ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at Kansas City over the weekend and have now lost three of the last four games...are 6-7, marking the third time this year the A's have been one game under .500...have not been more than one game over or one game under .500...have not won or lost more than two in a row...have out-scored the opposition 47-1 in their six wins and have been out-scored 42-20 in their seven losses...the A's overall run differential of +24 is third best in the majors and tied for second best in Oakland history after 13 games (+51 in 1981, +24 in 1990)...are in second place in the American League West, ½ game behind first place Houston... have not been more than ½ game back or more than one game ahead in the West this year...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, one day in second, three days tied for second and one day tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 4, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1)... this is the A's 48th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships... only the Yankees (18) and Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have appeared in the postseason in each of the last three years and eight of the last 15...the A's have nine World Championships in 115 seasons in the American League...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have more.

PITCHING: The A's have a Major League leading five shutouts...rank second in the American League and third in the majors with a 2.77 ERA...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season on Saturday at Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)...three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season...have walked four batters or fewer in each of the 13 games and have issued 28 free passes for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.346), third lowest batting average (.220) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.279)...have a 0.17 ERA (1 er in 54.0 ip) in their six wins, a 5.00 ERA (35 er in 63.0 ip) in their seven losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.61 ERA (23 er in 79.1 ip)...rank second in the American League and fourth in the majors in ERA...the .667 winning percentage is tied for second best in the AL...also rank second in innings pitched (79.1) and fewest home runs (5) and tied for third in fewest walks (18)...are 6-0 with a 0.23 ERA (1 er in 38.2 ip) in the A's six wins, 0-3 with a 4.87 ERA (22 er in 40.2 ip) in the seven losses.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .232 (38 for 164) with 16 runs scored over the last five games (3.2 runs per game) after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored over the first eight contests (6.4 runs per game)...are batting .280 overall, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in doubles (29) and extra base hits (44), are tied for the lead in triples (5) and have the third fewest strikeouts (85)...are tied for the most grounded into double plays (16) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (10)...are batting .333 (42-for-126) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last six games after making nine over their first seven contests...have 10 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...have turned 15 double plays, which are the second most in the AL...have turned at least one double play in 11 of 13 games this year.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen six bases in the last five games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 6-for-6 in stolen base attempts and are one of four Major League teams without a caught stealing (Boston, Cincinnati, New York-NL)...opponents have been successful in all four of their stolen base attempts against the A's and Oakland is one of two ML teams that has yet to catch an opponent stealing (St. Louis).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Houston (three game) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-3 in night games compared to 0-4 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...yesterday's 3 hour and 8 minute game was the A's longest nine-inning game of the season...are averaging 2:51 per game, which is second fastest in the American League (Kansas City, 2:50)...are one of four ML teams that have not homered off a left-handed pitcher (Cleveland, Milwaukee, St. Louis)...last homered off a lefty Sept. 7, 2014 against Houston when Nate Freiman homered off Dallas Keuchel...have gone homerless in their last 322 at bats against left-handers

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated Sunday...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 22-11-2 (.657) during the spring, which was the second best record in the majors...the 22 wins tied the Oakland Spring Training record set in 2001...went 14-1 in their first season at the newly renovated Hohokam Stadium and drew 110,059 fans...led the majors in runs (199) and doubles (90).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lost the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have lost four straight and seven of the last eight at Anaheim...are 41-35 over the previous four seasons...including 33-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in three of their last six games and have been held to one run or fewer in 19 of their last 27 losses, including 10 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 406-331 against the Angels...that includes 211-156 in Oakland and 195-175 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 455-408 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sam Fuld ranks second in the majors with three triples, which match the most by an Athletic in the month of April since at least 1914...**Craig Gentry** is a .311 (38 for 122) career hitter against Los Angeles and is a perfect 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in 12 career appearances against Los Angeles (15.2 ip)...**Ben Zobrist** has an 18-game hitting streak against Los Angeles (28-for-68, .412), which is the longest active streak against the Angels.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in **1971** Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in **1982** Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-1, 7.27 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...picked up his first Major League win in his last start...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

LAST START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston last Tuesday...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

2014 RECAP: Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Céspedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts,

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Drew Pomeranz (1-1, 3.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss at Houston last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...has pitched 5.0 innings or fewer in 31 of his 42 career starts...is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts against Los Angeles, all last year...went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...spent most of the 2014 season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season.

including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

LANSING: Began the season at Single-A Lansing where he went 2-0 with a 0.34 ERA in four starts...allowed a .126 batting average and opponents were hitless in 14 at bats with runners in scoring position...walked a season-high three batters in his first start April 6 at Lake County...then struck out a season-high seven in each of his next three starts...including April 18 at Beloit when he tossed a season-high 8.1 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...was named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 14 to 20.

DUNEDIN: Was promoted to Single-A Dunedin of the Florida State League April 30 and logged an 8-4 record and a 2.23 ERA in 16 starts...the wins tied for second most in the FSL during his stint there, which ran through July 27, while his ERA ranked seventh...went 4-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts at home...allowed a season-high four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Tampa...picked up the win in five consecutive starts from May 12 to June 3...compiled a 3.14 ERA during the winning streak...surrendered his first home run of the season May 22 against Ft. Myers and matched his season high by allowing four runs...would not allow his second and final home run until Aug. 7 against Durham...had a 13-start, 87.0-inning, 347-batter homerless streak in between...matched his season high by allowing four runs in a June 8 loss at Lakeland...that ran his overall minor league record to 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA in 12 starts...went 7-4 with a 1.39 ERA over his final 15 starts...matched his season high with three walks June 16 at Brevard County...did not allow a run in consecutive starts July 1 at Clearwater and July 6 vs. Tampa...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in each start and had a 20.0-inning scoreless streak from June 26 to July 11...allowed a season-high nine hits July 17 against Jupiter but yielded just one run in 7.0 innings for the win.

NEW HAMPSHIRE: Was promoted to Double-A New Hampshire July 28 and made just one start for the Fisher Cats that day at Binghamton...picked up the win in a 5-1 decision (6.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 3-1 with a 0.93 ERA in six starts overall in July.

BUFFALO: Moved up to Triple-A Buffalo Aug. 1 and went 3-2 with a 1.88 ERA in six starts...ranked third in the International League in ERA in August...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in consecutive starts Aug. 12 against Norfolk and Aug. 17 at Lehigh Valley as part of a 17.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 12 to 23...allowed a season-high tying nine hits Aug. 23 against Pawtucket but surrendered just two runs in 7.0 innings for the win...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in his final minor league start Aug. 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Toronto in 2014 in just his second professional season...compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...is 15-9 with a 2.30 ERA (53 er in 207.0 ip) in 37 games, all starts, in two minor league seasons...has allowed just five home runs in 207.0 innings (0.22 per nine innings).

- A's relievers have allowed seven home runs, which are the most in the Majors...11 of 15 runs allowed this year have come via the home run (five solo homers, two three-run homers)...Fernando Abad and Jesse Chavez are the lone A's relievers to have not given up a home run this season.
- Four losses are also the most in the majors...relievers have been charged with the loss in four of the A's last five defeats (Abad, Clippard, Otero, O'Flaherty).
- Converted their first save of the season Saturday after converting 31-of-52 (59.6%) save opportunities in 2014...were the last American League team to record a save this season...the A's 31 saves in 2014 were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
- Have walked just 10 batters this season (2.39 bb/9 ip), which is the fourth best ratio in the AL...walked 122 batters last season, which was the fewest in the majors...averaged 2.35 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark by an A's bullpen since at least 1914 (2.49 in 1944)...it was the third lowest mark by an AL bullpen since 1914 (2.11 by KC in 1984, 2.28 by CWS in 1915) and the lowest by a Major League bullpen since 1994 (Montreal, 2.29)

- Went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA in six games, five starts, this spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a home run in 22.0 innings...is now 8-1 with a 2.68 ERA (15 er in 50.1 ip) in 13 games, 10 starts, over the last two springs.
- Went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA in six April starts last year...has a 2.45 (19 er in 69.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.
