ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight games to fall six games under .500 for the first time since June 14, 2012 when they were 29-35...have not been seven games under .500 since June 13, 2012 (28-35)...the A's 12-18 (.400) record is tied for third worst in the American League and it matches their worst record after 30 games over the last 14 years...the 2009 club also started the year 12-18 (won game 31)...with a loss tonight, the A's would have their worst record after 31 games since 2001 (11-20)...are tied for fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 7½ games...that is the A's third largest deficit after 30 games since the start of divisional play in 1969 (12 in 2001, 9 in 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth and one day tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 1-8 in one-run games with the 6-5 loss yesterday at Minnesota...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-2)...won 2-1 Tuesday at Minnesota for their first one-run victory of the season...it was their first one-run win since a 3-2 victory at Seattle Sept. 13, 2014 and it snapped an Oakland record tying 10-game losing streak in one run games (also: June 19-July 11, 1986)...are 2-12 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 0-7 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh, Seattle) and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 0-4 in extra inning games and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most extra inning losses in the majors...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's rank second in the American League in runs scored (145), third in triples (7) and fourth in batting average (.265), extra base hits (87) and fewest strikeouts (186)...are batting .302 (80-for-265) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second...have grounded into the second most double plays (27).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in seven of the last 12 games and are 3-5 with a 5.27 ERA (40 er in 68.1 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.64 ERA (71 er in 175.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.40)...also rank second in innings pitched (175.2) and tied for third in fewest home runs (15)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.19 ERA (20 er in 82.1 ip) in 12 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-9 with a 4.92 ERA (51 er in 93.1) in 18 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.85 ERA (39 er in 60.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the highest May ERA in the American League after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...lead the majors with five shutouts...are tied for the second most walks in the American League (95) but have the fourth most strikeouts (230).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last five games (six errors total) and have a Major League leading 27 errors for the season...the errors have led to 18 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Washington, 25)...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 16-for-19 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past six attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-5 on the first road trip and have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last eight road trips...have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...are 8-9 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...have the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 3-9)...return home fol-

lowing the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Boston (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 19 of their 26 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's fell to 1-9 (.100) in day games with the loss yesterday...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for second in losses...defeated Texas last Sunday afternoon after losing each of their first eight day games...have an 11-9 (.550) record at night...are batting .250 (87 for 348) with 40 runs scored during the day (4.00 per game) compared to .272 (192 for 706) with 105 runs scored at night (5.25 per game)...have hit 21 of their 26 home runs at night...have surrendered 15 home runs in 20 night games compared to 12 in 10 day games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of their last 12 games...have not faced a lefty since April 24 (Keuchel)...are 11-14 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .276 (239-for-867) with 24 of their 26 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .214 (40-for-187) off left-handers.

THIS AND THAT: Are 6-3 in the first game of a series compared to 1-8 in the final game of a series...are 10-7 when scoring first, 2-11 when the opponent scores first...are 11-9 when scoring four or more runs, 1-9 when scoring fewer than four...have been successful in 3-of-9 (33.3%) replay challenges, which is tied for the third lowest percentage in the American League...have been out-scored 126-61 in their 18 losses (7.0 to 3.4) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Freiman, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Freiman, Nolin and Parker are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series 2-1 after losing two of three in Oakland...lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 39-40 against Seattle since 2011...all-time, the A's are 322-247 (.566) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 177-109 in Oakland, 144-137 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Brett Lawrie extended his hitting streak to a career-high tying 11 games yesterday...is 16-for-41 (.390) with 10 RBI during the streak, which is the longest active hitting streak in the American League and one short of the AL season high (Butler and Reddick)...**Evan Scribner** has not allowed a run over his last 10 games and 8.2 innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1906** pitcher Chief Bender is inserted into the game in left field in the sixth inning and hits two inside the park home runs in a game against the Boston Pilgrims...in **1968**, the A's first year in Oakland, Catfish Hunter tosses a perfect game and almost single handedly defeats Minnesota 4-0...he strikes out 11 and also collects three hits while driving in three of the A's four runs...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley records his 200th career save in the A's 8-6 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-0, 1.67 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for second in the American League...ranks third in ERA (1.67)...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.224), third in innings pitched (43.0), fourth in batting average (.184) and on-base percentage (.257), fifth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.21) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (35).

4-0: Has started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...is one of four undefeated pitchers in the American League with at least four wins...won his final decision of 2014 and his five-game winning streak is one short of his career high of six (twice, last: June 18-July 16, 2014)...has a 1.38 ERA (8 er in 52.0 ip) and .186 (34-for-183) opponents batting average during his current winning streak, which spans seven starts dating back to Sept. 28, 2014.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-0 with a 0.97 ERA (4 er in 37.0 ip) in five starts against American League West competition compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 16-5 with a 2.04 ERA (42 er in 185.1 ip) in 27 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA (60 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed seven of his nine runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 25.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.49 career ERA (57 er in 147.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.26 (45 er in 179.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make the 50th start of his career tonight...has allowed one home run, a solo shot by a left-handed hitter (Ackley, SEA)...has yielded 13 of his 20 career home runs to lefties and 15 have come with the bases empty...is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more...is averaging 7.12 runs of support (34 rs in 43.0 ip), which is sixth highest in the American League...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and 28-21 (.571) in his career.

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the American League in wins and ranked ninth in ERA...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in April.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

2015 START-BY-START: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base (Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle **April 11** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for

the blown save (Otero)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles **April 22**...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 28**...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win at Texas last Sunday...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)...they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...tossed a career-high 119 pitches.

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-1 with a 2.21 ERA (53.0 ip, 40 h, 17 r, 13 er, 16 bb, 45 so, 4 hr) in eight career starts...is 3-0 with a 0.98 ERA (3 er in 27.2 ip) in four starts at Safeco Field and 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (10 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...went 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA (33.2 ip, 29 h, 13 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 26 so) in five starts last year.

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-2, 4.33 ERA): Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...is 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA and .326 opponents batting average in two starts since then...the A's are 1-4 (.200) in his five starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-7 A's loss at Minnesota last Monday (5.0 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA in two career starts against Seattle...including a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-7 A's loss in 10 innings in Oakland April 12 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...went 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117.
