## OAKLAND NOTES

- The **Oakland Athletics** have lost four straight and five of the last six games to fall to a season-high four games under .500...have not been four games under .500 since July 1, 2012 (38-42)...are 0-7 in day games, and are the only Major League team without a win in a day game...are 0-3 on this six-game homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (three games).
- The A's have committed 10 errors in their last seven games and have 20 for the season.
- Drew Pomeranz pitched 5.0 innings for the third consecutive start...0-2 with a 6.05 ERA (19.1 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 13 er, 7 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Houston.
- Ryan Cook made his season debut...he pitched a scoreless inning with one strikeout.
- Billy Butler (1 for 4, 2b) snapped an 0 for 10 hitless streak with a double in the fifth inning.
- Ike Davis (1 for 3, 2 r, 2b) is on a five-game hitting streak...is 19 for 49 (.388) over his last 15 games after going 1 for 9 (.111) over his first three contests.
- Brett Lawrie (1 for 3, 3 rbi, r) snapped an 0 for 10 hitless streak with a single in the fourth inning.
- Josh Reddick (1 for 4, r, rbi, 3b) is on a five-game hitting streak...is 12 for 26 (.462) over his last eight games after going 4 for 20 over is first five contests... hit his 18th career triple in the second inning, his first since Sep. 28, 2014 against Texas.
- Eric Sogard (1 for 4) is on a five-game hitting streak...is 7 for 20 (.350) over that span.
- Bob Melvin was ejected by home plate umpire Quinn Wolcott in the fourth inning.

## HOUSTON NOTES

- The Houston Astros are 11-7 through 18 games, their best start since the 2006 club went 12-5 to start the season...had their two-game winning streak snapped...are 5-1 on this nine-game road trip to Seattle (2-1), Oakland (3-0) and San Diego (three games).
- Asher Wojciechowski made his fourth career Major League appearance, his third start...has pitched 4.0 innings in each of his four appearances.
- Jose Altuve (2 for 5, 2 r) has a 29-game hitting streak (47 for 125, .376) against Oakland dating back to Sept. 5, 2013...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest hitting streak by any Astros player against any single team...it is the second longest hitting streak by any player against the A's franchise... recorded his fourth consecutive multiple hit game and eighth of the season.
- Chris Carter (1 for 4) is on a five game hitting streak...is 6 for 18 (.333) with a home run, three RBI and four runs scored over that span.
- Jason Castro (0 for 3, r) is 0 for his last 10.
- Marwin Gonzalez (1 for 4, 2b) is on a seven game hitting streak...is 8 for 27 (.296) over that span...has hit safely in all seven games played this season.
