OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-8) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (6-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost 14-1 last night, which was their largest margin of defeat since Aug. 25, 2011 when they dropped a 22-9 decision at New York (AL)...are now 7-8, marking the fourth time this year the A's have been one game under .500...have not been more than one game over or one game under .500...have not won or lost more than two in a row...have out-scored the opposition 53-4 in their seven wins and have been out-scored 56-21 in their eight losses...are in second place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 1½ games...have not been more than 1½ games back or more than one game ahead in the West this year...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second and one day tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 6, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night (April 9 vs. Texas)...now have five errors in the last two games after making one over the previous six contests...have 15 errors for the season, which is tied with Milwaukee and Washington for the most in the majors...have turned 16 double plays, which is tied for second in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 33 runs in the last six games (30 er in 50.0 ip, 5.40 ERA) after yielding 27 runs over the first nine contests (2.14 ERA)...have a .290 (58-for-200) opponents batting average over the last six games after allowing a .189 mark over the first nine...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.357) in the American League...have a 0.43 ERA (3 er in 63.0 ip) in their seven wins, a 5.96 ERA (47 er in 71.0 ip) in their eight losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season last Saturday at Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)...three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-2 with a 4.55 ERA (16 er in 31.2 ip) over the last six games after going 5-2 with a 2.10 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 2.99 ERA (29 er in 87.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.31)...also rank second in innings pitched (87.1) and tied for second in fewest home runs (6)...are 6-0 with a 0.65 ERA (3 er in 41.2 ip) in the A's seven wins, 0-4 with a 5.12 ERA (26 er in 45.2 ip) in the eight losses.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .224 (51 for 228) with 23 runs scored over the last seven games (3.3 runs per game) after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored over the first eight contests (6.4 runs per game)...lead the American League in doubles (32) and extra base hits (50), are tied for the lead in triples (5) and rank third in runs scored (74)...are tied for the second most grounded into double plays (16)...are batting .324 (45-for-139) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen seven bases in the last seven games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 7-for-7 in stolen base attempts and are one of four Major League teams without a caught stealing (Boston, Cincinnati, New York-NL)...opponents have been successful in all five of their stolen base attempts against the A's and Oakland is one of two ML teams that has yet to catch an opponent stealing (St. Louis).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Houston (three game) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for

the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-4 in night games compared to 0-4 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...are 6-5 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-3 in games started by a lefty...are batting .281 (114-for-405) against right-handers, .233 (28-for-120) against lefties...Billy Butler's home run off Hector Santiago last night was the A's first off a lefty since Sept. 7, 2014 when Nate Freiman homered off the Astros' Dallas Keuchel...it snapped a 341-at bat homerless streak against lefties...are 0-5 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 7-3 in games decided by three runs or more...are the only ML team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...improved to 4-1 in the first game of a series with the win Monday night...have lost the final game of each of the first four series of the season...are tied with Pittsburgh for the ML lead in last at bat losses (4).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated April 11...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2015...lost 14-1 last night...it was the A's largest margin of defeat against the Angels, topping the previous high of 12 (13-1 on July 28, 1982 and April 21, 1979)...lost the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have lost eight of the last 10 games at Anaheim...are 42-36 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 34-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 20 of their last 28 losses, including 10 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 407-332 against the Angels...that includes 211-156 in Oakland and 196-176 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 456-409 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler has started each of the A's first 15 games at designated hitter, which is the longest streak by an Athletic at any point of the season since Frank Thomas had a 24-game streak from Aug. 1 to 25, 2008...**Ike Davis** tossed a scoreless eighth inning last night to become the eighth position player in Oakland history to pitch, the first since Frank Menechino on July 18, 2000 at Colorado...**Brett Lawrie** has not committed an error and leads Major League third basemen with 49 total chances...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in 13 career appearances against Los Angeles (19.2 ip)...**Ben Zobrist** has an 18-game hitting streak against Los Angeles (28-for-68, .412), which is the longest active streak against the Angels.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1916** Jack Nabors defeats Boston 6-2 to even his season record at 1-1...he would go on to lose 19 consecutive games to set the Athletics franchise record...in **1969** Rollie Fingers tosses the first of his two career shutouts, a five-hitter in the A's 7-0 win at Minnesota...in **1984** Dave Kingman homers twice but the A's lose to Dennis Eckersley at Boston, 12-8...in **2003** Miguel Tejada hits a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-5.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-0, 2.11 ERA)

IN APRIL: Is 1-0 with a 2.11 ERA (5 er in 21.1 ip) over his first three starts of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 5-1 with a 2.08 ERA (13 er in 56.1 ip) in eight career starts in April...was named American League Pitcher of the Month last April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in two starts against American League West competition this year compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 13-5 with a 2.14 ERA (39 er in 163.2 ip) in 24 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA (60 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

FIRST START: He combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball).

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero).

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City last Friday...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-1 with a 2.68 ERA (37.0 ip, 28 h, 12 r, 11 er, 13 bb, 36 so, 4 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts...is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (8 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) in two games at Anaheim...was 2-1 with a 3.10 ERA in four starts last year...the first win came in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on June 1...blanked the Angels on four hits and two walks over the first four innings...allowed two runs in the fifth inning on back-to-back sacrifice flies by Aybar and Pujols and yielded a RBI double to Aybar in the

seventh...also picked up the win in a 5-3 victory in Oakland August 22...allowed a career-high two home runs...yielded solo one-out home runs to Trout in the first inning and Hamilton in the fourth...then had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) August 28...allowed three runs in the second inning on a RBI single by Aybar and a two-run single by Beckham...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings as he blanked the Angels on two hits and three walks over his final five innings...left with the score tied 3-3...took the loss in a 2-0 decision in Oakland Sept. 23...struck out a career-high 12 batters in 7.0 innings...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Aybar scored from third on a strikeout/caught stealing...also allowed a leadoff home run to Beckham in the sixth...LeBlanc and four Angels relievers combined to shut out the A's on seven hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 31...allowed a .354 (21-for-65) opponents batting average...yielded six runs in his final Cactus League start (2.2 ip) after surrendering six runs in his first three starts (11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA).

2014 RECAP: Spent the entire season in the starting rotation in his first full season with the A's and went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts...led the A's in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched, losses, hits (187), runs (84) and walks (74) and tied for the lead in earned runs (75).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for second in the American League in shutouts (2), ranked fifth in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.327), tied for sixth in complete games (2), seventh in innings pitched (219.0), eighth in ERA, tied for eighth in games started and ninth in strikeouts (183)

STRIKEOUTS AND INNINGS: His 183 strikeouts were the 10th highest single season total in Oakland history...they were third most in Oakland history by a pitcher 24-years old or younger behind Vida Blue (301 strikeouts in 1971 at age 21) and Barry Zito (205 strikeouts in 2001 at age 23)...his 219.0 innings pitched were third most by an Oakland pitcher 24-years old or younger since 1981.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and tied for seventh in wins at the break...then went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA in 14 starts after the break...tied for third in the AL in post-break losses.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .232 opponents batting average included a .221 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .245 against right-handers...allowed 10 of his 15 home runs to left-handers...13 were solo shots and 15 of his 20 career home runs have come with the bases empty...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .169 batting average and .270 slugging percentage, both of which ranked second lowest in the AL among qualifiers for the ERA title...the batting average and slugging percentage were fourth lowest in Oakland history...yielded a .215 average to batters leading off an inning, which was ninth lowest in the AL...had the sixth lowest slugging percentage in that situation (.317)...has a .212 (61-for-288) career average against batters leading off an inning and a .302 slugging percentage.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 6-3 with a 2.51 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in 15 starts on the road compared to 8-7 with a 3.60 ERA and .250 opponents average in 18 starts in Oakland...allowed just five home runs in 104.0 innings on the road...had the third lowest road opponents batting average in the AL and the fifth lowest ERA...his road ERA was fourth lowest in Oakland history and the lowest since Mike Torrez in 1976 (2.50).

RHP Jesse Chavez (0-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the bullpen...did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year and now has a 2.45 career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season...picked up the save in his last appearance, a 5-0 A's win at Kansas City last Saturday (3.2 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-3 with a 3.99 ERA (29.1 ip, 30 h, 13 er, 5 bb, 26 so, 4 hr) in 13 career appearances, including two starts, against Los Angeles...went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA in six games, five starts, this spring...began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances.
