**LEADING OFF:** Tonight the Angels play the second game (0-1) of a six-game Bay Area road trip to **Oakland** (April 28-30; 0-1) and **San Francisco** (May 1-3)...Halos are in a stretch of 25 consecutive days in **California** (April 20-May 14)...LAA went 4-3 on the seven-game homestand vs. **Oakland** (2-2) and **Texas** (2-1)...Following this trip, Angels will host a nine-game home stand vs. **Seattle** (May 4-6), **Houston** (May 7-10) and **Colorado** (May 12-13).

**WESTERN WAYS:** RHP Matt Shoemaker is 9-1 with a 3.11 ERA (72.1 IP – 25 ER) in 11 career starts vs. A.L. West foes...His only A.L. West loss came in his last start (4/20/15 vs. **OAK**; 3 IP, 7 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR).

**FAST FACT:** Erick Aybar is batting .339 (78/230) in his career at **O.Co Coliseum** – T4th best all-time (min .120 PA).

**MIRROR IMAGES:** Since 2002, the **Angels** and **A's** have faced off 254 times with each team winning half (127-127)...In the same span, the **Angels** (6 times) or **Athletics** (5 times) have won 11 of the 13 A.L. West crowns (STATS LLC).

**HOT KOLE:** Kole Calhoun has tallied 18 hits in his last 48 at-bats (.375) including a double, triple, three home runs and nine RBI.

**GAME OF CRON:** On Sunday, C.J. Cron's four hits set a single-game career-high...He has recorded eight hits in his 14 at-bats and has three doubles his last six games.

**OFFENSE SLOWED:** Angels have been limited to three runs or fewer in seven of last 10 games and in 12 of 20 overall tilts...2015 team OPS of .639 ranks 25<sup>th</sup> in MLB (13<sup>th</sup> in A.L.)...Halos ranked fourth in A.L. with a .728 team OPS in 2014 and led all of baseball with 773 runs scored last season... Halos were also only team in 2014 with nine 'regulars' with a .700+ OPS.

**ABOUT FACE:** Thru 20 games in 2014, David Freese tallied nine hits, one double, one home run and five RBI...Thru 20 games in 2015, owns 16 hits, four doubles, four home runs and a team-leading 15 RBI.

**PUJOLS' PURSUIT:** Albert Pujols' 523 career HRs have put him in sole possession of 18th all-time passing **Ted Williams, Willie McCovey & Frank Thomas** (521)...17<sup>th</sup> on the all-time list is **Jimmie Foxx** (534 HRs)...**Pujols** is also 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 564 doubles...**Ivan Rodriguez** (572) sits in 22<sup>nd</sup> place on doubles list...According to STATSPASS, passed **Goose Goslin** (1,609 RBI) April 13<sup>th</sup> for the 32nd-most RBI all-time...31<sup>st</sup> on the list with 1,623 RBI is **Chipper Jones** (Pujols at 1,612).

**THE MANAGER:** Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured skipper in the Majors (16<sup>th</sup> season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club (one of four all-time to win at least 1,300 games with original club as manager)...His current .547 (1,340-1109) winning percentage and 1,340 wins are both tops in franchise history...He is one of 15 former catchers currently managing in the Majors.

**@ OAKLAND:** A's lead 2015 season series 3-2...**Angels have won nine of last 13 overall games**...Halos claimed 2014 series 10-9 (3-6 on road, 7-3 at home)...Snapped a streak of three straight season series losses to A's (2011-2013)...Halos have won nine of last 12 games vs. A's at Angel Stadium...In final home series vs. Oakland in 2014 (8/28-31), Halos completed first four-game sweep over A's since July 10-13, 1997 in Oakland...**Since 2008, LAA leads series 70-68**...Since 2002, the **Angels** and **A's** are deadlocked over 254 games (127-127)...**Trout** has five HRs and 13 RBI over his last 20 games vs. Oakland...**ONE HIT WONDER:** Last Thursday's 2-0 shutout win over **Oakland** marked just the third time in club history the Angels won with one hit.

**ON DECK: @ SF:** Angels have won last four games at AT&T Park (first meeting here since 2009; LAA sweep)...**Halos have won six of last seven games vs. Giants** (last met in 2012 with Angels taking two of three at home)...The Rally Monkey debuted in a comeback win vs. SF on June 6, 2000...LAA is 11-14 all-time vs. SF (6-8 on road).

**BACK TO INTERLEAGUE:** The Halos play a weekend set at **San Francisco** for their initial Interleague matchup of 2015...Club went 12-8 during IL in 2014, seventh winning mark vs. N.L. in last eight seasons.

**THIS N' THAT:** Angels have held opponents to three runs or fewer in nine games thus far (9-0 to lead MLB; STATS LLC)...**Mike Trout** ranks third in A.L. with 16 runs (has led A.L. in runs each of last three seasons)...**Trout's** go-ahead HR in 7th inning Sunday marked eighth time in his career to hit a game-tying or go-ahead home run in the seventh inning or later career (twice this season)...Since 2011, **Huston Street** has converted 133 of his 143 save chances for 93%, tops in MLB in span (7 for 7 in 2015)...**Trout's** 29.4 WAR (per Baseball-Reference) is the sixth-highest total ever for any player through his age-23 season.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER

**2-1, 6.46 ERA**

*Owns a 9-1 record across 11 career road starts with 53 strikeouts and nine walks*

- Reinstated from bereavement list prior to today's game...Missed last start after being placed on the bereavement list on April 22.
- Making fourth start of the season and third on the road...Second consecutive start vs. A's...Is in third Major League season (second full year) with Angels...Began season in the Major League starting rotation for first time in career.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with first loss of the season in last start on April 20 vs. A's...Allowed five earned runs on seven hits across 3+ innings while walking three and striking out two...The 3 IP marked shortest start of career...Marked second start of career with more walks than strikeouts.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** Has won six consecutive decisions on the road and owns a 9-1 career record across 13 appearances (11 starts) away from The Big A...Since 1914, only **Whitey Ford** (9-0 record in 1950-53) had a better road record through his first 11 career road starts (min. 8 decisions, STATS LLC)
- **STREAKING:** Had career-best streak of winning nine consecutive decisions snapped in last start on April 20 vs. Oakland...During that span, was 9-0 with a 1.92 ERA (61 IP – 13 ER) across 10 games (nine starts), dating back to August 9, 2014.
- **GOOD START:** Shoemaker owns a 16-4 career record as a starter...The .800 winning-percentage through his first 24 career starts is the second highest mark in Angels history...The best win percentage by an Angels pitcher through his first 24 career starts is .813 (13-3) by **Joe Saunders**. (STATS LLC).
- **DO NOT WALK:** Has issued one-or-fewer walks in 16 of 24 career starts, including two of three this season...Has nine starts with zero walks allowed.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In three career games (two starts) against the A's, is 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 IP – 5 ER)...Took the loss in first start vs. Oakland this season on April 20 after allowing five earned runs across three innings pitched...Had pitched 7.1 shutout innings against Athletics across first two appearances.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** Today marks first career appearance at the Coliseum...In seven career road games (five starts) at A.L. West division ballparks, is 5-0 with a 4.32 ERA (33.1 IP – 16 ER).
- **SELECT COMPANY:** Became one of 11 pitchers all-time to earn at least 18 wins through his first 30 career games.
- **2014 REGULAR SEASON:** Finished the 2014 regular season with a 16-4 record and 3.04 ERA (136 IP – 46 ER) with 124 strikeouts in 27 games (20 starts)...His **.800 winning percentage led the American League (min. 15 decisions)**...The 16 wins tie Hall-of-Famer **Tom Seaver** for the most in a season by a non-drafted, U.S. born rookie among players beginning their professional careers in the draft era... In final 14 games (12 starts) of the regular season, went 11-2 with a 2.09 ERA (82 IP – 19 ER).
- **ROOKIE RECORDS:** Finished second in 2014 American League Rookie of the Year voting behind **Jose Abreu**...Led all Major League rookies with 16 victories last season...The 16 wins also established a new Angels rookie record.
- **2014 POSTSEASON:** Started Game 2 of the 2014 ALDS for Angels vs. Kansas City...Did not factor in the decision after allowing one earned run on five hits across six innings pitched...First pitcher in club history to allow one-or-fewer runs in first career playoff start.

### #48 JOSE ALVAREZ (LHP) 2014 (Minors): .188 vs. LH, .338 vs. RH AGE: 25

- Charged with the loss on Sunday afternoon vs. Texas after allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits in two innings pitched...First big league loss since Sept. 27, 2013 for Detroit at Miami.
- **Leads the Majors with four batters hit by pitch this season...Became the fifth reliever since 1914 with 4+ HBP through his teams' first 18 games...Only reliever with more was Grover Lowdermilk (5 HBP in 1919 St. Louis Browns first 18 games).**
- Made three appearances on last homestand, tossing 5.2 innings.
- Tossed three shutout innings last Monday night vs. Oakland and retired nine of 10 batters faced (one walk)...Matched longest relief outing of career (also, 3 IP on Sept. 9, 2013 for Detroit at Chicago White Sox).
- Had a HBP in three straight games from April 10-14...Third reliever in Angels history to do so, joining **Mel Queen** (1971) and **Hector Carrasco** (2006).

### #64 MIKE MORIN (RHP) 2014: .283 vs. LH, .181 vs. RH AGE: 23

- Made four appearances on last homestand, tossing 3.1 innings...Allowed a season-high three earned runs Wednesday night vs. A's.
- Nine of 24 career earned runs allowed have come vs. Oakland.
- Has stranded five of six inherited runners this season.
