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated Sunday...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

WITH BEANE AS THE GENERAL MANAGER: The A's have compiled a 1489-1272 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9).

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...R.J. Alvarez was the youngest (23 years, 301 days) and Ben Zobrist was the oldest (33 years, 314 days) until Cody Ross joined the club on Wednesday (34 years, 103 days on Opening Day)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster after having none last year...however, two of those players have been optioned (Burns, Ladendorf), leaving the A's with three rookies currently (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman)...used just two rookies the entire season last year.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001... had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 2-0 against the Astros this season after going 11-8 against Houston in 2014...went 6-3 in Oakland and 5-5 in Houston... averaged 5.7 runs per game against Houston last year and scored eight runs or more in six of the 19 games (6-0)...A's pitchers held the Astros to a .226 average in 2014...A's are 27-12 against Houston since the Astros joined the AL West in 2013...did not play the Astros at all until 2002...the A's started the all-time series by going 25-5 over the first 30 games (June 7, 2002-April 25, 2014)...are 8-8 since then...all-time, the A's are 33-13 against Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is the second player in Oakland history to begin his A's career with a nine-game hitting streak...the other is Alfredo Griffin (April 9-17, 1985)...is the only Athletic to hit safely in each of the first nine games and is the only American Leaguer with a nine-game hitting streak...Mark Canha has 11 hits over his first seven games, which is tied for third most in Oakland history...his seven RBI through seven games are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...Sam Fuld recorded two doubles last night and now has five multiple hit games over his first eight games...the multiple hit games are tied for second most in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle...with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season... tossed 7.0 shutout innings in his first start and now has a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014...his career high is 18.0 innings from May 7 to 25, 2014...has not allowed an earned run in his last 20.1 innings dating back to Aug. 27, 2014.

INNINGS PITCHED: Tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start this year (third time)...last year, he tossed five innings or fewer six of his 10 starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 41 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

LAST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle last Friday in Oakland...tossed a careerhigh tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...has allowed 22 of his 25 career home runs against righties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .150 (12-for-80) opponents average with RISP and

two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .141 (13-for-92) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season... is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-17 with a 4.43 ERA (94 er in 191.0 ip) in 41 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 20-for-23 (87.0%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just one in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-25 (.390) in his career...allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Began his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but was on his first Opening Day roster... started the season in the bullpen and made nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation...tossed at least one inning in all nine outings and did not allow a run six times...made his first start in the second game of a May 7 doubleheader against Seattle and combined with Otero and Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...combined on a shutout in each of his first three starts, including an 11-0 blanking of Chicago (AL) May 13 and a 3-0 shutout at Tampa Bay May 20...tossed 5.0 innings in each of the three shutouts and allowed three hits or fewer each time... joins Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...won all three starts for the first and only winning streak of his career...struck out a career-high eight in his outing against the White Sox...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings May 25 at Toronto...was 4-1 with a 0.94 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first 12 games, including three starts, through May 20...then went 1-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his next five starts before fracturing his right hand June 16...collected his fifth and final win of the season May 30 against Los Angeles (AL) despite allowing five runs in 5.1 innings...it was his first outing over 5.0 innings since July 27, 2012 against Cincinnati when he also tossed 5.1 innings...that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings pitched or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...finished May with a 4-1 record, a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts...tied for fourth in the AL in wins in the month...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 5 at New York (AL) and June 10 at Los Angeles (AL)...that snapped a streak of 24 consecutive starts dating back to July 15, 2012 in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak in the majors since at least 1914 (previous: 18, Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...allowed a career-high eight runs in 3.2 innings in a 14-8 loss to Texas June 16... fractured his right wrist following the game and was placed on the 15-day disabled list the next day...made one rehab start with Sacramento before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento July 13...returned to Oakland Aug. 27 and started that day at Houston...was optioned to Single-A Beloit the next day but did not appear in a game before returning to Oakland Sept. 2 when the Snappers season concluded.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-0, 0.59 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA over his first two starts of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA in seven career starts in April...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (7.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning, snapping his career-high scoreless streak at 20.0...is 0-2 despite a 1.93 ERA (14.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Kansas City, both last year...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four spring starts... spent the entire 2014 season in the starting rotation in his first full season with the A's and went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts...led the A's in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched, losses, hits (187), runs (84) and walks (74) and tied for the lead in earned runs (75)

- A's relievers allowed four earned runs in 4.1 innings on Sunday, but have allowed just three earned runs in their other eight games and 24.0 innings (1.13 ERA).
- All nine runs allowed this year have come via the home run (three solo homers, two three-run homers)...the five home runs have come against five different relievers (Alvarez, Clippard, O'Flaherty, Otero, Scribner).
- Have not converted a save this season after converting 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities in 2014...tied with Houston for the fewest saves in the AL and had the second lowest save percentage...tied for third in blown saves (21)...the 31 saves were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters last season, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).

- Is on his first career Opening Day roster.
- Compiled a 3.38 ERA in 10 spring outings...held the opposition to a .195 batting average...struck out 13 in 10.2 innings (10.97 per nine innings)...did not allow a home run.
- Has never faced the Astros in his career.
