OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-15) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (13-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three games in Texas over the weekend but have lost three of the last five games and seven of the last 10...are four games under .500 at 11-15, which is one game short of their season high of five (two times, last: May 2)...the start is the A's worst record after 26 games since the 2009 club was 10-16...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 7½ games for the second consecutive day...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, one day in third, four days tied for third and six days in fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (four games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1), Kansas City (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...are now 4-9 at home for the season, which matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have the second worst home record in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's won a day game for the first time this season yesterday...were the only Major League team without a win in a day game and are tied for the second most day losses in the majors...the win snapped an eight-game losing streak in day games, which was the longest such streak since they dropped nine straight from Sept. 24, 2008 to April 22, 2009...are now 1-8 during day games compared to 10-7 at night...have the fifth best night record in the American League...are batting .251 (79 for 315) with 35 runs scored during the day (3.89 per game) compared to .274 (164 for 599) with 96 runs scored at night (5.65 per game)...have hit 19 of their 23 home runs at night...have a 4.39 ERA (40 er in 82.0 ip) during the day, 3.43 (58 er in 152.0 ip) at night...have surrendered 11 home runs in 17 night games compared to 12 in nine day games.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in four of the last eight games and are 2-2 with a 4.73 ERA (24 er in 45.2 ip) over that span...however, have a 3.24 ERA (55 er in 153.0 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (153.0), fourth in fewest home runs (13) and fifth in strikeouts (123)...Gray, Kazmir and Hahn are a combined 7-1 with a 1.92 ERA (21 er in 98.1 ip) in 15 starts...the rest of the rotation is 2-6 with a 5.60 ERA (34 er in 54.2 ip) in 11 starts...starters have nine of the A's 11 wins and have a 1.17 ERA (9 er in 69.1 ip) in those games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.68 ERA (78 er in 150.0 ip) over the last 16 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 3.77 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have the fifth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.362) and sixth lowest batting average (.233) and on-base percentage (.306)...have a 1.18 ERA (13 er in 99.0 ip) in their 11 wins, a 5.67 ERA (85 er in 135.0 ip) in their 15 losses...**lead the majors** with five shutouts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .246 (152-for-617) with 80 runs scored (4.4 per game) over the last 18 games after hitting .306 with 51 runs scored (6.4 per game) over the first eight contests...are batting .266 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...rank second in the AL in triples (7) and fourth in doubles (46)...are batting .312 (73-for-234) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...are second in grounded into double plays (25).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 14-for-17 (82.4%) in stolen base attempts, which ranks third in the American League...have been caught stealing in two of their past three attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors over the past six games after making 10 errors over the previous seven games...have committed 22 errors for the season, which ranks second in the American League...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 0-6 in one-run games, which are the most one-run losses in the American League and tied for second most in the majors...are 1-4 in two-run games...the 10 combined losses in one and two run games are tied for the most in the majors...are 5-2 in games decided by seven runs or more...have the most games and wins in the majors in games decided by seven or more...have been out-scored 99-49 in their 15 losses (6.6 to 3.3) and have out-scored the opposition 82-14 in their 11 wins (7.5 to 1.3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-2 in the first game of a series compared to 1-7 in the final game of a series...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...have the most last at bat losses in the majors and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Milwaukee, Los Angeles-AL)...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...are 11-10 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .279 (210-for-753) with 21 of their 23 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .205 (33-for-161) off left-handers...are 0-4 in extra inning games and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Parker, who is recovering from Tommy John surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 23...he was reassigned on his rehab assignment to Triple-A Nashville yesterday...Crisp, who is recovering from right elbow surgery, began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton yesterday...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 (won west and 94 games) and 1979 (finished last and lost 108 games) and were 12 out in 2001 (won wild card and 102 games).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's won the season series last year, 6-1...won three of four games in Oakland and were 3-0 in Minnesota...have won six straight series against the Twins and are 17-3 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 290-291 against Minnesota...that includes 161-127 in Oakland and 129-164 in Minnesota...are 12-10 at Target Field...are 347-360 all-time against the Twins and have a 994-996 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brett Lawrie is on a season-high seven game hitting streak (9 for 26, .346)...has nine RBI over that span after driving in just four runs in his first 18 contests...**Josh Reddick** was named American League Co-Player of the Week today for the period ending May 3...has hit safely in each of his last 11 games (19 for 38, .500), which is an ongoing career-high...**Stephen Vogt** hit two home runs yesterday, his second multiple homer game of the season and his career...is the only Athletic to hit multiple homers in a game this year.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1935** Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland...in **1969** John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.86 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start as an Athletic, his second since April 18...missed his turn in the rotation on April 23 due to a blister...the A's are 1-3 in his four starting assignments...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his four starts...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117...made his Major League debut with the Padres last year and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .215 opponents batting average, including .139 (5-for-36) against right-handed hitters compared to .279 (12-for-43) against left-handers...opponents are batting .244 (11-for-45) with the bases empty compared to .176 (6-for-34) with runners on...has a .182 (6-for-33) opponents average the first time through the order, .212 (7-for-33) the second time and .308 (4-for-13) after that...opponents are 4-for-42 (.095) with two strikes...the opponents clean-up hitter is 0-for-7.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying seven hits...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two more runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

THIRD START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook.

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 4-0 record and a 2.56 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...had a 2.14 ERA over the first five innings of a game, 6.75 from the sixth inning on...the Padres were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments..

MORE WITH SAN DIEGO: Was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time June 3 and made his ML debut that evening against Pittsburgh (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...was the losing pitcher in a 4-1 decision and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day...recalled for the second time June 14 and went 5-1 with a 1.46 ERA in six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...singled in the fourth inning off Zack Wheeler June 14 at New York (NL) for his first Major League hit...went 2-for-22 (.091) with a RBI as a hitter...struck out a career-high nine batters in 5.0 innings June 30 against Cincinnati, including a stretch of seven consecutive outs recorded via strikeout...became the first Padres pitcher since Jake Peavy on Aug. 27, 2007 to record seven consecutive outs via strikeout and the first Padres rookie to accomplish this feat since at least 1974...was 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in five starts in June...the wins tied for the most in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher (eighth time, first since Kevin Walker in August of 2000)...the opponents average was second lowest of any qualifying rookie pitcher in any month in Padres history, behind only the .188 mark put up by Eric Nolte in August of 1987...his ERA was 10th lowest by a rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history (min 25.0 IP) and the lowest since Justin Germano posted a 1.08 ERA in May 2007...recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3-30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...according to Stats Inc., his 36 strikeouts tied for eighth most by a NL pitcher through his first five career games since the start of the 1914 season...then went 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts in July...allowed a .172 batting average and .230 slugging percentage, which were the lowest in franchise history during the month of July...was recalled the third time July 25 and went 2-1 with a 3.99 ERA in five starts before being optioned to San Antonio Aug. 19...won at Atlanta July 25, giving him four wins in his first four starts on the road...that was the longest such career-opening streak in Padres history...picked up his seventh win of the season in his ninth start on July 30 against St. Louis...his seven wins through nine career appearances were the most in Padres franchise history and tied for the third most by a Major League pitcher since the 1914 season, behind only Boston's Boo Ferriss in 1945 and Chicago-AL's John Whitehead in 1935, both of which had eight wins through nine career starts...allowed a sixth inning home run to Kennys Vargas Aug. 5 at Minnesota, snapping a 55.0-inning homerless streak dating back to June 14...it was the fourth longest homerless streak by a rookie in Padres history...recalled for the final time Aug. 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever...appeared in just two games (5.40 ERA) and did not pitch after Sept. 6.

RHP Jesse Chavez (0-2, 2.55 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the bullpen...did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...moved in the rotation April 23 and is 0-2 with a 4.09 ERA in his two starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 0-0 with a 4.70 ERA (15.1 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, including one start, against Minnesota...the start came last year on April 9, a no decision in the A's 7-4 win at Minnesota (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 9 so)...went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA in six games, five starts, this spring...began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts.
