OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-13) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (10-11)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and are season-low four games under .500 for the second time this year (8-12 on April 26)...have not been five games under .500 since June 30, 2012 (37-42)...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 5½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third and three days in fourth...snapped their season-high four-game losing streak Tuesday night...were swept for the first time this year last weekend by Houston.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-7 during day games compared to 9-6 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the second most day losses in the majors (Minnesota, 8)...have the third best night record in the American League...the A's seven-game losing streak in day games is their longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are batting .245 (60 for 245) with 23 runs scored during the day (3.29 per game) compared to .274 (144 for 525) with 82 runs scored at night (5.47 per game)...have hit all 17 of their home runs at night...have a 4.64 ERA (33 er in 64.0 ip) during the day, 3.02 (45 er in 134.0 ip) at night...have surrendered seven home runs in 15 night games compared to 12 in seven day games.

IN APRIL: The A's are 9-13 in April with one game remaining...will finish with a losing record in April for the first time since 2012 (10-12)...have finished the month of April more than two games under .500 just once in the last 14 years (8-11 in 2009) and have not finished more than three games under .500 since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...are currently 5½ games out of first place...this will mark the eighth time since divisional play began in 1969 that the A's will finish April more than four games out of first (most recent: 6½ in 2012)...the offense has walked just 62 times this month...the fewest walks in Oakland history in an April with at least 20 games is 65 in 1970 and 1973.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this six-game homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-1) and are 4-8 at home for the season...that is the third worst home record in the American League and matches the A's worst home start over the last 14 years (2009)...with a loss today, the A's would match the worst home start in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...snapped their five-game home losing streak with a 6-2 win Tuesday...have not put together back-to-back wins at home this year...leave following the game today for their second 10-game road trip of the season to Texas (three games), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-6 with a 3.12 ERA (45 er in 130.0 ip)...have the lowest ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (130.0) and tied for third in wins (8)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 6-1 with a 1.89 ERA (18 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-5 with a 5.48 ERA (27 er in 44.1 ip) in nine starts...starters have eight of the A's nine wins and have a 0.95 ERA (6 er in 56.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.58 ERA (58 er in 114.0 ip) over the last 13 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.55 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.225) and slugging percentage (.346)...have a 0.78 ERA (7 er in 81.0 ip) in their nine wins, a 5.46 ERA (71 er in 117.0 ip) in their 13 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .239 (113-for-473) with 54 runs scored (3.9 per game) over the last 14 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .265 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in triples (7) and tied for third in doubles (41)...are batting .308 (62-for-201) with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts and are one of two teams without a caught stealing (Mets, 10 sb)...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught is the longest such streak in Athletics history...seven of the A's 13 stolen bases have come against the Angels.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in the last nine games and have 20 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 21)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is twice as many as any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 0-4 in one-run games and 0-4 in two-run games...are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...the eight combined losses in one and two run games are tied with Miami for the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more...have been out-scored 85-37 in their 13 losses (6.5 to 2.8) and have out-scored the opposition 68-8 in their nine wins (7.6 to 0.9).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-6 in the final game of a series compared to 5-2 in the first game of a series...are 0-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 8-9 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .280 (172-for-615) with 16 of their 17 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .206 (32-for-155) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games...are tied with Cincinnati for the most extra inning losses in the majors and have the second most extra inning games in the AL...are 0-9 when they are out-homered and 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 23...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The season series is even at three games each...have split the first two games in Oakland after splitting a four-game series at Anaheim last week...lost the season series last year, 10-9...it marked the first time the A's lost the season series to the Angels since 2010...went 6-3 in Oakland and 3-7 in Anaheim...won eight of the first 11 games and then lost seven of the final eight contests...have been shutout in four of their last 12 games against the Angels...are 44-38 against the Angels over the last five seasons...including 36-5 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 21 of their last 30 losses, including 11 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 409-334 against the Angels...that includes 212-157 in Oakland and 197-177 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 458-411 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dan Otero has not allowed a run in 15 career games against Los Angeles (21.2 ip)...**Josh Reddick** is 15-for-33 (.455) with two home runs and 10 RBI over his last 10 games...**Marcus Semien** is 12-for-29 (.414) with five multiple hit games over his last seven games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1937** Duke All-American football star Ace Parker hits a pinch hit home run in his first major league at bat...he would later be elected to the Football Hall of Fame...in **1969** Rick Monday's third inning grand slam at California gives him at least one RBI in a club record 10 consecutive games...he finishes with five RBI on the day and drives in 18 runs during the streak...in **2000** Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run...in **2005** Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-1, 0.71 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the bullpen...did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...will remain in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville on Sunday.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 0-1 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) in his one start...did not allow a run in four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...is now 8-9 with a 3.78 ERA (59 er in 140.1 ip) in 24 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances...began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...had made just two career starts entering 2014.

IN APRIL: Is 0-1 with a 0.71 ERA (1 er in 12.2 ip) and .136 (6-for-44) opponents batting average in five games this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins...ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-1 with a 1.60 ERA (9 er in 50.2 ip) in 11 games, seven starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.38 (20 er in 75.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

CHAVEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-4 with a 3.57 ERA (35.1 ip, 31 h, 20 r, 14 er, 8 bb, 30 so, 5 hr) in 14 career appearances, including three starts...is 1-1 with a 7.88 ERA (7 er in 8.0 ip) in five games in his home ballparks and 0-3 with a 2.30 ERA (7 er in 27.1 ip) in nine games in Anaheim...is 0-2 with a 2189 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in his three starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his only appearance this year, a start a week ago today at Los Angeles (see last start above)...went 0-1 with a 2.57 ERA in five games, including two starts, last year...had a no decision in his first start, a 3-2 A's win at Los Angeles April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts...then took the loss in a 4-1 decision at Los Angeles (AL) June 9...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Trout sacrifice fly, an Ibanez RBI single and a Trout RBI double...also faced the Angels in relief on Aug. 24 in Oakland (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so) and Aug. 29 (1.0 ip) and Aug. 31 (4.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so) at Anaheim.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA in six games, five starts...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a home run in 22.0 innings...opponents batted .333 (27-for-89)...is now 8-1 with a 2.68 ERA (15 er in 50.1 ip) in 13 games, 10 starts, over the last two springs.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .247 (78-for-316) against left-handed hitters compared to .260 (64-for-246) against right-handers...allowed 17 home runs, 12 of which were solo shots...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that...yielded a .208 average with RISP and two outs...opponents reached base on an error eight times, which tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed a .303 batting average over his first 15 pitches in game, .213 from pitches 16-60 and .281 after that...held the number six hitter to a .119 batting average, which was second lowest in the AL, but the number eight hitter batted .393, which was the highest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 15 games in Oakland compared to 3-6 with a 4.12 ERA in 17 games on the road...yielded just four home runs in 67.1 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 78.2 innings on the road.

DAYS REST: Was 6-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more, 2-5 with a 4.08 ERA in nine starts on four days rest...had a 1.13 ERA in three relief appearances on two days rest or fewer, 5.11 in eight appearances with three days rest or more

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a 7-6 record and a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...went 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games, two starts, after the break...now has a 3.70 ERA (103 er in 250.2 ip) in 114 career appearances before the break, 6.12 (97 er in 142.2 ip) in 114 outings after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Did not commit an error in 15 chances and has not made an error in 76 games and 32 chances in four seasons with the A's.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 5.80 runs of support as a starter, which ranked fourth highest in the AL at the time of his last start on July 28...the A's were 14-7 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his 21 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11 times...tossed at least one inning in nine of his 11 relief appearances, including three innings or more four times...went 0-for-3 with three strikeouts as a hitter and is 0-for-8 with eight strikeouts in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Scott Kazmir (2-0, 0.99 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his four starts...that matches the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...opponents are batting .232 with the bases empty compared to .051 with runners on base...are 1-for-17 (.059) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-9 with RISP and two outs...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings to Houston a week ago today in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...is 10-5 with a 3.12 ERA (112.2 ip, 104 h, 49 r, 39 er, 30 bb, 110 so, 9 hr) in 19 career starts against Texas...the 10 wins match his most against any team (Oakland)...was the winning pitcher in his only start against Texas this year, a 10-0 A's win on April 8 (7.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 10 so).

- Has allowed nine home runs, which are tied for the third in the American League...15 of 33 earned runs allowed this year have come via the home run (six solo homers, three three-run homers).
- The seven losses are the most in the majors, two more than any other club...relievers have been charged with the loss in seven of the A's last 11 defeats...Eric O'Flaherty and Tyler Clippard are two of just seven AL relievers with two losses.
