ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 4-5 over the last nine games after losing a season-high four consecutive contests...are a season-high tying five games under .500 (fourth time, last: May 4) at 12-17 overall, which is the A's second worst record after 29 games over the last 14 years...started the 2009 season 11-18 (won game 30)...are tied for third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is the A's

largest deficit after 29 games since the 2001 club trailed by 11 games (trailed by 12 after 30 games)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third and seven days in fourth.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out last night, 13-0...it was the second time the A's have been shut out this season (also: April 23 at Los Angeles-AL) and the 13-run margin of defeat matched their worst loss of the season (also: April 21 at Los Angeles-AL, 14-1)...are now batting .267 (58-for-217) with 30 runs, 10 doubles and seven home runs over the first six games of the road trip...rank second in the American League in runs (140), third in triples (7), fourth in batting (.265) and fewest strikeouts (180) and fifth in on-base percentage (.324) and extra base hits (83)...are batting .300 (78-for-260) with runners in scoring position, which is tied for third in the AL... have grounded into the second most doubles plays (27).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff allowed a season-high 13 earned runs last night (previous: 12, April 21 at Los Angeles-AL)...now have a 6.32 ERA (106 er in 151.0 ip) in their 17 losses, a 1.08 ERA (13 er in 108.0 ip) in their 12 wins...lead the majors with five shutouts...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.376).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in six of the last 11 games and are 3-4 with a 5.06 ERA (36 er in 64.0 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.52 ERA (67 er in 171.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.19)...also rank second in innings pitched (171.1) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (15)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.19 ERA (20 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-8 with a 4.75 ERA (47 er in 89.0) in 17 starts.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's won 2-1 Tuesday at Minnesota for their first one-run victory of the season...it was their first one-run win since a 3-2 victory at Seattle Sept. 13, 2014 and it snapped an Oakland record tying 10-game losing streak in one run games (also: June 19-July 11, 1986)...are now 1-7 in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-2)...the seven losses are tied for the most in the majors...are 2-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh, Seattle) and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 0-4 in extra inning games and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most extra inning losses in the majors... have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 15-for-18 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past five attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last four games and have 25 errors for the season, which is second most in the majors (Washington, 26)...the errors have led to 16 unearned runs, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-2) and Seattle (three games)... went 5-5 on the first road trip and are now 8-8 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...have the second worst home record in the American League

(Texas, 3-9)...finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their final seven road trips last year and have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)... went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 18 of their 25 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's won a day game for the first time this season Sunday at Texas...are now 1-8 (.111) during the day compared to 11-9 (.550) at night...have the worst record during the day in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .251 (79 for 315) with 35 runs scored during the day (3.89 per game) compared to .272 (192 for 706) with 105 runs scored at night (5.25 per game)...have hit 21 of their 25 home runs at night...have surrendered 15 home runs in 20 night games compared to 12 in nine day games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of their last 11 games...are 11-13 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .275 (231-for-841) with 23 of their 25 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .222 (40-for-180) off left-handers...are 6-3 in the first game of a series compared to 1-7 in the final game of a series...have been out-scored 120-56 in their 17 losses (7.1 to 3.3) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)... Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Freiman, Nolin and Parker are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969... were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have three players under contract beyond the 2015 season...Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017, Billy Butler is signed through 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's trail the series in Minnesota, 2-1, with one game remaining to snap their streak of six consecutive series wins...won the season series last year, 6-1...won three of four games in Oakland and were 3-0 in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 291-293 against Minnesota...that includes 161-127 in Oakland and 130-166 in Minnesota...are 13-11 at Target Field...are 348-362 all-time against the Twins and have a 995-998 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brett Lawrie extended his hitting streak to 10 games last night, which is the longest active hitting streak in the American League and one short of his career high of 11...is 14-for-37 (.378) during the streak...**Evan Scribner** has not allowed a run over his last nine games and 7.2 innings... **Marcus Semien** has played every inning for the A's at shortstop and is the only Athletic to start all 29 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play... it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 1991 Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he homers in the first, doubles in third, homers in the fourth, homers in the sixth for his club record tying third home run and then walks in the eighth inning with a chance for his fourth home run...he has seven RBI on the evening.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-2, 4.61 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-2 with a 6.20 ERA (14 er in 20.1 ip) and .318 (28-for-88) opponents batting average over his last four starts after tossing a career-high tying 7.0 shutouts innings while yielding just two hits in his first start...has tossed 5.1 innings or fewer in each of his last four starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 12 of his 45 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .138 (4-for-29) batting average against left-handed hitters with no extra base hits and one RBI...right-handers are batting .321 (26-for-81) with all four of his home runs and 14 RBI...has surrendered 26 of his 29 career home runs against righties... three of his four home runs have come with runners on base, three have come with two strikes and two have been hit by the number nine hitter in the order...opponents are 8-for-21 (.381) with runners in scoring position.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) and .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 6.46 ERA (11 er in 15.1 ip) and .328 (22-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has two pickoffs and is tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs...had just one pickoff in 54 games entering the season...the A's are 1-4 (.200) in his starting assignments and are 6-9 (.400) in his career... his teams are 16-29 (.356) in his career.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston April 15...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014... also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles April 21...allowed four runs in the second inning, all with two outs...Giavotella hit a three-run homer and a fourth run scored on a Semien error...allowed a leadoff double to Cron in the sixth inning and was relieved by Alvarez who allowed that run to score plus five of his own.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Houston in Oakland April 26...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed three runs in the third, although only one run was earned (Davis error)... allowed a two-run single to Gattis and a RBI single to Rasmus...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fourth but the A's came back to tie the game with three in the bottom of the fourth.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss at Texas last Saturday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Blanks in the bottom of the first...also yielded a Beltre RBI single in the third inning and a lead off home run to Blanks in the sixth...left after 5.1 innings with the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored six times in the seventh inning to get him off the hook.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .174 (16-for-92) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .177 (20-for-113) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season... is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-19 with a 4.60 ERA (108 er in 211.1 ip) in 45 career starts.

ON THE BASES: Opponents were successful in each of their six stolen base attempts with him on the mound...they are 23-for-27 (85.2%) against him in his career...did not have a pickoff and has just three in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 5-5 (.500) in his starting assignments... allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 10 starts...surrendered one run or fewer in each of his 10 relief appearances...tossed at least one inning in each of his relief outings, including two or more four times.
