OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-14) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (7-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last seven games to fall five games under .500 for the first time since June 30, 2012 (37-42)...have not been six games under .500 since June 14, 2012 (29-35)...the 9-14 start matches the A's worst record after 23 games over the last 14 years...also went 9-14 in 2009 (lost game 24)...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 6½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third and four days in fourth...snapped their season-high four-game losing streak Tuesday night...were swept for the first time this year last weekend by Houston.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 (won west and 94 games) and 1979 (finished last and lost 108 games) and were 12 out in 2001 (won wild card and 102 games).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...are now 4-9 at home for the season, which matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have the third worst home record in the American League...begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a 10-game jaunt to Texas (three games), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last five games and are 1-2 with a 5.86 ERA (18 er in 27.2 ip) over that span...have a 3.27 ERA (49 er in 135.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (135.0) and tied for second in fewest home runs (10)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 6-1 with a 1.89 ERA (18 er in 85.2 ip) in 13 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-6 with a 5.66 ERA (31 er in 49.1 ip) in 10 starts...starters have eight of the A's nine wins and have a 0.95 ERA (6 er in 56.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.68 ERA (64 er in 123.0 ip) over the last 14 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.65 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.230) and slugging percentage (.349)...have a 0.78 ERA (7 er in 81.0 ip) in their nine wins, a 5.50 ERA (77 er in 126.0 ip) in their 14 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .241 (122-for-507) with 59 runs scored (3.9 per game) over the last 15 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .265 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...rank second in the AL in triples (7) and fourth in doubles (41)...are also tied for second in grounded into double plays (23)...are batting .310 (65-for-210) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts and are one of two teams without a caught stealing (Mets, 10 sb)...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught is the longest such streak in Athletics history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 10 games and have 21 for the season, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which

is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is twice as many as any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 0-5 in one-run games with the loss yesterday and are tied for the most one-run losses in the American League...are 0-4 in two-run games and are the only Major League team without a win in a game decided by one or two runs...the nine combined losses in one and two run games are the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more...have been out-scored 91-42 in their 14 losses (6.5 to 3.0) and have out-scored the opposition 68-8 in their nine wins (7.6 to 0.9).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-8 during day games compared to 9-6 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the most day losses in the majors (Minnesota)...are tied for the third best night record in the American League...the A's eight-game losing streak in day games is their longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are batting .247 (69 for 279) with 28 runs scored during the day (3.50 per game) compared to .274 (144 for 525) with 82 runs scored at night (5.47 per game)...have hit 17 of their 18 home runs at night...have a 4.81 ERA (39 er in 73.0 ip) during the day, 3.02 (45 er in 134.0 ip) at night...have surrendered seven home runs in 15 night games compared to 12 in eight day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-2 in the first game of a series compared to 0-7 in the final game of a series...are 0-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 8-10 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .279 (181-for-649) with 17 of their 18 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .206 (32-for-155) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games and are tied with Cincinnati for the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 23...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at two games each as the two clubs split a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...the A's lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 2-7 in Oakland and 7-3 in Texas...the seven losses at home were the most in Oakland history against the Rangers and the seven wins on the road matched the most in Oakland history against Texas (1972, 2003, 2005)...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years...are 58-60 over the last seven years...are 324-336 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 171-160 in Oakland and 153-176 in Texas...including 86-88 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 421-418 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick has an eight-game hitting streak (13-for-26, .500), which is one short of his career high...hit .368 in April, which was the best single-month batting average of his career and the sixth best April batting average in Oakland history (min. 50 PA)...**Marcus Semien** is 12-for-33 (.364) with five multiple hit games over his last eight games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991** Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in 1992 Rickey Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356th as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 0.99 ERA)

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Has started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his four starts...that matches the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014).

N APRIL: Went 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA ranks fourth in the American League...went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA over his first four starts last year (3-0, 1.62 ERA after five starts in 2014)...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April in 2014 and is now 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April over the last two seasons.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 30 strikeouts in 27.1 innings over his first four starts and is tied for seventh in the American League in strikeouts...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.211), third in batting average (.158) and seventh in on-base percentage (.238)...opponents are batting .232 (13-for-56) with the bases empty compared to .051 (2-for-39) with runners on base...are 1-for-17 (.059) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-9 with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are 2-for-51 (.039) with two strikes...last year, he ranked sixth in the AL among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number two (12 at bats), three (10) or seven (10) hitter this year.

HOME AND AWAY: Has tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home...is the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012)...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (3 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts on the road.

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston last Friday here in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th.

KAZMIR vs. TEXAS: Is 10-5 with a 3.12 ERA (112.2 ip, 104 h, 49 r, 39 er, 30 bb, 110 so, 9 hr) in 19 career starts...the 10 wins match his most against any team (Oakland)...is 6-3 with a 3.12 ERA (23 er in 66.1 ip) in 11 starts in Texas and 4-2 with a 3.11 ERA (16 er in 46.1 ip) in eight starts in his home ballparks, including 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (4 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in the Coliseum...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 10-0 A's win on April 8 in Oakland (see first start above)...went 3-1 with a 4.22 ERA (21.1 ip, 27 h, 13 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in four starts last year...the first win came in a 9-3 victory at Texas April 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...also picked up the win in another 9-3 victory at Texas July 27...blanked the Rangers on three hits over his final three innings...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on September 16...allowed a two-run home run to Smolinski and a RBI single to Robertson in the fourth and three runs, one earned, in the fifth...picked up his third win in a 6-2 A's victory at Texas Sept. 26...allowed a RBI double to Rua in the bottom of the first but the A's scored six unanswered runs to take a 6-1 lead.

2014 RECAP: Won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts...had career highs in winning percentage (.625) and opponents grounded into double plays (19) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36)...had two complete games after tallying just one in 208 starts over his first nine seasons...his starts and innings pitched (190.1) were second most in his career to his 34 starts and 206.2 innings with Tampa Bay in 2007.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for eighth in the AL in wins...also had the sixth highest run support (5.58), tied for sixth in complete games, ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.357) and tied for 10th in games started.

FIRST 15 STARTS/LAST 17 STARTS: Was 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .203 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts and was leading the AL in ERA entering play June 24...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings that day at New York (NL) and went 6-7 with a 5.00 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over his final 17 starts...his ERA from June 24 through the end of the season was fourth highest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his last three starts after pitching a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 44 career starts, including just six with six or more innings...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .186 opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 7.20 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in two starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead with two pickoffs...had just one in 54 games entering the season...has surrendered all three of his home runs this year and 25 of 28 in his career against righties...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA (4.2 ip, 8 h, 8 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against Texas, both last year in Oakland

- Has seven losses, which are the most in the majors...has been charged with the loss in seven of the A's last 12 defeats.
- Has allowed nine home runs, which are tied for the third most in the AL...15 of their 35 earned runs allowed this year have come via the home run (six solo homers, three three-run homers).
- Has just two saves, which is tied for the fewest in the AL (Texas)...have five save opportunities, which are second fewest.
