ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost two straight and three of the last four games to fall a season-high two games under .500... it marks the first time the A's have been two games under .500 since May 15, 2013 (20-22)...have not been three games under .500 since July 2, 2012 (39-42)...have not won or lost more than two games in a row this year...are tied for third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high two games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second and two days tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Oakland 9 days, Houston 9, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's lost to Houston last night in 11 innings, 5-4... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it was the first game in Major League history in which teams scored at least two runs in the top of the 10th, bottom of the 10th, top of the 11th and bottom of the 11th...it was the A's third extra inning game of the season, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the American League...have lost all three games and the three losses are tied with Cincinnati for the most in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 4-for-4 last night, which ties the Oakland record for pinch hits in a game...also had four pinch hits Aug. 30, 1970 at Detroit (Alou, Hovley, Jackson, Donaldson)...had three pinch hits in an inning (10th) for the first time since May 22, 1997 at Texas (Williams, Stairs, McGwire)...were 1-for-8 in the pinch to start the season...are tied for the American League lead in walks (2), rank second in hits (5) and tied for third in RBI (3).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 8-5 in night games compared to 0-5 during the day...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game... have hit all 15 of their home runs at night...the A's have a 2.87 ERA (37 er in 116.0 ip) at night, 4.11 (21 er in 46.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 13 night games compared to eight in four days games.

STARTING PITCHING: Scott Kazmir tossed 7.0 scoreless innings last night, the sixth scoreless outing by an A's starter this year...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the first 18 games and have a 2.60 ERA (31 er in 107.1 ip)...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.06)...lead the AL in innings pitched (107.1) and are tied for the lead in fewest home runs (7)...are 7-0 with a 0.74 ERA (4 er in 48.2 ip) in the A's eight wins, 0-5 with a 4.14 ERA (27 er in 58.2 ip) in the eight losses.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.38 ERA (38 er in 78.0 ip) over the last nine games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.22 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League... have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.337), rank second in batting average (.219) and third in on-base percentage (.286)...have a 0.63 ERA (5 er in 72.0 ip) in their eight wins, a 5.30 ERA (53 er in 90.0 ip) in their nine losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...shutout number five came in the 12th game of the season a week ago today at Kansas City... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the A's are the first team in ML history with five shutout wins over its first 12 games (the 1913 Phillies had five shutouts in 12 games, but one was a 0-0 tie)...three of the A's five shutouts have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases Wednesday night...it was the A's first four-steal game since April 16, 2013 against Houston...have 11 steals in the last 10 games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts and are one of two Major League teams without a caught stealing (New York-NL 9)...A's opponents were caught stealing last night for the first time... opponents have been successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .249 (85-for-342) with 36 runs scored (3.6 per game) over the last 10 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .275 overall, which ranks third in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in doubles

(35), tied for second in triples (5), rank third in runs (87) and extra base hits (55) and fourth in on-base percentage (.333)...are batting .314 (53-for-169) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the majors to San Diego (.325)...are tied for second in the AL in most grounded into double plays (18).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in their last five games and have 17 for the season, which is tied with Philadelphia and Washington for the most in the majors.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have out-scored the opposition 62-6 in their eight wins (7.8 to 0.8) and have been out-scored 63-25 in their 10 losses (6.3 to 2.5)...the A's are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more... have the most wins and games in that split...are 0-7 in games decided by two runs or fewer and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Houston (0-1) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-4 on their season-opening seven-game homestand against Texas (2-2) and Seattle (1-2) and are 3-5 at home for the season... went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...have hit 11 of their 15 home runs on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's fell to 0-5 in games decided in the winning teams last at bat with the loss last night...the five last at bat losses are the most in the majors...are 7-6 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...have hit 14 of their 15 home runs off righties...the A's are 4-2 in the first game of a series, 0-5 in the final game...are 0-7 when the opponent scores first, 0-6 when they are out-homered and 0-6 when scoring fewer than four runs

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton Thursday...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. ASTROS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Oakland last night after winning two of three at Houston last week...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-3 in Oakland and 5-5 in Houston...have now won all four season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 33-15...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 30 or more times...10 of the A's 15 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-7 in Oakland and 17-8 in Houston.

Tyler Clippard has pitched in 378 games since the start of the 2010 season, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Ike Davis** is 17-for-42 (.405) over his last 13 games after going 1-for-9 (.111) over his first three contests...is batting .353 overall, which ranks eighth in the American League...**Sam Fuld** is tied for the Major League lead with 15 runs scored...**Marcus Semien** has three straight multiple hit games for the first time in his career (6-for-13, .462).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history... he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-1, 6.94 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has tossed fewer than four innings in two of his three starts... was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits... allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles on Monday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-1 with a 0.36 ERA in six spring training starts...had the lowest ERA in the majors and the lowest ERA by a Cactus League qualifier since at least 2006...allowed just one earned run all spring...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins and tied for fifth in innings pitched (25.1)...held the opposition to a .141 (12-for-85) batting average...surrendered just one home run in 25.1 innings...did not allow an earned run over his final 20.1 spring innings...it was his first Major League Spring Training.

ters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Céspedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts, including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

LANSING: Began the season at Single-A Lansing where he went 2-0 with a 0.34 ERA in four starts...allowed a .126 batting average and opponents were hitless in 14 at bats with runners in scoring position...walked a season-high three batters in his first start April 6 at Lake County...then struck out a season-high seven in each of his next three starts...including April 18 at Beloit when he tossed a season-high 8.1 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...was named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 14 to 20.

DUNEDIN: Was promoted to Single-A Dunedin of the Florida State League April 30 and logged an 8-4 record and a 2.23 ERA in 16 starts...the wins tied for second most in the FSL during his stint there, which ran through July 27, while his ERA ranked seventh...went 4-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts at home...allowed a season-high four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Tampa...picked up the win in five consecutive starts from May 12 to June 3...compiled a 3.14 ERA during the winning streak...surrendered his first home run of the season May 22 against Ft. Myers and matched his season high by allowing four runs...would not allow his second and final home run until Aug. 7 against Durham...had a 13-start, 87.0-inning, 347-batter homerless streak in between...matched his season high by allowing four runs in a June 8 loss at Lakeland...that ran his overall minor league record to 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA in 12 starts...went 7-4 with a 1.39 ERA over his final 15 starts...matched his season high with three walks June 16 at Brevard County...did not allow a run in consecutive starts July 1 at Clearwater and July 6 vs. Tampa...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in each start and had a 20.0-inning scoreless streak from June 26 to July 11...allowed a season-high nine hits July 17 against Jupiter but yielded just one run in 7.0 innings for the win.

NEW HAMPSHIRE: Was promoted to Double-A New Hampshire July 28 and made just one start for the Fisher Cats that day at Binghamton...picked up the win in a 5-1 decision (6.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 3-1 with a 0.93 ERA in six starts overall in July.

BUFFALO: Moved up to Triple-A Buffalo Aug. 1 and went 3-2 with a 1.88 ERA in six starts...ranked third in the International League in ERA in August...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in consecutive starts Aug. 12 against Norfolk and Aug. 17 at Lehigh Valley as part of a 17.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 12 to 23...allowed a season-high tying nine hits Aug. 23 against Pawtucket but surrendered just two runs in 7.0 innings for the win...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in his final minor league start Aug. 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Toronto in 2014 in just his second professional season...compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...is 15-9 with a 2.30 ERA (53 er in 207.0 ip) in 37 games, all starts, in two minor league seasons...has allowed just five home runs in 207.0 innings (0.22 per nine innings).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.24 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his last two starts after pitching a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 43 career starts, including just six with six or more innings...lost his second consecutive start in his last start, a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.28 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 11 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's loss at Houston on April 15 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...spent most of the 2014 season with the A's and went 5-4 with a 2.35 ERA in 20 games, including 10 starts.
