OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-5) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (7-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their two-game winning streak snapped Wednesday night... it was the first time the A's had won consecutive games this season...have now outscored the opposition 42-1 in their five wins and have been out-scored 32-14 in their five losses...are 5-5 for the season and in sole possession of first place in the American League West by a half game over Houston and Los Angeles...have held at least a share of first eight of the first 11 days of the sea-

son...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year... this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships. only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15... only the Yankees (12), Cardinals (11) and Braves (9) have made more postseason appearances over that span...have a 3907-3576 (.522) record over the previous 47 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 115th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.54 ERA (26 er in 92.0 ip), which ranks second in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of the first 10 games and have a 2.52 ERA (17 er in 60.2 ip), which ranks second in the AL...opponents are hitting .186 (40 for 215) against A's starters, which is also second in the AL...the A's recorded their fourth shutout Tuesday night in their ninth game...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1910, the A's are **the first AL team** with four shutouts in their first nine games...the four shutouts are tied for the most in the majors...three of the four shutouts have been by eight or more runs (4-0, 8-0, 10-0, 12-0)...last year, the A's had three shutouts of eight or more runs the entire season.

OFFENSE: The A's have reached double figures in hits in six of the first 10 games and are batting .292 (106 for 363), which ranks third in the American League and fourth in the majors...lead the AL in doubles (25) and triples (5) but have the third fewest home runs (6)...have recorded a stolen base in each of the past two games after going eight games without a steal to start the season...A's pinch hitters are 1-for-6 with two walks.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors on the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...made at least one error in six of the first seven games but have not committed an error in three games since then...have turned 10 double plays, which is tied for second most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record... posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated Sunday...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from

Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

WITH BEANE AS THE GENERAL MANAGER: The A's have compiled a 1489-1273 (.539) record since Billy Beane took over as General Manager following the 1997 season...that is the sixth best record in the majors over that span...the A's have reached the playoffs eight times in those 17 seasons, which is fifth most behind the Yankees (14), Braves (11), Cardinals (11) and Red Sox (9).

ROSTER NOTES: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Eric Sogard is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut Sept. 14, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Chavez, Scribner)...the A's made a total of nine trades this off-season involving 27 players...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 27.92 years...R.J. Alvarez was the youngest (23 years, 301 days) and Ben Zobrist was the oldest (33 years, 314 days) until Cody Ross joined the club on April 8 (34 years, 103 days on Opening Day)...had five rookies on the Opening Day roster after having none last year...however, two of those players have been optioned (Burns, Ladendorf), leaving the A's with three rookies currently (Alvarez, Canha, Graveman)...used just two rookies the entire season last year.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors to Kansas City (20-10-1, .661)...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001... had the fourth best winning percentage...finished with a winning record for the fourth consecutive spring...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...that was the A's second best Arizona total to the record of 110,543 in 2005...were also 8-7-2 on the road, 0-2 at Las Vegas and 0-1 in Oakland...the A's led the majors in runs (199), doubles (90) and sacrifice flies (18)...ranked second among Cactus League teams in slugging (.461), on-base percentage (.343) and walks (112), third in triples (14) and tied for third in home runs (33)...the 90 doubles were second most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1991 (first year spring stats are available)...the pitching staff ranked second in the CL in ERA (3.60) and strikeouts (262).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the regular season series last year, 2-5... lost two of three in Oakland and were 1-3 in Kansas City...also lost the American League Wild Card game at Kansas City on Sept. 30, 9-8 in 12 innings...are 28-20 in regular season games against the Royals since the start of the 2009 season and have won four of the six season series since then...all-time, the A's are 307-254 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-111 in Oakland and 138-143 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is the first player in Oakland history to begin his A's career with a 10-game hitting streak...is the only American Leaguer with a 10-game hitting streak...has started 10 consecutive games at designated hitter, which is the longest streak by an A's DH since Hideki Matsui also started 10 straight from June 9-19, 2011...**Mark Canha** has 12 hits over his first eight games, which is third most in Oakland history...**Sam Fuld** recorded his third triple of the season Wednesday night, which is tied for the Major League lead...his five multiple hit games are tied for third in the American League...**Sonny Gray** is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA over his first two starts of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA in seven career starts in April.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** the A's play their first game in Oakland but lose to Baltimore, 4-1...Dave McNally limits the A's to two hits, including a pinch hit single by Tony La Russa in his first at bat a member of the Oakland A's.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-0, 0.59 ERA)

IN APRIL: Is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) over his first two starts of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven career starts in April... was named American League Pitcher of the Month last April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA... became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning of his last start to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day... he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in two starts against American League West competition this year...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 13-5 with a 2.14 ERA (39 er in 163.2 ip) in 24 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.74 ERA (56 er in 134.2 ip) in 23 games against everyone else.

FIRST START: He combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning... walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero).

the first and a one-out single to Dyson in the third...then retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced, but the one exception was a one-out home run by Ibanez in the fifth...was relieved by O'Flaherty after allowing just one run in seven innings...Guthrie, Herrera, Davis and Holland combined to shutout the A's on five hits and three walks...then dropped a 3-2 decision at Kansas City Aug. 11...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on a double play and a Moustakas RBI single...the A's scored twice in the third to tie the game but he allowed an Escobar RBI single in the seventh for the loss.

2014 RECAP: Spent the entire season in the starting rotation in his first full season with the A's and went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts...led the A's in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched, losses, hits (187), runs (84) and walks (74) and tied for the lead in earned runs (75).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for second in the American League in shutouts (2), ranked fifth in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.327), tied for sixth in complete games (2), seventh in innings pitched (219.0), eighth in ERA, tied for eighth in games started and ninth in strikeouts (183)...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was seventh lowest in the AL.

STRIKEOUTS AND INNINGS: His 183 strikeouts were the 10th highest single season total in Oakland history...they were third most in Oakland history by a pitcher 24-years old or younger behind Vida Blue (301 strikeouts in 1971 at age 21) and Barry Zito (205 strikeouts in 2001 at age 23)... his 219.0 innings pitched were third most by an Oakland pitcher 24-years old or younger since 1981...they were the most by any A's pitcher since Joe Blanton tossed 230.0 innings in 2007.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and tied for seventh in wins at the break...then went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA in 14 starts after the break...tied for third in the AL in post-break losses.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .232 opponents batting average included a .221 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .245 against right-handers...allowed 10 of his 15 home runs to left-handers...13 were solo shots and 15 of his 20 career home runs have come with the bases empty...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .169 batting average and .270 slugging percentage, both of which ranked second lowest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title...the batting average and slugging percentage were fourth lowest in Oakland history...now has a .180 (22-for-122) batting average and .263 slugging percentage against the clean-up hitter in his career... yielded a .215 average to batters leading off an inning, which was ninth lowest in the AL...had the sixth lowest slugging percentage in that situation (.317)...has a .208 (59-for-283) career average against batters leading off an inning and a .297 slugging percentage.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 6-3 with a 2.51 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in 15 starts on the road compared to 8-7 with a 3.60 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts in Oakland...allowed just five home runs in 104.0 innings on the road...had the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL and the fifth lowest ERA...his road ERA was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez in 1976 (2.50).

INNING BY INNING: Compiled a 3.45 ERA over the first five innings of the game compared to a 1.98 ERA from the sixth inning on...now has a 3.34 career ERA (83 er in 223.2 ip) over the first five innings of the game compared to 1.45 (12 er in 74.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 16 of his 33 starts and was 1-10 in those games...was 13-0 with support of three runs or more...his career numbers are 2-12 with two runs or fewer, 18-1 with three or more...the A's were 18-15 (.545) in his starting assignments and are 25-20 (.556) when he starts in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (0-1, 3.09 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start as an Athletic...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-7 A's loss in 10 innings to Seattle last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so so)... has never faced the Royals in his career...went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts, during the spring...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts.

- All 11 runs allowed this year have come via the home run (five solo homers, two three-run homers)...Fernando Abad and Jesse Chavez are the lone A's relievers to have not given up a home run this season.
- The seven home runs allowed by A's relievers are the most in the Maiors
- Have not converted a save this season after converting 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities in 2014...are the only American League team without a save this season and are tied for the fewest save chances in the Majors (Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, Texas)...the A's 31 saves in 2014 were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Walked just 122 batters last season, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)
- Struck out 397 and had the best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the majors (3.25)...it was also the best mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914.
- Had the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.279) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.330) and batting average (.223).

- Four of his first five outings this year have been scoreless.
- Was 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA in nine appearances during the spring...opponents hit .188.
- Has faced the Royals four times in his career...all four outings have been scoreless (2.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Did not allow a run in April last year (10.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 11 so)
- Appeared in his 200th career game last Friday vs. Seattle.

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
