ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their two-game losing streak last night...however, have lost six of the last eight games and are four games under .500, which is one game away from matching their season-high of five games under...the 10-14 start is the A's worst record after 24 games since the 2009 club was 9-15...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 6½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third and five days in fourth...snapped their season-high four-game losing streak Tuesday night...were swept for the first time this year last weekend by Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (1-0), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...are now 4-9 at home for the season, which matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have the third worst home record in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last six games and are 1-2 with a 5.61 ERA (21 er in 33.2 ip) over that span...have a 3.32 ERA (52 er in 141.0 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fifth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (141.0) and fifth in fewest home runs (12)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 6-1 with a 2.06 ERA (21 er in 91.2 ip) in 14 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-6 with a 5.66 ERA (31 er in 49.1 ip) in 10 starts...starters have eight of the A's 10 wins and have a 1.29 ERA (9 er in 62.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.70 ERA (69 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.71 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.231) and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.359)...have a 1.20 ERA (12 er in 90.0 ip) in their 10 wins, a 5.50 ERA (77 er in 126.0 ip) in their 14 losses...**lead the majors** with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .240 (130-for-541) with 66 runs scored (4.1 per game) over the last 16 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .264 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...rank second in the AL in triples (7) and fourth in doubles (42)...are batting .321 (69-for-215) with runners in scoring position, which **ranks first in the AL**...are tied for second in grounded into double plays (23).

ON THE BASES: The A's were caught stealing last night (Canha) after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 11 games and have 21 for the season, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is three more than any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 0-5 in one-run games and are tied for the most one-run losses in the American League...are 1-4 in two-run games...the nine combined losses in one and two run games are tied for the most in the majors (Seattle)...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or

more...have been out-scored 91-42 in their 14 losses (6.5 to 3.0) and have out-scored the opposition 75-13 in their 10 wins (7.5 to 1.3).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-8 during day games compared to 10-6 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the most day losses in the majors (Minnesota)...are tied for the fourth best night record in the American League...the A's eight-game losing streak in day games is their longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are batting .247 (69 for 279) with 28 runs scored during the day (3.50 per game) compared to .272 (152 for 559) with 89 runs scored at night (5.56 per game)...have hit 18 of their 19 home runs at night...have a 4.81 ERA (39 er in 73.0 ip) during the day, 3.15 (50 er in 143.0 ip) at night...have surrendered nine home runs in 16 night games compared to 12 in eight day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's won last night, 7-5...scored all seven runs in the eighth inning, their most in an inning this season (previous: 6, April 10 vs. Seattle, 4th)...trailed 5-0 entering the eighth and the five-run comeback is their largest of the season (previous: 2, April 28 at Los Angeles-AL)...are 6-2 in the first game of a series compared to 0-7 in the final game of a series...are 0-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 9-10 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .278 (189-for-680) with 18 of their 19 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .203 (32-for-158) off left-handers...are 0-3 in extra inning games and are tied for the most extra inning losses in the majors (Cincinnati, Seattle)...are 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 23...have used the DL nine times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 (won west and 94 games) and 1979 (finished last and lost 108 games) and were 12 out in 2001 (won wild card and 102 games).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...are 1-0 in Texas after splitting a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...the A's lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 2-7 in Oakland and 7-3 in Texas...the seven losses at home were the most in Oakland history against the Rangers and the seven wins on the road matched the most in Oakland history against Texas (1972, 2003, 2005)...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years...are 59-60 over the last seven years...are 325-336 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 171-160 in Oakland and 154-176 in Texas...including 87-88 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 422-418 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career...is 5-for-8 (.625) with five RBI in those two games...**Josh Reddick** has a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak (14-for-29, .483).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2012** Brian Fuentes records the 200th save of his career in the A's 4-2 win at Boston...he becomes the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 save plateau.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.50 ERA)

INNINGS PITCHED: Has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his last three starts after pitching a career-high tying 7.0 innings in his first start (third time)... last year, he tossed five innings or fewer six of his 10 starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 11 of his 44 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (3-for-18) average against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (19-for-69) with all three of his home runs against right-handers...has surrendered 25 of his 28 career home runs against righties...all three home runs have come with runners on base and two have been hit by the number nine hitter in the order...opponents are 6-for-16 (.375) with runners in scoring position

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) and .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 7.20 ERA (8 er in 10.0 ip) and .318 (14-for-44) opponents batting average in two starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has two pickoffs and is tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs...had just one pickoff in 54 games entering the season...the A's are 1-3 in his starting assignments and are 6-8 (.429) in his career...his teams are 16-28 (.364) in his career.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston April 15...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014...also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles April 21...allowed four runs in the second inning, all with two outs...Gjovotella hit a three-run homer and a fourth run scored on a Semien error...allowed a leadoff double to Cron in the sixth inning and was relieved by Alvarez who allowed that run to score plus five of his own.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed three runs in the third, although only one run was earned (Davis error)...allowed a two-run single to Gattis and a RBI single to Rasmus...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fourth but the A's came back to tie the game with three in the bottom of the fourth.

POMERANZ vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA (4.2 ip, 8 h, 8 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, both last year in Oakland...the relief appearance came on April 23 (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so)...entered the game in the eighth inning and retired three of the four batters he faced, the first two by strikeout (Rios, Fielder)...then took the loss in a 14-8 decision on June 16...allowed a career-high eight runs on eight hits in 3.2 innings...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed two runs in the second on a two-run single by Chirinos...then allowed six runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Murphy, a RBI single by Robertson and a fielders choice...was relieved by Cook with two outs and runners on first and second and Cook allowed a two-run double to Beltre.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .159 (14-for-88) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .168 (18-for-107) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season...is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-19 with a 4.58 ERA (105 er in 206.0 ip) in 44 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 23-for-27 (85.2%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just three in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.
