OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-16) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (14-13)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 4-4 over the last eight games after losing a season-high four consecutive contests...are 12-16 overall, which is the A's second worst record after 28 games over the last 14 years...started the 2009 season 11-17 (lost game 29)...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is the A's largest deficit after 28 games since the 2001 club trailed by 12 games (trailed by

11 after 29 games)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, four days tied for third and seven days in fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's won 2-1 last night for their first one-run victory of the season...it was their first one-run win since a 3-2 victory at Seattle Sept. 13, 2014 and it snapped an Oakland record tying 10-game losing streak in one run games (also June 19-July 11, 1986)...are now 1-7 in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-2)...the seven losses are tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 0-4 in extra inning games and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most extra inning losses in the majors... have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .281 (52-for-185) with 30 runs, eight doubles and seven home runs over the first five games of the road trip...rank second in the American League in runs (140), third in triples (7) and fourth in batting (.268), on-base percentage (.327), extra base hits (81) and fewest strikeouts (175)...are batting .310 (78-for-252) with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL...have grounded into the second most doubles plays (26).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings six of the last 10 games and are 3-3 with a 4.66 ERA (30 er in 58.0 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.32 ERA (61 er in 165.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.17)...also rank second in innings pitched (165.1) and tied for second in fewest home runs (13)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-0 with a 1.65 ERA (14 er in 76.1 ip) in 11 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-8 with a 4.75 ERA (47 er in 89.0) in 17 starts.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff did not allow an earned run last night and now have a 1.08 ERA (13 er in 108.0 ip) in their 12 wins...have a 5.85 ERA (93 er in 143.0 ip) in their 16 losses...lead the majors with five shutouts... have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.363).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 15-for-18 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past five attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last three games and have 24 errors for the season, which is tied with Texas for second most in the majors (Washington, 26)...the errors have led to 16 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Washington, 25)...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-1) and Seattle (three games)... went 5-5 on the first road trip and are now 8-7 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 3-9)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since go-

ing 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)... went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 18 of their 25 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's won a day game for the first time this season Sunday at Texas...are now 1-8 (.111) during the day compared to 11-8 (.579) at night...have the worst record during the day in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .251 (79 for 315) with 35 runs scored during the day (3.89 per game) compared to .276 (186 for 674) with 105 runs scored at night (5.53 per game)...have hit 21 of their 25 home runs at night...have surrendered 12 home runs in 19 night games compared to 12 in nine day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of their last 10 games...are 11-12 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .278 (225-for-809) with 23 of their 25 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .222 (40-for-180) off left-handers...are 6-3 in the first game of a series compared to 1-7 in the final game of a series...have been out-scored 107-56 in their 16 losses (6.7 to 3.5) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have nine players on the disabled list (Crisp, Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Crisp, Freiman, Nolin and Parker are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969... were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have split the first two games of 2015 after winning the season series last year, 6-1...won three of four games in Oakland and were 3-0 in Minnesota...have won six straight series against the Twins and are 18-4 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 291-292 against Minnesota...that includes 161-127 in Oakland and 130-165 in Minnesota...are 13-10 at Target Field...are 348-361 all-time against the Twins and have a 995-997 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Tyler Clippard has not allowed a hit to a left-handed batter (0-for-18)... Brett Lawrie extended his hitting streak to nine games last night, which is the longest active hitting streak in the American League and two short of his career high of 11...is 12-for-34 (.353) during the streak...has 10 RBI during the streak after driving in just four runs in his first 18 contests...Evan Scribner has not allowed a run over his last nine games and 7.2 innings...Marcus Semien has played every inning for the A's at shortstop and is the only Athletic to start all 28 games...Stephen Vogt has reached base safely in each of his last 17 games, which is the longest reaching base streak of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.62 ERA)

FIRST FIVE STARTS: Is 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (6 er in 33.1 ip) and .178 (21-for-118) opponents batting average over his first five starts...went 3-0 with a 1.62 ERA and .183 opponents average over his first five starts last year (was 4-0, 2.11, .206 after six starts).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in ERA (1.62) and opponents batting average (.178), sixth in on-base percentage (.252), seventh in strikeouts (36) and eighth in slugging percentage (.288).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .257 (18-for-70) batting average with the bases empty compared to .063 (3-for-48) with runners on base... opponents are 1-for-20 (.050) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-11 with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are 4-for-62 (.065) with two strikes...last year, he ranked sixth in the American League among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven hitter this year (11 at bats)...the two and three hitters are a combined 2-for-28 (.071)...has yielded a .333 average and all three of his home runs to batters leading off an inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and no home runs in two starts in Oakland compared to 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA (6 er in 19.1 ip) and three home runs in three starts on the road...has tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home...is the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

IN APRIL: Went 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA ranked fourth in the American League...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April in 2014 and is now 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April over the last two seasons.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his four starts...that matched the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss

FOURTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston April 24 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th.

LAST START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas last Friday...allowed leadoff home runs to Blanks in the second inning and Fielder in the fourth inning...Smolinski added a sacrifice fly in the fourth and Kazmir left after six innings trailing 3-0...the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win.

2014 RECAP: Won a career-high and team-leading 15 games in his 10th Major League season, his first with the A's...was named an American League All-Star for the third time in his career (2006, 2008)...went 15-9 with a 3.55 ERA in 32 starts...had career highs in winning percentage (.625) and opponents grounded into double plays (19) and career lows in opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.357) and walks per nine innings (2.36)...had two complete games after tallying just one in 208 starts over his first nine seasons...his starts and innings pitched (190.1) were second most in his career to his 34 starts and 206.2 innings with Tampa Bay in 2007...tied for eighth in the AL in wins...also had the sixth highest run support (5.58), tied for sixth in complete games, ranked 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.357) and tied for 10th in games started.

LHP Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.61 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 6.20 ERA over his last four starts after tossing 7.0 shutout innings in his first start for the win...has allowed a .273 opponents batting average, including .138 against left-handed hitters compared to .321 against right-handers...has yielded a .381 average with runners in scoring position...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .186 opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 6.46 ERA and .328 opponents batting average in three starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead with two pickoffs...had just one in 54 games entering the season...has surrendered all four of his home runs this year and 26 of 29 in his career against righties...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-7 A's loss in 10 innings last Saturday at Texas (5.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)... has never faced the Twins in his career.
