OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-16) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (14-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight of the last 11 games after starting the season 8-8... are a season-high tying five games under .500 for the third time this year...have not been six games under .500 since June 14, 2012 (29-35)...the A's 11-16 record matches their worst after 27 games over the last 14 years...the 2009 A's also started the year 11-16 (lost game 28)...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place

Houston by a season-high 7½ games for the third consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit after 27 games since the 2001 club trailed by 12 games (also trailed by 12 after 28)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, one day in third, four days tied for third and seven days in fourth.

ONE RUN GAME AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 0-7 in one run games with the loss last night and are one of two teams without a one-run win (Cleveland, 0-2)...the seven one-run losses are tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...now have a 10-game losing streak in one-run games dating back to Sept. 24 of last year, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (June 19-July 11, 1986)...last won a one-run game Sept. 13, 2014 at Seattle (3-2)...are 1-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors and the A's are one of three teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland, Los Angeles-AL)... are 0-4 in extra inning games and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most extra inning losses in the majors...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored exactly seven runs in four straight games for the first time in franchise history...are batting .287 (43-for-150) with eight doubles and seven home runs over that stretch but are just 2-2...rank second in the American League in runs (138) and triples (7), third in fewest strikeouts (168) and fourth in batting (.268), on-base percentage (.328), doubles (49) and extra base hits (81)...are batting .311 (76-for-244) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...have grounded into the second most doubles plays (25).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings six of the last nine games and are 2-3 with a 5.33 ERA (30 er in 50.2 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.47 ERA (61 er in 158.0 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League...also rank third in innings pitched (158.0) and fourth in fewest home runs (13)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-0 with a 1.65 ERA (14 er in 76.1 ip) in 11 starts while the rest of the rotation is 3-8 with a 5.18 ERA (47 er in 81.2) in 16 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.90 ERA (86 er in 158.0 ip) over the last 18 games after logging a 2.14 ERA over the first nine contests...have a 1.18 ERA (13 er in 99.0 ip) in their 11 wins, a 5.85 ERA (93 er in 143.0 ip) in their 16 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 14-for-17 (82.4%) in stolen base attempts, which ranks third in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past four attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pick-offs, which is tied for second in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 23 errors, which ranks second in the American League (Texas, 24)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (0-1) and Seattle (three games)... went 5-5 on the first road trip and are now 7-7 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...have the second worst home record in the American League

(Texas, 3-9)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)... went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 18 of their 25 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's won a day game for the first time this season Sunday at Texas...are now 1-8 (.111) during the day compared to 10-8 at night...have the worst record during the day in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .251 (79 for 315) with 35 runs scored during the day (3.89 per game) compared to .277 (177 for 639) with 103 runs scored at night (5.72 per game)...have hit 21 of their 25 home runs at night...have surrendered 12 home runs in 18 night games compared to 12 in nine day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of their last nine games...are 10-12 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .281 (220-for-784) with 23 of their 25 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .212 (36-for-170) off left-handers...are 6-3 in the first game of a series compared to 1-7 in the final game of a series...are 0-8 when scoring fewer than four runs and are one of four teams without a win when scoring three runs or fewer (Milwaukee, Arizona, Baltimore)...have been out-scored 107-56 in their 16 losses (6.7 to 3.5) and have out-scored the opposition 82-14 in their 11 wins (7.5 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)... Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Parker and Freiman are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969... were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lost the first game of 2015 last night after winning the season series last year, 6-1...won three of four games in Oakland and were 3-0 in Minnesota...have won six straight series against the Twins and are 17-4 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 290-292 against Minnesota...that includes 161-127 in Oakland and 129-165 in Minnesota...are 12-10 at Target Field...are 347-361 all-time against the Twins and have a 994-997 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brett Lawrie is on a season-high eight-game hitting streak (11-for-30, ...367)...has nine RBI over that span after driving in just four runs in his first 18 contests...**Josh Reddick** extended his hitting streak to 12 games yesterday, which is an on-going career high and the second longest active hitting streak in the majors (Uribe, LAD 13)...is batting .488 (20-for-41) during the streak...**Stephen Vogt** hit his first career grand slam yesterday and drove in a career-high five runs...is 5-for-8 with three home runs and nine RBI over his last two games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1939** Sam Chapman hits for the cycle and then homers in his first two at bats the following day...in **1949** Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning...in **1971** Vida Blue tosses a four hit shutout and strikes out 11 in the A's 5-0 win at Detroit...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-2, 2.55 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was on the A's Opening Day roster and began the season in the bullpen...did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has taken the loss in each of his two starts (5 er in 11.0 ip, 4.09 ERA) after not allowing a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...is now 8-10 with a 3.90 ERA (63 er in 145.1 ip) in 25 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances...began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...had made just two career starts entering 2014.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost his first two decisions this year after losing his final two decisions of 2014...is 0-4 with a 3.95 ERA (19 er in 43.1 ip) over his last 18 games dating back to July 28 of last year...the four-game losing streak is one short of his career high of five from Sept. 25, 2008 to Aug. 31, 2009...his last win came on July 23, 2014 against Houston.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

IN APRIL: Went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins... ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 (24 er in 80.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline... went 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .247 (78-for-316) against left-handed hitters compared to .260 (64-for-246) against right-handers...allowed 17 home runs, 12 of which were solo shots...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that...yielded a .208 average with RISP and two outs...opponents reached base on an error eight times, which tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed a .303 batting average over his first 15 pitches in game, .213 from pitches 16-60 and .281 after that...held the number six hitter to a .119 batting average, which was second lowest in the AL, but the number eight hitter batted .393, which was the highest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 15 games in Oakland compared to 3-6 with a 4.12 ERA in 17 games on the road...yielded just four home runs in 67.1 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 78.2 innings on the road.

DAYS REST: Was 6-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more, 2-5 with a 4.08 ERA in nine starts on four days rest...had a 1.13 ERA in three relief appearances on two days rest or fewer, 5.11 in eight appearances with three days rest or more

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a 7-6 record and a 3.14 ERA in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...went 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 13 games, two starts, after the break...now has a 3.77 ERA (107 er in 255.2 ip) in 115 career appearances before the break, 6.12 (97 er in 142.2 ip) in 114 outings after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Did not commit an error in 15 chances and has not made an error in 77 games and 33 chances in four seasons with the A's.

THIS AND THAT: Averaged 5.80 runs of support as a starter, which ranked fourth highest in the AL at the time of his last start on July 28...the A's were 14-7 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 15 of his 21 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11 times...tossed at least one inning in nine of his 11 relief appearances, including three innings or more four times...went 0-for-3 with three strikeouts as a hitter and is 0-for-8 with eight strikeouts in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER LHP Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.62 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...ranks third in the American League in ERA (1.62) and opponents batting average (.178) and fifth in strikeouts (36)...is 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA over his first five starts this year after going 3-0 with a 1.62 ERA over his first five starts last year...opponents are batting .257 with the bases empty compared to .063 with runners on base...are 1-for-20 (.0590 with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-11 with RISP and two outs...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win at Texas last Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 7-4 with a 3.42 ERA in 13 career starts against Minnesota...currently has a five-game winning streak against the Twins and has a 2.68 ERA over that seven start stretch dating back to May 4, 2013... went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts.

- Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in the A's 11 wins, a 6.79 ERA (41 er in 54.1 ip) in their 16 losses.
- Has eight losses, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...has been charged with the loss in eight of the A's last 14 defeats.
- Has allowed 11 home runs, which is second most in the AL ... relievers have surrendered six solo homers and five three-run homers.
- Has three saves, which is tied for the fewest in the AL, and eight save opportunities, which is tied for the third fewest.

- Has not allowed a run in five games and 4.0 innings in his career against the Twins (1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).


