OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-15) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (8-15)

SUNDAY, MAY 3, 2015 – GLOBE LIFE PARK – 2:05 P.M. CDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-0, 1.98) VS. RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (2-3, 4.05) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and seven of the last nine to fall to a season-high tying five games under .500 (also: April 30, 9-14)...the 10-15 start is the A's worst record after 25 games since the 2009 club was 9-16...remain in fourth place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 7½ games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days

tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, four days tied for third and six days in fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (1-1), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history... are now 4-9 at home for the season, which matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have the third worst home record in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last seven games and are 1-2 with a 5.54 ERA (24 er in 39.0 ip) over that span...however, have a 3.38 ERA (55 er in 146.1 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League**...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (146.1) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (13)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 6-1 with a 2.06 ERA (21 er in 91.2 ip) in 14 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-6 with a 5.60 ERA (34 er in 54.2 ip) in 11 starts...starters have eight of the A's 10 wins and have a 1.29 ERA (9 er in 62.2 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.91 ERA (77 er in 141.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.88 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League... have the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.369) and sixth lowest batting average (.237) and on-base percentage (.305)...have a 1.20 ERA (12 er in 90.0 ip) in their 10 wins, a 5.67 ERA (85 er in 135.0 ip) in their 15 losses...**lead the majors** with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .244 (142-for-581) with 73 runs scored (4.3 per game) over the last 17 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .265 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...rank second in the AL in triples (7) and fourth in doubles (45)...are batting .313 (71-for-227) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...are second in grounded into double plays (25).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 14-for-15 (93.3%) in stolen base attempts, which **ranks first in the American League** and third in the majors...started the season a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 12 games and have 21 for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Texas, 23)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed eight of the errors, which is three more than any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 0-6 in one-run games and are tied for the most one-run losses in the majors (Atlanta, Pittsburgh)...are 1-4 in two-run games...the 10 combined losses in one and two run games are the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more... have been out-scored 99-49 in their 15 losses (6.6 to 3.3) and have out-scored the opposition 75-13 in their 10 wins (7.5 to 1.3).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 0-8 during day games compared to 10-7 at night...are the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the most day losses in the majors...have the fifth best night record in the American League...the A's eight-game losing streak in day games is their longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are batting .247 (69 for 279) with 28 runs scored during the day (3.50 per game) compared to .274 (164 for 599) with 96 runs scored at night (5.65 per game)...have hit 19 of their 20 home runs at night...have a 4.81 ERA (39 er in 73.0 ip) during the day, 3.43 (58 er in 152.0 ip) at night...have surrendered 11 home runs in 17 night games compared to 12 in eight day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-2 in the first game of a series compared to 0-7 in the final game of a series...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)... have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 10-10 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .280 (201-for-719) with 19 of their 20 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .201 (32-for-159) off left-handers...are 0-4 in extra inning games and have the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)... Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 23...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969... were also 6½ games out in 2012 (won west and 94 games) and 1979 (finished last and lost 108 games) and were 12 out in 2001 (won wild card and 102 games).

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at three games each... have split the first two games of this series in Texas after splitting a fourgame series in Oakland to start the season...the A's lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 2-7 in Oakland and 7-3 in Texas...the seven losses at home were the most in Oakland history against the Rangers and the seven wins on the road matched the most in Oakland history against Texas (1972, 2003, 2005)...have won three season series and lost three season series over the previous six years...are 59-61 over the last seven years... are 325-337 all-time against the Texas Rangers... hat breaks down to 171-160 in Oakland and 154-177 in Texas...including 87-89 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 422-419 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brett Lawrie is 7-for-22 (.318) with a home run and nine RBI over his last six games...drove in just four runs over his first 18 contests...**Josh Reddick** has hit safely in each of his last 10 games (17 for 34, .500), which is the longest hitting streak of his career (previous: 9, Sept. 3-13, 2011)...**Stephen Vogt** ranks third in the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.526) and on-base percentage (.434), sixth in slugging (.586) and seventh in batting (.343).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1980** Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in **2000** the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.98 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his third win of the season in his last start, which is tied for fourth in the American League...ranks eighth in ERA (1.98)...is also fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.240), fifth in onbase percentage (.243), innings pitched (36.1) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.25) and sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.49).

3-0: Has started the season 3-0 for the second consecutive season (lost his fourth decision last year)...is 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA over his first five starts after going 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his first five starts last year (was 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA over his first six starts in 2014)...now has a four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...has a 1.59 ERA (8 er in 45.1 ip) over that six-start stretch.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in four starts against American League West competition compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 15-5 with a 2.12 ERA (42 er in 178.2 ip) in 26 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA (60 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed seven of his nine runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 4.20 ERA (7 er in 15.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.56 career ERA (57 er in 144.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.36 (45 er in 175.1 ip) from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one home run, a solo shot by a left-handed hitter (Ackley, SEA)...has yielded 13 of his 20 career home runs to lefties and 15 have come with the bases empty...opponents are hitting .357 (5-for-14) with runners in scoring position...is averaging 7.18 runs of support (29 rs in 36.1 ip), which is fifth highest in the American League...has walked one batter in four of his five starts and two in the other start...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his five starts...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and 27-21 (.563) in his career.

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the American League in wins and ranked ninth in ERA...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in April.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day... he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

FIRST START: He combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day April 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning... walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball).

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third... the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero).

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City April 17...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings... had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out

RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles April 22...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point.

GRAY vs. TEXAS: Is 5-2 with a 1.74 ERA (51.2 ip, 35 h, 11 r, 10 er, 14 bb, 38 so, 1 hr) in seven career starts...has not allowed a run in three of those starts and his 1.74 ERA is third lowest by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers with a minimum of 50 innings pitched (1.28, Sparky Lyle; 1.69 Dick Woodson)...has not allowed a run in his last two starts

and has a 17.0-inning scoreless streak...his five career wins are his most against any team...is 3-0 with a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) in three starts in Texas and 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland.. his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 20 innings...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-0 A's win on Opening Day, April 6 (see first start above)...went 4-2 with a 2.06 ERA in six starts last year...has both of his two career complete games and shutouts against the Rangers...is the first pitcher to shutout Texas twice in one season since Bert Blyleven in 1985...is one of three players in Athletics history to shtuout the Rangers/Senators twice in one season (Ed Rakow, 1962; Vida Blue, 1972)...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...then started the final game of the 2014 season Sept. 28 at Texas, the A's Wild Card clinching 4-0 win...tossed a complete game six-hit shutout, did not walk a batter and struck out five.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four starts (14.1 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 3 hr)...also started in a minor league game March 31...allowed a .354 (21-for-65) opponents batting average...yielded six runs in his final Cactus League start (2.2 ip) after surrendering six runs in his first three starts (11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start as an Athletic, his second since April 18...missed his turn in the rotation on April 23 due to a blister...has allowed a .139 batting average against right-handed hitters and .176 with runners on base...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Twins, a 3-1 Padres loss at Minnesota last year on Aug. 5 (5.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...tied for third among National League rookies in wins.

- Has allowed 10 home runs, which are tied for second most in the AL...18 of their 42 earned runs allowed this year have come via the home run (six solo homers, four three-run homers).
- Has three saves, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...has seven save opportunities, which is also tied for second fewest.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville yesterday for his second stint with the A's and has appeared in one game since then.
- Has faced the Rangers three times this year, his first career appearances against Texas (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 so, 1 hr).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed nine runs in six relief appearances for a 12.00 ERA before he was optioned to Nashville on April 22.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in one relief appearance for the Sounds.
