ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight games to fall seven games under .500 for the first time since June 13, 2012 when they were 28-35...have not been eight games under .500 since June 12, 2012 (27-35)...the A's 12-19 (.387) record is second worst in the American League and is their worst record after 31 games since the 2001 club started 11-20...are in fifth place in the American League West for the first time this season and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 7½ games...that is tied for the A's third largest deficit after 31 games since the start of divisional play in 1969 (12 in 2001, 9½ in 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 1-9 in one-run games with the 4-3, 11-inning loss last night at Seattle...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-2)...are now 0-5 in extra inning games and have the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are the most in the majors and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-13 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors...won 2-1 Tuesday at Minnesota for their first one-run victory of the season...it was their first one-run win since a 3-2 victory at Seattle Sept. 13, 2014 and it snapped an Oakland record tying 10-game losing streak in one run games (also: June 19-July 11, 1986).

OFFENSE: The A's are tied for second in the American League in runs scored (148), are third in triples (7), tied for fourth in extra base hits (89), are fifth in fewest strikeouts (200) and sixth in batting average (.261)...are batting .298 (82-for-275) with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth...are tied for the second most grounded into double plays (27).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in seven of the last 13 games and are 3-5 with a 4.96 ERA (41 er in 74.1 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.57 ERA (72 er in 181.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.37)...also rank second in innings pitched (181.2) and third in fewest home runs (15)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.14 ERA (21 er in 88.1 ip) in 13 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-9 with a 4.92 ERA (51 er in 93.1) in 18 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.53 ERA (43 er in 70.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the highest May ERA in the American League after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...have the second most walks (98) for the season but have the fourth most strikeouts (245)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last six games (seven errors total) and have a Major League leading 28 errors for the season...the errors have led to 18 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the majors (Washington, 25)...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is four more than any other team.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 17-for-20 (85.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past seven attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-5 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-1)...went 5-5 on the first road trip and have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips, including this trip...have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Orioles, Angels)...are 8-10 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...are tied

for the second worst home record in the American League (Texas, 3-9)...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Boston (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 20 of their 27 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-9 (.100) in day games...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for second in losses...defeated Texas last Sunday afternoon after losing each of their first eight day games...have a 11-10 (.524) record at night...are batting .250 (87 for 348) with 40 runs scored during the day (4.00 per game) compared to .265 (198 for 746) with 108 runs scored at night (5.14 per game)...have hit 22 of their 27 home runs at night...have surrendered 16 home runs in 21 night games compared to 12 in 10 day games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tonight...have faced a right-hander in each of their last 13 games and have not faced a lefty since April 24 (Keuchel)...are 11-15 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-4 in games started by a lefty...are batting .272 (245-for-902) with 25 of their 27 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .208 (40-for-192) off left-handers.

THIS AND THAT: Are 6-4 in the first game of a series compared to 1-8 in the final game of a series...are 10-7 when scoring first, 2-12 when the opponent scores first...are 11-9 when scoring four or more runs, 1-10 when scoring fewer than four...have been successful in 3-of-9 (33.3%) replay challenges...have been out-scored 130-64 in their 19 losses (6.8 to 3.4) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Nolin and Parker are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-1...lost last night in Seattle after losing two of three in Oakland...lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 39-41 against Seattle since 2011...all-time, the A's are 322-248 (.565) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 177-109 in Oakland, 144-138 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick ranks third in the American League in on-base percentage (.418), fifth in batting (.345) and sixth in slugging percentage (.598)...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .481 (13-for-27) with runners in scoring position, which leads the AL and ranks fourth in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1988** Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-2, 4.33 ERA)

FIRST THREE, LAST TWO: Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...is 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) and .326 (14-for-43) opponents batting average in two starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .167 (8-for-48) against right-handed hitters compared to .339 (19-for-56) against left-handers...the opponents clean-up hitter is 1-for-10...opponents are batting .370 (10-for-27) when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-4 (.200) in his five starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his five starts this year...has also walked two batters or fewer in all five starts...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

THIRD START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 29...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota last Monday...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...also tossed a career-high 104 pitches...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own.

HAHN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 9 so) in two career starts...including a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-7 A's loss in 10 innings in Oakland April 12 (see second start above)...the win came last year in 4-1 Padres victory at San Diego on June 19 in his third Major League start...shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first four innings before allowing an unearned run in the fifth...Cano had a RBI single following a Cabrera error...the Padres were shutout on two hits over the first six innings before scoring four times in the seventh for the win.

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 4-0 record and a 2.56 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...had a 2.14 ERA over the first five innings of a game, 6.75 from the sixth inning on.

MORE WITH SAN DIEGO: Was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time June 3 and made his ML debut that evening against Pittsburgh (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...was the losing pitcher in a 4-1 decision and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day...recalled for the second time June 14 and went 5-1 with a 1.46 ERA in six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...singled in the fourth inning off Zack Wheeler June 14 at New York (NL) for his first Major League hit...struck out a career-high nine batters in 5.0 innings June 30 against Cincinnati, including a stretch of seven consecutive outs recorded via strikeout...was 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in five starts in June...the wins tied for the most in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher...the opponents average was second lowest of any qualifying rookie pitcher in any month in Padres history, behind only the .188 mark put up by Eric Nolte in August of 1987...his ERA was 10th lowest by a rookie pitcher in any month in franchise history (min 25.0 ip)...recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3-30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...then went 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts in July...allowed a .172 batting average and .230 slugging percentage, which were the lowest in franchise history during the month of July...was recalled the third time July 25 and went 2-1 with a 3.99 ERA in five starts before being optioned to San Antonio Aug. 19...picked up his seventh win of the season in his ninth start on July 30 against St. Louis...his seven wins through nine career appearances were the most in Padres franchise history...recalled for the final time Aug. 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever...appeared in just two games (5.40 ERA) and did not pitch after Sept. 6.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (1-2, 1.80 ERA): Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-2 with a 2.45 ERA in three starting assignments...is 1-1 with a save, a 0.50 ERA and .156 opponents batting average in four games, two starts, on the road...has a 0-1 record, a 5.14 ERA and .280 opponents average in three games, one start, at home...picked up his first win since July 23, 2014 in his last start, a 2-1 decision at Minnesota on Tuesday (7.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-2 with a 2.48 ERA in 12 career appearances, including three starts, against Seattle...including a relief appearance this year on April 11 in Oakland (0.2 ip)...went 3-0 with a 3.27 ERA in six games, five starts, this spring.

- Has a 5.19 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.32).
