ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost three straight games for the first time this year... have also lost four of the last five games to fall to three games under .500 for the first time since July 2, 2012 (39-42)...have not been four games under .500 since July 1, 2012 (38-42)...are tied for third place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high three games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second and three days tied for third...every team in the West has held at least a share of first this year (Houston 10 days, Oakland 9, Houston 9, Los Angeles 3, Seattle 2, Texas 1).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-6 during day games compared to 8-5 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...are batting .249 (53 for 213) with 17 runs scored during the day (2.83 per game) compared to .281 (129 for 459) with 73 runs scored at night (5.62 per game)...have hit all 15 of their home runs at night...have a 2.87 ERA (37 er in 116.0 ip) at night, 4.58 (28 er in 55.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 13 night games compared to 11 in six day games.

IN APRIL: The A's are 8-11 in April and need to win each of their remaining four games in the month to avoid finishing with a losing record in April for the first time since 2012 (10-12)...are batting .271 in April, which is currently their best average in the first month of the season since 1998 (.282).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have out-scored the opposition 62-6 in their eight wins (7.8 to 0.8) and have been out-scored 72-28 in their 11 losses (6.5 to 2.5)...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most wins and games in that split in the majors...are 0-7 in games decided by two runs or fewer and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...the seven losses are tied for the most (San Francisco, Miami).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the first 19 games and have a 2.97 ERA (37 er in 112.0 ip)...that is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (112.0), tied for second in wins (7) and third in fewest home runs (8)...are 7-0 with a 0.74 ERA (4 er in 48.2 ip) in the A's eight wins, 0-6 with a 4.69 ERA (33 er in 63.1 ip) in the 11 losses.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.66 ERA (45 er in 87.0 ip) over the last 10 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.42 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.349) and third lowest batting average (.223) and on-base percentage (.292)...have a 0.63 ERA (5 er in 72.0 ip) in their eight wins, a 5.45 ERA (60 er in 99.0 ip) in their 11 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts...three of those have been by eight or more runs, matching the A's total for the entire 2014 season.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high four bases Wednesday night at Los Angeles (AL)...it was the A's first four-steal game since April 16, 2013 against Houston...have 11 steals in the last 11 games after swiping no bags over the first eight contests...are a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts and are one of two Major League teams without a caught stealing (New York-NL 9)...A's opponents have been caught stealing in each of their last two attempts after being successful in each of their first six.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .243 (91-for-375) with 39 runs scored (3.5 per game) over the last 11 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .271 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in triples (6), rank second in doubles (35), third in runs (90) and fourth in extra base hits (56) and on-base percentage (.330)...are batting .309 (55-for-178) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the majors to San Diego (.321)...are tied for second in the AL in most grounded into double plays (19).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in their last six games and have 19 for the season, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 13 unearned runs, which is the most in the American

League and third most in the majors (Milwaukee and Washington, 15)...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is twice as many as any other team (Minnesota and Seattle, 4).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters went 4-for-4 Friday night, which tied the Oakland record for pinch hits in a game...also had four pinch hits Aug. 30, 1970 at Detroit (Alou, Hovley, Jackson, Donaldson)...had three pinch hits in an inning (10th) for the first time since May 22, 1997 at Texas (Williams, Stairs, McGwire)...were 1-for-8 in the pinch to start the season...are tied for the American League lead in walks (2), rank second in hits (5) and tied for third in RBI (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on the second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Houston (0-2) and Los Angeles (three games)...have a four-game home losing streak...went 3-4 on the first homestand and are 3-6 at home for the season, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...have hit 11 of their 15 home runs on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-5 in the final game of a series...have a 4-2 record in the first game...are 0-5 in games decided in the last at bat and have the most last at bat losses in the majors...are 7-7 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .289 (151-for-523) with 14 of their 15 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .208 (31-for-149) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games...are tied with Seattle for the most extra inning games in the American League and are tied with Cincinnati for the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 when the opponent scores first, 0-7 when they are out-homered and 0-7 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton Thursday...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-2...have lost the first two games of this series and have never been swept by the Astros...won two of three in Houston last week...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-3 in Oakland and 5-5 in Houston...have now won all four season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 33-16...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 30 or more times...10 of the A's 16 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-8 in Oakland and 17-8 in Houston.

Tyler Clippard has pitched in 378 games since the start of the 2010 season, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Ike Davis** is 18-for-46 (.391) over his last 14 games and is batting .345 overall, which ranks ninth in the American League...**Sam Fuld** is tied for the AL lead with 15 runs scored...**Josh Reddick** is 11-for-22 (.500) with four walks over his last seven games after going 4-for-20 (.200) over his first five contests...**Stephen Vogt** leads the majors with a .615 batting average with runners in scoring position.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in **1997** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in **2001** the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.24 ERA)

INNINGS PITCHED: Has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his last two starts after pitching a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start (third time)... last year, he tossed five innings or fewer six of his 10 starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 43 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston April 15...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014... also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles on Tuesday...allowed four runs in the second inning, all with two outs...Gjovotella hit a three-run homer and a fourth run scored on a Semien error...allowed a leadoff double to Cron in the sixth inning and was relieved by Alvarez who allowed that run to score plus five of his own.

POMERANZ vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-2 with a 6.28 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 11 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, all at Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's loss at Houston on April 15 (see second start above)...had no decisions and a 0.00 ERA in two outings last year (7.1 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 2 bb, 9 so)...pitched in relief April 24 in a 10-1 A's victory (2.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 2 so)...then had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win on August 27...shutout the Astros on two hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the bottom of the sixth...put runners on first and second with one out and was relieved by Cook, who allowed the tying run to score on a wild pitch...a Sogard error made the run unearned.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA

was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...has allowed 24 of his 27 career home runs against righties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .153 (13-for-85) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .165 (17-for-103) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season...is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-19 with a 4.57 ERA (102 er in 201.0 ip) in 43 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 21-for-24 (87.5%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just two in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments and his teams are 16-27 (.372) in his career...allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Began his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but was on his first Opening Day roster...started the season in the bullpen and made nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation...made his first start in the second game of a May 7 doubleheader against Seattle and combined with Otero and Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...combined on a shutout in each of his first three starts...tossed 5.0 innings in each of the three shutouts and allowed three hits or fewer each time...joins Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...won all three starts for the first and only winning streak of his career...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings May 25 at Toronto...was 4-1 with a 0.94 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first 12 games through May 20...then went 1-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his next five starts before fracturing his right hand June 16...tossed 5.1 innings May 30 against Los Angeles (AL), which was his first outing over 5.0 innings since July 27, 2012 against Cincinnati...that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings pitched or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914...finished May with a 4-1 record, a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 5 at New York (AL) and June 10 at Los Angeles (AL)...that snapped a streak of 24 consecutive starts dating back to July 15, 2012 in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak in the majors since at least 1914...fractured his right wrist following his start June 16 against Texas and was placed on the 15-day DL the next day...made one rehab start with Sacramento before he was reinstated and optioned to Sacramento July 13...returned to Oakland Aug. 27 and started that day at Houston...was optioned to Single-A Beloit the next day but did not appear in a game before returning to Oakland Sept. 2 when the Snappers season concluded.

RHP Sonny Gray (2-0, 1.91 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 1.91 ERA over his first four starts and is now 6-1 with a 1.99 ERA in nine career starts in April...ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (28.1) and ninth in ERA...is 2-0 with a 0.81 ERA in three starts against American League West competition...is now 14-5 with a 2.11 ERA in 25 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA in 24 games against everyone else...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-2 A's win at Los Angeles last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA (44.0 ip, 30 h, 13 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 43 so, 4 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts, against Los Angeles...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four spring starts...went 14-10 with a 3.08 ERA in 33 starts with the A's last year.
