ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high four-game losing streak last night...have lost five of the last seven games...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 4½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third

and two days in fourth...were swept for the first time this year last weekend by Houston.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole two bases last night and are now a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts for the season...are one of two teams in the majors without a caught stealing (Mets, 10 sb)...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught is the longest such streak in Athletics history...seven of the A's 13 stolen bases have come against the Angels.

IN APRIL: The A's are 9-12 in April with two games remaining...will finish with a losing record in April for the first time since 2012 (10-12)...have finished the month of April more than two games under .500 just once in the last 14 years (8-11 in 2009)...are batting .267 in April, which is currently their best average in the first month of the season since 2002 (.267).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-6 with a 3.02 ERA (42 er in 125.0 ip)...have the lowest ERA in the American League and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.67)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (125.0) and tied for second in wins (8)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 6-1 with a 1.67 ERA (15 er in 80.2 ip) in 12 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-5 with a 5.48 ERA (27 er in 44.1 ip) in nine starts... starters have eight of the A's nine wins and have a 0.95 ERA (6 er in 56.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.45 ERA (52 er in 105.0 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.43 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League... have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.345), third lowest on-base percentage (.292) and fourth lowest batting average (.224)... have a 0.78 ERA (7 er in 81.0 ip) in their nine wins, a 5.42 ERA (65 er in 108.0 ip) in their 12 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .240 (105-for-438) with 51 runs scored (3.9 per game) over the last 13 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .267 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in triples (7) and rank fourth in doubles (37)...are batting .316 (60-for-190) with runners in scoring position, which is the best mark in the AL and third best in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in walks (2), rank second in hits (5) and tied for third in RBI (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in six of the last eight games (10 errors total) and have 20 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Washington, 23)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is twice as many as any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 0-4 in one-run games and 0-4 in two-run games...are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...the eight combined losses in one and two run games are tied with Miami for the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more...have been out-scored 79-34 in their 12 losses (6.6 to 2.8) and have out-scored the opposition 68-8 in their nine wins (7.6 to 0.9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their five-game home losing streak with a 6-2 win last night...have not put together back-to-back wins at home this year...are 1-3 on this six-game homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-0) and are 4-7 at home for the season...that is the third

worst home record in the American League and matches the A's worst home start over the last 14 years (also 4-7 in 2012, 2009 and 2004)...leave following the game tomorrow for their second 10-game road trip of the season to Texas (three games), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-7 during day games compared to 9-5 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the most day losses in the majors...have the third best night record in the American League...are batting .245 (60 for 245) with 23 runs scored during the day (3.29 per game) compared to .278 (136 for 490) with 79 runs scored at night (5.64 per game)...have hit all 17 of their home runs at night...have a 2.81 ERA (39 er in 125.0 ip) at night, 4.64 (33 er in 64.0 ip) during the day...have surrendered six home runs in 14 night games compared to 12 in seven day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their fastest game of the season last night at 2 hours and 6 minutes...are averaging 2 hours and 52 minutes per game, which is the second quickest mark in the American League (Toronto, 2:51)...won for the first time this year last night when the opponent scores first...improved to 5-2 in the first game of a series with a win last night but are 0-6 in the final game of a series...are 0-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 8-8 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .284 (165-for-581) with 16 of their 17 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .201 (31-for-154) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games...are tied with Cincinnati for the most extra inning losses in the majors and have the second most extra inning games in the American League...are 0-8 when they are out-homered and 0-7 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last Thursday...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...won the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a four-game series at Anaheim last week...lost the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have been shutout in four of their last 11 games against the Angels...are 44-37 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 36-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 21 of their last 29 losses, including 11 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 409-333 against the Angels...that includes 212-156 in Oakland and 197-177 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 458-410 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dan Otero has not allowed a run in 14 career games against Los Angeles (20.2 ip)...**Josh Reddick** is 14-for-30 (.467) with two home runs and nine RBI over his last nine games after going 4-for-20 (.200) over his first five contests...**Evan Scribner** struck out the side in the ninth inning last night and is tied for fifth among AL relievers in strikeouts (14).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.12 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start as an Athletic, his first since April 18...missed his last turn in the rotation on April 23 due to a blister...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying seven hits...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

LAST START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts...also started in a minor league game April 1...allowed just run one in 10.1 innings over his final two starts (0.87 ERA) after logging a 6.14 ERA over his first three appearances...opponents batted .265 (18-for-68).

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 4-0 record and a 2.56 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA in seven starts on five

days rest or more...had a 2.14 ERA over the first five innings of a game, 6.75 from the sixth inning on...the Padres were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments..

MORE WITH SAN DIEGO: Was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time June 3 and made his ML debut that evening against Pittsburgh (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...was the losing pitcher in a 4-1 decision and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day... recalled for the second time June 14 and went 5-1 with a 1.46 ERA in six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...singled in the fourth inning off Zack Wheeler June 14 at New York (NL) for his first Major League hit...went 2-for-22 (.091) with a RBI as a hitter...struck out a career-high nine batters in 5.0 innings June 30 against Cincinnati, including a stretch of seven consecutive outs recorded via strikeout...became the first Padres pitcher since Jake Peavy on Aug. 27, 2007 to record seven consecutive outs via strikeout and the first Padres rookie to accomplish this feat since at least 1974...was 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in five starts in June...the wins tied for the most in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher (eighth time, first since Kevin Walker in August of 2000)...the opponents average was second lowest of any qualifying rookie pitcher in any month in Padres history, behind only the .188 mark put up by Eric Nolte in August of 1987...his ERA was 10th lowest by a rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history (min 25.0 IP) and the low est since Justin Germano posted a 1.08 ERA in May 2007...recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3-30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...according to Stats Inc., his 36 strikeouts tied for eighth most by a NL pitcher through his first five career games since the start of the 1914 season, behind only Stephen Strasburg's 48 in 2010, Kerry Wood's 45 in 1998, Mark Prior's 43 in 2002, Jose DeLeon's 43 in 1983, Hideo Nomo's 40 in 1995, Gary Nolan's 39 in 1967 and Burt Hooton's 38 in 1971-72...then went 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts in July... allowed a .172 batting average and .230 slugging percentage, which were the lowest in franchise history during the month of July...was recalled the third time July 25 and went 2-1 with a 3.99 ERA in five starts before being optioned to San Antonio Aug. 19...won at Atlanta July 25, giving him four wins in his first four starts on the road...that was the longest such careeropening streak in Padres history...picked up his seventh win of the season in his ninth start on July 30 against St. Louis...his seven wins through nine career appearances were the most in Padres franchise history and tied for the third most by a Major League pitcher since the 1914 season, behind only Boston's Boo Ferriss in 1945 and Chicago-AL's John Whitehead in 1935, both of which had eight wins through nine career starts...allowed a sixth inning home run to Kennys Vargas Aug. 5 at Minnesota, snapping a 55.0-inning homerless streak dating back to June 14...it was the fourth longest homerless streak by a rookie in Padres history, trailing Dave Freisleben in 1974 (66.0 ip), Rick Sawyer in 1976 (60.2 ip) and Frank Seminara in 1992 (60.0 ip)...recalled for the final time Aug. 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever...appeared in just two games (5.40 ERA) and did not pitch after Sept. 6.

SAN ANTONIO: Spent the balance of the season pitching for Double-A San Antonio where he was 2-1 with a 1.91 ERA in 13 games, including 10 starts...yielded just one home run in 42.1 innings...allowed a .221 opponents batting average, including .169 (13-for-77) against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (21-for-77) against left-handers...surrendered just one extra base hit, a double, to righties for a .182 slugging percentage... opponents hit .194 with runners on base...allowed a .289 average to batters leading off an inning...compiled a 4.50 ERA in the first inning, a 1.11 ERA from the second inning on...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 10 starts...went 1-0 and did not allow a run over his first three appearances, all in relief (7.2 ip)...his final 10 outings came as a starter...was 2-1 with a 2.20 ERA in 10 games, seven starts, when San Diego called for the first time June 3...pitched just once during each of his final three minor league stints...had a no decision June 9 at Corpus Christi (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...was optioned to El Paso July 11 but did not pitch before being transferred to San Antonio for a July 21 start against Corpus Christi (2.0 ip. 1 bb. 2 so)...was sent back to El Paso July 22 and he was recalled by the Padres July 25...made his final minor league start Aug. 26 against Midland (2.0 ip, 3 so).

CAREER: Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2014...had not pitched above Single-A before starting the 2014 season at Double-A San Antonio...is 6-4 with a 2.26 ERA (41 er in 163.1 ip) and .215 (131-for-608) opponents batting average in 47 games, 44 starts, in three seasons in the minors...has allowed just two home runs in 163.1 innings...was originally drafted by Tampa Bay in the sixth round of the 2010 draft but missed his first two professional seasons after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery... was traded to the Padres in a seven-player deal prior to the 2014 season and was dealt to the A's in a four-player trade following the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
