LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels open a six-game Bay Area road trip to **Oakland** (April 28-30) and **San Francisco** (May 1-3)...Halos are in a stretch of playing in **California** for 25 consecutive days (April 20-May 14; two home stands and one road trip)...LAA went 4-3 on the seven-game home stand vs. **Oakland** (2-2) and **Texas** (2-1)...Halos have won three of last four games...Following this trip, Angels will host a nine-game homestand vs. **Seattle** (May 4-6), **Houston** (May 7-10) and **Colorado** (May 12-13).

FAST FACT: **Erick Aybar** is batting .339 (77/227) in his career at **O.Co Coliseum** – T4th best all-time (min .120 PA).

MIRROR IMAGES: Since 2002, the **Angels** and **A's** have faced off 253 times (LAA leads 127-126)...In the same span, the **Angels** (6 times) or **Athletics** (5 times) have won 11 of the 13 A.L. West crowns (STATS LLC).

IN WEAVER WE TRUST: **Jered Weaver** has gone 7-2 with a 1.79 ERA in his last 11 starts against the Athletics...For the first time in his career, **Weaver** is winless thru his first four starts of a season.

STARTING STRONG: Over the last six games, Angels' starting pitching has gone 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (36 IP – 6 ER) and 30 strikeouts...**Angels have held opponents to three runs or fewer in nine games thus far (9-0 to lead MLB - STATS LLC).**

HOT KOLE: **Kole Calhoun** has tallied 18 hits in his last 45 at-bats (.400) including a double, triple, three home runs and nine RBI...He has hit safely in his last four games (8-for-17; .470 over that span).

THIS N' THAT: **Mike Trout** is second in A.L. with 16 runs (has led A.L. in runs each of last three seasons)...His go-ahead HR in 7th inning Sunday marked eighth time in his career to hit a game-tying or go-ahead home run in the seventh inning or later career (twice this season)...Thru 19 games in 2014, **David Freese** tallied nine hits, one double, one home run and five RBI...Thru 19 games in 2015, owns 16 hits, four doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI...**Since 2011, Huston Street has converted 133 of his 143 save chances for 93%, tops in MLB in span (7 for 7 in 2015).**

OFFENSE SLOWED: Angels have been limited to three runs or less in six last nine games and in 11 of 19 overall tilts...**Club led MLB is runs in 2014 (773).**

PUJOLS' PURSUIT: **Albert Pujols'** 523 career HRs have put him in sole possession of 18th all-time passing **Ted Williams, Willie McCovey & Frank Thomas** (521)...17th on the all-time list is **Jimmie Foxx** (534 HRs)...**Pujols** is also 23rd all-time with 564 doubles...**Ivan Rodriguez** (572) sits in 22nd place on doubles list...According to STATSPASS, passed **Goose Goslin** (1,609 RBI) April 13th for the 32nd-most RBI all-time...31st on the list with 1,623 RBI is **Chipper Jones (Pujols at 1,612).**

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured skipper in the Majors (16th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club (**one of four all-time to win at least 1,300 games with original club as manager**)...His current .547 (1,340-1109) winning percentage and 1,340 wins are both tops in franchise history...He is one of 15 former catchers currently managing in the Majors.

@ OAKLAND: These clubs will meet 19 times this season...**2015 series is knotted at 2-2...Angels have won nine of last 12 overall games, two of last three in Oaktown**...Halos claimed 2014 series 10-9 (3-6 on road, 7-3 at home)...Snapped a streak of three straight season series losses to A's (2011-2013)...Halos have also won nine of last 12 games vs. A's at Angel Stadium...In final t home series vs. Oakland in 2014 (8/28-31), Halos completed first four-game sweep over A's since July 10-13, 1997 in Oakland...**Since 2008, LAA leads series 70-67**...Since 2002, the **Angels and A's** are nearly deadlocked (**Angels lead 127-126**)...**Trout** has five HRs and 13 RBI over his last 20 games vs. **Oakland**.

ONE HIT WONDER: Last Thursday's 2-0 shutout win over **Oakland** marked just the third time in club history the Angels won with one hit; first time since June 16, 1986 vs. **Texas** (**Charlie Hough** held Angels hitless through eight innings, only to lose in ninth on a three-base error, **Wally Joyner's** game-tying single, and a pair of passed balls – **ELIAS**)...Halos' lone hit Thursday came on a two-run HR off the bat of **Kole Calhoun** in the third frame...**Calhoun joins former A.L. MVP Zoilo Versalles as only players in MLB history to have a two-run home run as his team's only hit in a victory (since 1914).**

Since 2011, is 10-3 with a 1.67 ERA (113.1 IP – 21 ER) in 16 starts vs. A's

- Making fifth start of the season tonight and third on the road...Second consecutive start vs. Oakland.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in last start Wednesday vs. A's after allowing one earned run on eight hits across six innings pitched with no walks and three strikeouts.
- **NO WALKING:** Weaver has not allowed a walk in three of his four starts this season...Joins **Jason Hammel** (CHC) and **Bartolo Colon** (NYM) as only pitchers in the Majors to have three starts without walking a batter in 2015.
- **WINNING OUT WEST:** Owns a 45-30 career record and 3.15 ERA (676.1 IP – 237 ER) against A.L. West opponents...Since 2006, the 45 wins vs. A.L. West clubs rank second to **Felix Hernandez** (46).
- Is winless through first four starts of a season for first time in career...Lost each of first two starts in a season for third time in career (also, 2007 & 2014).
- On April 17, became fifth pitcher since 2006 to toss at least 1,700 innings while pitching exclusively with one franchise (joining **Felix Hernandez**, **Justin Verlander**, **Cole Hamels** and **Matt Cain**).
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 31 career starts against Oakland, is 13-9 with a 2.46 ERA (204.2 IP – 56 ER)... In four starts last season vs. Athletics, went 2-2 with a 4.32 ERA (25 IP – 12 ER)...Pitched six innings and allowed one run on eight hits in first start of season vs. A's on Wednesday...Since 2011, has gone 10-3 with a 1.67 ERA (113.1 IP – 21 ER) in 16 starts vs. Oakland...His **2.46 career ERA vs. Athletics is sixth lowest in MLB (min. 200 IP) since 1914 (STATS LLC)**.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** Owns a 6-5 lifetime record and 3.47 ERA (103.2 IP – 40 ER) in 16 career starts at the Coliseum...In last six road starts against the A's, is **4-1 with a 2.49 ERA (43.1 IP – 12 ER)**...Made two starts in Oakland last season and went 1-1 with a 5.68 ERA (12.2 IP – 8 ER).
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made his seventh career Opening Day start on April 6 and sixth in a row for the Angels...Both are franchise records...Only other pitcher in Angels history to make at least five Opening Day starts is **Mike Witt**, who took the hill on Opening Day for the Halos each year from 1985-89...Since 2006, Weaver's seven Opening Day starts are tied for third most in the Majors...Only **CC Sabathia** (9) and **Felix Hernandez** (8) have more.
- **2014 REGULAR SEASON:** Finished the 2014 regular season with an 18-9 record and 3.59 ERA (213.1 IP – 85 ER) with 169 strikeouts in 34 starts.
- **2014 LEAGUE LEADER RANKINGS:** Tied for the American League lead in wins and starts, ranked ninth in innings pitched and T9th in winning percentage.
- **2014 POSTSEASON:** Did not factor in the decision in only postseason start after tossing seven innings and allowing two runs on three hits in Game 1 of the ALDS vs. Kansas City.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Has compiled a career regular season 131-71 record with 12 complete games, six shutouts and a 3.31 ERA...Owns the top winning percentage in franchise history at **.649 (min. 100 decisions)**.
- **ANGELS ALL-TIME RANKINGS:** Is third on the Angels all-time lists in wins (131) and strikeouts (1417) and ranks fourth all-time in starts (269) and innings pitched (1710.1).

#48 JOSE ALVAREZ (LHP) 2014 (Minors): .188 vs. LH, .338 vs. RH AGE: 25

- Charged with the loss on Sunday afternoon vs. Texas after allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits in two innings pitched...First big league loss since Sept. 27, 2013 for Detroit at Miami.
- **Leads the Majors with four batters hit by pitch this season...Became the fifth reliever since 1914 with 4+ HBP through his teams' first 18 games...Only reliever with more was Grover Lowdermilk (5 HBP in 1919 St. Louis Browns first 18 games).**
- Made three appearances on last homestand, tossing 5.2 innings.
- Tossed three shutout innings last Monday night vs. Oakland and retired nine of 10 batters faced (one walk)...Matched longest relief outing of career (also, 3 IP on Sept. 9, 2013 for Detroit at Chicago White Sox).
- Had a HBP in three straight games from April 10-14...Third reliever in Angels history to do so, joining **Mel Queen** (1971) and **Hector Carrasco** (2006).

#68 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP) 2014: .350 vs. LH, .225 vs. RH AGE: 23

- Made season debut with Angels Tuesday night vs. Oakland and had two scoreless innings pitched...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on Tuesday afternoon.
- Has allowed one earned run in seven career innings pitched vs. A's (1.29 ERA).
- In four games with Salt Lake, tossed eight shutout innings, allowing six hits with no walks and 13 strikeouts.
- Appeared in 17 games across five stints with Angels last season, going 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (19.1 IP – 14 ER).
- Pitched in five Spring Training games with Angels this year...Allowed three earned runs in first outing (March 7 at Oakland)...Tossed five shutout frames across last four appearances.
- **Enters 2015 ranked as Angels #3 prospect according to Baseball America.**

- Has stranded five of six inherited runners this season.

- Started the year with four-straight scoreless outings (began 2014 with eight-consecutive scoreless appearances).

- Has stranded 10 of 11 inherited runners in 2015.

- Pitched in four games on last homestand, allowing three runs across 4.2 innings pitched...Worked one scoreless inning in each of last two appearances.
- Charged with the loss Wednesday night vs. A's after allowing two earned runs on one hit in 0.2 innings pitched.
- Has not allowed a run in three games (3 IP) on the road in 2015.
