ABOUT THE A'S: Have started the season 7-7...have not been more than one game over or one game under .500 this year...have not won or lost more than two in a row...have out-scored the opposition 53-4 in their seven wins and have been out-scored 42-20 in their seven losses...the A's overall run differential of +27 is third best in the majors and fourth best in Athletics history after 14 games (+56 in 1929, +52 in 1981, +30 in 2013)...are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by ½ game for the second consecutive day...have not been more than ½ game back or more than one game ahead in the West this year...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, two days in second, three days tied for second and one day tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 5, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

LEFT-HANDED STARTER: The A's are facing a left-handed starting pitcher for just the fourth time this year...are 1-2 in games started by a lefty compared to 6-5 against righties...are batting .253 (25-for-99) against lefties compared to .284 (112-for-394) against righties...the A's are one of three ML teams that have not homered off a left-handed pitcher (Milwaukee, St. Louis)...last homered off a lefty Sept. 7, 2014 against Houston when Nate Freiman homered off Dallas Keuchel...have gone homerless in their last 331 at bats against left-handers.

PITCHING: The A's have a Major League leading five shutouts...rank second in the American League and third in the majors with a 2.71 ERA...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season on Saturday at Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)...three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.216) and slugging percentage (.335) in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.278)...are tied for the third fewest walks (33)...have a 0.43 ERA (3 er in 63.0 ip) in their seven wins, a 5.00 ERA (35 er in 63.0 ip) in their seven losses.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip)...rank second in the American League and fourth in the majors in ERA...the .667 winning percentage is third best in the AL...also rank second in innings pitched (82.1) and fewest home runs (5)...are 6-0 with a 0.65 ERA (3 er in 41.2 ip) in the A's seven wins, 0-3 with a 4.87 ERA (22 er in 40.2 ip) in the seven losses.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .235 (46 for 196) with 22 runs scored over the last six games (3.7 runs per game) after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored over the first eight contests (6.4 runs per game)...are batting .278 overall, which ranks third in the American League...lead the AL in doubles (32) and extra base hits (49), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank second in runs scored (73) and have the third fewest strikeouts (91)...are tied for the second most grounded into double plays (16)...are batting .336 (45-for-134) with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors last night and lead the American League with 12 for the season...have turned 16 double plays, which are tied for the most in the AL...have turned at least one double play in 12 of 14 games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen seven bases in the last six games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 7-for-7 in stolen base attempts and are one of four Major League teams without a caught stealing (Boston, Cincinnati, New York-NL)...opponents have been successful in all five of their stolen base attempts against the A's and Oakland is one of two ML teams that has yet to catch an opponent stealing (St. Louis).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...return home follow-

ing the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Houston (three game) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-3 in night games compared to 0-4 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...are 0-5 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 7-2 in games decided by three runs or more...are the only ML team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...improved to 4-1 in the first game of a series with the win last night...have lost the final game of each of the first four series of the season...lead the majors in last at bat losses (4)...Sunday's 3 hour and 8 minute game was the A's longest nine-inning game of the season...are averaging 2:51 per game, which is second fastest in the American League (Kansas City, 2:50).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated April 11...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013... began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the first meeting of 2015 last night after losing the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have lost seven of the last nine games at Anaheim...are 42-35 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 34-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in three of their last seven games and have been held to one run or fewer in 19 of their last 27 losses, including 10 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 407-331 against the Angels...that includes 211-156 in Oakland and 196-175 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 456-408 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler has started each of the A's first 14 games at designated hitter, matching the longest streak by an Athletic at any point of the season over the last five years (Hideki Matsui, April 6-20, 2011)...**Craig Gentry** is a .309 (38 for 123) career hitter against Los Angeles and is a perfect 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in 13 career appearances against Los Angeles (19.2 ip)...**Stephen Vogt** is 6-for-11 (.545) with two doubles, three home runs and six RBI over his last three games...**Ben Zobrist** has an 18-game hitting streak against Los Angeles (28-for-68, .412), which is the longest active streak against the Angels.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1958** Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run 8th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in **1981** Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900th career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-1, 3.00 ERA)

INNINGS PITCHED: Tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start this year (third time) and 5.0 innings in his second start...last year, he tossed five innings or fewer six of his 10 starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 42 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston last Wednesday...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014...also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth.

POMERANZ vs. LOS ANGELES:

Is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts, all last year...pitched in relief at Anaheim on April 15 (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so) and April 16 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so) and took the loss in the latter contest, a 5-4 decision in 12 innings...the win came in a start May 30 in Oakland, a 9-5 A's victory...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced (Iannetta walk) and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a solo home run by Trout and a two-run home run by Kendrick...the A's increased the lead to 9-3 before he was relieved by Otero with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Otero allowed a two-run double to Cron...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 14-inning loss at Los Angeles June 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings...then allowed an unearned run in the sixth when Josh Hamilton had a RBI single following a Donaldson error...the A's tied the game with a run in the eighth to get him off the hook.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-0, 2.11 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 2.11 ERA over his first three starts of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 5-1 with a 2.08 ERA in eight career starts in April...is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA in two starts against American League West competition compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...is now 13-5 with a 2.14 ERA in 24 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA in 24 games against everyone else...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss at Kansas City last Friday (6.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.68 ERA (37.0 ip, 28 h, 12 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 36 so, 4 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts, against Los Angeles...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four spring starts...went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts with the A's last year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...has allowed 23 of his 26 career home runs against righties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .148 (12-for-81) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .144 (14-for-97) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season...is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-18 with a 4.50 ERA (98 er in 196.0 ip) in 42 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 21-for-24 (87.5%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just two in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-26 (.381) in his career...allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Began his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but was on his first Opening Day roster...started the season in the bullpen and made nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation...made his first start in the second game of a May 7 doubleheader against Seattle and combined with Otero and Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...combined on a shutout in each of his first three starts...tossed 5.0 innings in each of the three shutouts and allowed three hits or fewer each time...joins Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...won all three starts for the first and only winning streak of his career...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings May 25 at Toronto...was 4-1 with a 0.94 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first 12 games through May 20...then went 1-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his next five starts before fracturing his right hand June 16...tossed 5.1 innings May 30 against Los Angeles (AL), which was his first outing over 5.0 innings since July 27, 2012 against Cincinnati when he also tossed 5.1 innings...that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings pitched or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...finished May with a 4-1 record, a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 5 at New York (AL) and June 10 at Los Angeles (AL)...that snapped a streak of 24 consecutive starts dating back to July 15, 2012 in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak in the majors since at least 1914 (previous: 18, Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...fractured his right wrist following his start June 16 against Texas and was placed on the 15-day DL the next day...made one rehab start with Sacramento before he was reinstated and optioned to Sacramento July 13...returned to Oakland Aug. 27 and started that day at Houston...was optioned to Single-A Beloit the next day but did not appear in a game before returning to Oakland Sept. 2 when the Snappers season concluded.

- A's relievers have allowed seven home runs, which are the most in the Majors...11 of 15 runs allowed this year have come via the home run (five solo homers, two three-run homers)...Fernando Abad and Jesse Chavez are the lone A's relievers to have not given up a home run this season.
- Four losses are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh)...relievers have been charged with the loss in four of the A's last five defeats (Abad, Clippard, Otero, O'Flaherty).
- Have two saves in their last three games after not converting a save in their first 11 contests...the A's 31 saves in 2014 were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22).
