ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to 8-9 with the loss yesterday, marking the fifth time this year they have been one game under .500... have not been more than one game over or one game under .500 this year...have not won or lost more than two in a row...are in second place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by one game...have not been more than 1½ games back or more than one game ahead in the West this year...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second and one day tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 8, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

ONE-HITTERS: The A's allowed just one hit yesterday but lost 2-0...it marked the second time in Oakland history the A's lost a one-hitter (3-1 at Kansas City on April 14, 1992) and third time in Athletics history since 1914 (1-0 at Baltimore, Sept. 12, 1964)...it was the A's second one-hitter of the season (April 6 vs. Texas), marking the first time the A's have allowed one hit or fewer twice in one season since 2010 (one no-hitter, one one-hitter).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have out-scored the opposition 62-6 in their eight wins (7.8 to 0.8) and have been out-scored 58-21 in their nine losses (6.4 to 2.3)...the A's are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more... have more wins by seven or more runs than any other team has games decided by seven or more...are 0-6 in games decided by two runs or fewer and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs.

OFFENSE: The A's hit .261 and averaged 4.0 runs per game on the 10-game road trip after hitting .304 while averaging 6.1 runs per game on the first homestand of the season...hit 11 home runs on the trip after hitting just three at home...are batting .280 overall, which ranks third in the American League...it is the second best batting average after 17 games in Oakland history (.296 in 1994)...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (34), tied for second in triples (5), rank third in extra base hits (53) and fourth in runs (83) and on-base percentage (.337)...are batting .313 (51-for-163) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...are tied for the second most grounded into double plays (18).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases Wednesday night...it was the A's first four-steal game since April 16, 2013 against Houston...have 11 steals in the last nine games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts and are one of three Major League teams without a caught stealing (Boston 12, New York-NL 9)...opponents have been successful in all six of their stolen base attempts against the A's and Oakland is the only team in the majors that has yet to catch an opponent stealing.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the first 17 games and have a 2.78 ERA (31 er in 100.1 ip)... that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.22)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (100.1), tied for second in fewest home runs (7)...are 7-0 with a 0.74 ERA (4 er in 48.2 ip) in the A's eight wins, 0-5 with a 4.70 ERA (27 er in 51.2 ip) in the eight losses.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.60 ERA and .238 opponents batting average on the road trip after posting a 2.59 ERA and .185 opponents average on the first homestand...have a 3.16 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...have the lowest opponents batting average (.215) and rank second in on-base percentage (.279) and slugging percentage (.339)...have a 0.63 ERA (5 er in 72.0 ip) in their eight wins, a 5.47 ERA (48 er in 79.0 ip) in their nine losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season last Saturday at Kansas City...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)... three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in their last four games and have 16 for the season, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...have turned 16 double plays, which is tied for third in the AL.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are 7-6 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-3 in games started by a lefty...are batting .290 (139-for-480) against right-handers, .240 (29-for-121) against lefties...have hit 13 of their 14 home runs off righties.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Houston (three game) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 8-4 in night games compared to 0-5 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game... have hit all 14 of their home runs at night...the A's have a 2.74 ERA (32 er in 105.0 ip) at night, 4.11 (21 er in 46.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 12 night games compared to eight in four days games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost the final game at Los Angeles yesterday and are now 0-5 in the final game of a series...are 4-1 in the first game of a series...are 0-6 when the opponent scores first, 0-6 when they are out-homered and 0-6 when scoring fewer than four runs...are tied for the Major League lead in last at bat losses (4).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton yesterday...have used the DL eight times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...began the season with seven players on the DL, used it just six times from Opening Day through July 27, and then added five players over a 28-day span from July 28 through August 24... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's won two of three at Houston last week to open the season series...won the season series last year 11-8... went 6-3 in Oakland and 5-5 in Houston... have now won all four season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 33-14...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 30 or more times... nine of the A's 14 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-6 in Oakland and 17-8 in Houston.

Billy Butler has reached base safely in each of the A's 17 games and has hit safely in 16 of those contests...**Tyler Clippard** has pitched in 377 games since the start of the 2010 season, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Ike Davis** is 16-for-41 (.390) over his last 12 games after going 1-for-9 (.111) over his first three contests...**Sam Fuld** is tied for the American League lead with 14 runs scored...**Stephen Vogt** is tied for fourth in the AL with 14 RBI...six of those RBI have either tied the game or put the A's ahead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Rick Monday establishes a club record with three doubles in the A's 6-4 win at Minnesota...in **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out 14 Seattle Mariners after fanning a club record 16 batters in his previous start, but the A's lose 3-1...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.33 ERA)

IN APRIL: Is 2-0 with a 1.33 ERA over his first three starts this year and ranks sixth in the American League in ERA...went 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA over his first three starts last year (2-0, 1.65 ERA after four starts in 2014)...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April in 2014 and is now 6-0 with a 1.84 ERA (12 er in 58.2 ip) in nine starts in April over the last two seasons.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 23 strikeouts in 20.1 innings over his first three starts...is tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 9-for-43 (.209) with the bases empty and 1-for-26 (.038) with runners on base...are 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965.

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City last Sunday...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss.

KAZMIR vs. HOUSTON: Is 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA (49.1 ip, 40 h, 19 r, 17 er, 17 bb, 55 so, 6 hr) in eight career starts...is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts in his home ballparks and 2-0 with a 4.70 ERA (8 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts at Minute Maid Park...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-1 A's win at Houston April 13 (see second start above)...went 1-0 with a 2.30

ERA (27.1 ip, 21 h, 9 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 26 so, 1 hr) in four starts last year...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win in Oakland April 19...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win...picked up the win in a 10-1 decision at Houston April 24...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Houston in 12 innings July 22 in Oakland...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced...had another no decision in the A's 4-3 win Sept. 6 in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Corporan and Villar started the sixth inning with back-to-back singles.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in a minor league game between his March 17 and 28 starts...opponents hit .161 (10-for-62)...did not allow a run or walk a batter in two of his four starts...is 3-0 with a 1.30 ERA (5 er in 34.2 ip) in eight starts in two springs with the A's.

2014 RECAP: Won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts...had career highs in winning percentage (.625) and opponents grounded into double plays (19) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36)...had two complete games after tallying just one in 208 starts over his first nine seasons...his starts and innings pitched (190.1) were second most in his career to his 34 starts and 206.2 innings with Tampa Bay in 2007.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for eighth in the AL in wins...also had the sixth highest run support (5.58), tied for sixth in complete games, ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.357) and tied for 10th in games started.

FIRST 15 STARTS/LAST 17 STARTS: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts and was leading the AL in ERA entering play June 24...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and went 6-7 with a 5.00 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over his final 17 starts...his ERA from June 24 through the end of the season was fourth highest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .238 opponents batting average, including .227 against right-handed hitters compared to .273 against left-handers...yielded 14 of his 16 home runs to righties...has surrendered 31 of his 36 home runs over the last three years to righties...ranked sixth in the AL among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...rank second in the AL with a .123 opponents average against the number eight hitter and a .169 average against the number two hitter...walked just seven batters to lead off an inning...yielded a .188 batting average with two outs, .261 with no or one outs.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 12 starts during the day compared to 10-6 with a 3.91 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 20 starts at night...surrendered just two home runs in 75.1 innings during the day...is now 10-5 with a 3.07 ERA (47 er in 137.2 ip) in 23 starts in day games over the last three years compared to 17-13 with a 3.97 ERA (102 er in 231.0 ip) in 41 starts in night games.

AGAINST THE WEST: Compiled a 4-4 record and a 4.71 ERA in 12 starts against AL West competition last year compared to 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA in 20 starts against everyone else...over the last three years, he is 9-7 with a 4.61 ERA (61 er in 119.1 ip) in 22 starts against the AL West, 18-11 with a 3.18 ERA (88 er in 249.1 ip) in 42 starts against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Posted a 1.97 ERA in the first inning, which ranked fourth in the AL...opponents were successful in 18-of-20 (90.0%) stolen bases off him and he had just one pickoff...the stolen base percentage was second highest in the AL (Hughes, MIN 93.3%) and the stolen bases tied for seventh most...the A's were 21-11 (.656) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 25 of his 32 starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-1, 6.94 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has tossed fewer than four innings in two of his three starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Los Angeles on Monday (3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has faced Houston once this year and it came in his second appearance this year, a start and win in the A's 4-0 victory on April 14 (5.1 ip, 4 h, 4 bb, 3 so)...went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...held the opposition to a .141 batting average...was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing and Duncedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then posted a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances with Toronto in his ML debut in September.
