ABOUT THE A'S: Evened their record at 8-8 with the win last night...that marks the eighth time this year the A's have been exactly .500...were exactly .500 four times over the last two years combined...have not been more than one game over or one game under .500 this year...have not won or lost more than two in a row...are in second place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by ½ game...have not been more than 1½ games back or more than one game ahead in the West this year...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second and one day tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 7, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 8-4 in night games compared to 0-4 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...have hit all 14 of their home runs at night...the A's have a 2.74 ERA (32 er in 105.0 ip) at night, 4.74 (20 er in 38.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 12 night games compared to eight in four days games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's won 9-2 last night...have out-scored the opposition 62-6 in their eight wins and have been out-scored 56-21 in their eight losses...the A's are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have more wins by seven or more runs than any other team has games decided by seven or more...are 0-5 in games decided by two runs or fewer and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs.

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs on 18 hits last night after tallying nine runs on 20 hits over the previous three games...are now batting .283 for the season, which ranks third in the American League...it is the second best batting average after 16 games in Oakland history (.300 in 1994)...are batting a Major League leading .329 (51-for-155) with runners in scoring position...lead the AL in doubles (33), are tied for the lead in extra base hits (52), tied for second in runs (83) and triples (5) and rank third in on-base percentage (.341)...are tied for the second most grounded into double plays (18).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases last night...it was the A's first four-steal game since April 16, 2013 against Houston...have 11 steals in the last eight games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts and are one of four Major League teams without a caught stealing (Cincinnati 17, Boston 11, New York-NL 8)...opponents have been successful in all five of their stolen base attempts against the A's and Oakland is the only team in the majors that has yet to catch an opponent stealing.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 35 runs in the last seven games (32 er in 59.0 ip, 4.88 ERA) after yielding 27 runs over the first nine contests (2.14 ERA)...have a .268 (62-for-231) opponents batting average over the last seven games after allowing a .189 mark over the first nine...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.347) in the American League and third lowest on-base percentage (.285)...have a 0.63 ERA (5 er in 72.0 ip) in their eight wins, a 5.96 ERA (47 er in 71.0 ip) in their eight losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season last Saturday at Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)...three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-4 with a 2.86 ERA (30 er in 94.1 ip)...lead the American League and rank fourth in the majors in ERA...are tied for the fewest home runs allowed in the AL (6), rank second in innings pitched (94.1) and tied for second in winning percentage (.636)...are 7-0 with a 0.74 ERA (4 er in 48.2 ip) in the A's eight wins, 0-4 with a 5.12 ERA (26 er in 45.2 ip) in the eight losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in their last three games and have 15 for the season, which is tied with Texas for the American League lead...have turned 16 double plays, which is tied for third in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this 10-game road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Houston (three game) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...last year, the A's compiled a 48-33 (.593) record at home compared to 40-41 (.494) on the road...tied for the third best home record in the American League and had the eighth best road record...posted a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season but had a losing record on the road for the first time since 2011.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-5 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-3 in games started by a lefty...are batting .294 (131-for-445) against right-handers, .240 (29-for-121) against lefties...the A's are 4-1 in the first game of a series but have lost the final game of each of the first four series of the season...are tied with Pittsburgh and San Diego for the Major League lead in last at bat losses (4).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...began the season with eight players on the DL as Josh Reddick was reinstated April 11...the eight players are the most on the DL to start the season for the A's since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992...the previous high was seven last year...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have won two of the first three games of 2015 after losing the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have lost eight of the last 11 games at Anaheim...are 43-36 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 35-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 20 of their last 28 losses, including 10 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 408-332 against the Angels...that includes 211-156 in Oakland and 197-176 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 457-409 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler has homered in back-to-back games and now has 14 career home runs against Los Angeles, which are his second most against any team (18, Chicago-AL)...is a .328 (39-for-119) career hitter at Angel Stadium...**Sam Fuld** scored three runs last night and leads the American League with 14 for the season...**Brett Lawrie** has not committed an error and leads Major League third baseman with 53 total chances...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a run in 13 career appearances against Los Angeles (19.2 ip)...**Stephen Vogt** is tied for third in the AL with 14 RBI...six of those RBI have either tied the game or put the A's ahead...**Ben Zobrist** has an 18-game hitting streak against Los Angeles (28-for-68, .412), which is the longest active streak against the Angels.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1978** the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in **1985** the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the first A's first 14 games...in **1988** Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the bullpen...did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...will start for Jesse Hahn today, who will miss his start due to a blister.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18... then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...had made just two career starts entering 2014 and is now 8-8 with a 3.89 ERA (58 er in 134.1 ip) in 23 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA (141 er in 253.0 ip) in 204 relief appearances.

IN APRIL: Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.2 ip) and .200 (5-for-25) opponents batting average in four games this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins... ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...now has a 2.45 (19 er in 69.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk.

LAST APPEARANCE: He recorded the save in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City last Saturday...relieved Hahn in the sixth inning and tossed 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Houston July 28, 2014...allowed a career-high three home runs and a season-high six runs...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Carter in the third inning...the A's tied the game in the fifth but he allowed a two-run home run to Castro and a solo home run to Krauss in the sixth inning.

with a 3.99 ERA (29.1 ip, 30 h, 18 r, 13 er, 5 bb, 26 so, 4 hr) in 13 career appearances, including two starts...is 1-1 with a 7.88 ERA (7 er in 8.0 ip) in five games in his home ballparks and 0-2 with a 2.53 ERA (6 er in 21.1 ip) in eight games in Anaheim...is 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in his two starting assignments...went 0-1 with a 2.57 ERA in five games, including two starts, last year...had a no decision in his first start, a 3-2 A's win at Los Angeles April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts...allowed an unearned run in the first inning and a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...then took the loss in a 4-1 decision at Los Angeles (AL) June 9...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Trout sacrifice fly, an Ibanez RBI single and a Trout RBI double...also faced the Angels in relief on Aug. 24 in Oakland (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so) and Aug. 29 (1.0 ip) and Aug. 31 (4.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so) at Anaheim.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline... went 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .247 (78-for-316) against left-handed hitters compared to .260 (64-for-246) against right-handers...allowed 17 home runs, 12 of which were solo shots...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that...yielded a .208 average with RISP and two outs...opponents reached base on an error eight times, which tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed a .303 batting average over his first 15 pitches in game, .213 from pitches 16-60 and .281 after that...held the number six hitter to a .119 batting average, which was second lowest in the AL, but the number eight hitter batted .393, which was the highest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 15 games in Oakland compared to 3-6 with a 4.12 ERA in 17 games on the road...yielded just four home runs in 67.1 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 78.2 innings on the road.

DAYS REST: Was 6-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more, 2-5 with a 4.08 ERA in nine starts on four days rest...had a 1.13 ERA in three relief appearances on two days rest or fewer, 5.11 in eight appearances with three days rest or more

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a 7-6 record and a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...went 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games, two starts, after the break...now has a 3.75 ERA (102 er in 244.2 ip) in 113 career appearances before the break, 6.12 (97 er in 142.2 ip) in 114 outings after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Did not commit an error in 15 chances and has not made an error in 75 games and 30 chances in four seasons with the A's.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 5.80 runs of support as a starter, which ranked fourth highest in the AL at the time of his last start on July 28...the A's were 14-7 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his 21 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11 times...tossed at least one inning in nine of his 11 relief appearances, including three innings or more four times...went 0-for-3 with three strikeouts as a hitter and is 0-for-8 with eight strikeouts in his career.

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.33 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start...is 2-0 with a 1.33 ERA over his first three starts this year and is now 6-0 with a 1.84 ERA in nine starts in April over the last two seasons... opponents are 9-for-43 (.209) with the bases empty and 1-for-26 (.038) with runners on base...are 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss at Kansas City last Sunday (7.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA in eight career starts against Houston...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-1 A's win at Houston April 13 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 8 so)... went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts...opponents hit .161 (10-for-62)...won a career-high and team-leading 15 games last year in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008).
