OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-20) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (13-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a season-high tying four straight games (also: April 23-26)...the last time the A's lost more than four straight was Aug. 13-17, 2014 when they lost five in a row...are eight games under .500 for the first time since June 12, 2012 (27-35)...have not been nine games under .500 since June 10, 2012 (26-35)...the A's 12-20 (.375) record is second worst in the American League (Cleveland, 10-19) and their worst record after 32 games since the 2001 club also started 12-20 (won game 33)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 8½ games...that is the A's third largest deficit after 32 games since the start of divisional play in 1969 (11 in 2001, 10½ in 1979)...after 33 games, the 1979 club trailed by 11½ games, the 2001 club trailed by 11 and the 2009 club trailed by 7½...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and two days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high four errors last night, which was their most in a game since Aug. 22, 2012 against Minnesota when they also made four...have committed at least one error in each of the last seven games (11 errors total) and have a Major League leading 32 errors for the season...the errors have led to 20 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Washington, 25)...A's outfielders have committed nine of the errors, which is three more than any other team.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in eight of the last 14 games and are 3-6 with a 5.08 ERA (45 er in 79.2 ip) over that span...had a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 games and have a 3.66 ERA (76 er in 187.0 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.40)...are tied for second in fewest home runs (15) and are third in innings pitched (187.0)...Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.14 ERA (21 er in 88.1 ip) in 13 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-10 with a 5.02 ERA (55 er in 98.2) in 19 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.54 ERA (48 er in 78.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the second highest May ERA in the American League (Cleveland, 5.66) after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...are tied for the second most walks (104) for the season but have the fourth most strikeouts (251)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

OFFENSE: The A's are third in the American League in runs scored (150) and triples (7), fifth in extra base hits (90) and fewest strikeouts (213) and sixth in batting average (.260)...are batting .290 (83-for-286) with runners in scoring position, which ranks fifth...are tied for the second most ground-ed into double plays (27).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 19-for-22 (86.4%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League...have been caught stealing in three of their past nine attempts after starting the season a perfect 13-for-13...since caught stealing became an official stat in 1920, the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive stolen bases without being caught was the longest such streak in Athletics history...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 1-9 in one-run games with the 4-3, 11-inning loss Friday at Seattle...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-2)...are now 0-5 in extra inning games and have the most extra inning losses in the majors...are 0-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are the most in the majors and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-13 in games decided by two runs or fewer...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-6 on their second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-2)...went 5-5 on the first road trip and have now finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips, including this trip...have not had a winning road trip since going 5-4 on a three-city trip June 3-11, 2014 (Yankees, Ori-

oles, Angels)...are 8-11 on the road compared to 4-9 at home...have the third worst home record in the American League...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Boston (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...the A's 4-9 home start matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...have hit 21 of their 28 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-9 (.100) in day games...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are third in losses...defeated Texas a week ago today after losing each of their first eight day games...have a 11-11 (.500) record at night...are batting .250 (87 for 348) with 40 runs scored during the day (4.00 per game) compared to .265 (208 for 785) with 110 runs scored at night (5.00 per game)...have hit 23 of their 28 home runs at night...have surrendered 16 home runs in 22 night games compared to 12 in 10 day games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher last night (Happ)...that snapped a 13-game stretch where the A's faced only right-handed starters dating back to April 24 (Keuchel)...are 11-15 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-5 in games started by a lefty...are batting .274 (250-for-914) with 26 of their 28 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .205 (45-for-219) off left-handers.

THIS AND THAT: Are 6-4 in the first game of a series compared to 1-8 in the final game of a series...are 10-7 when scoring first, 2-13 when the opponent scores first...are 11-9 when scoring four or more runs, 1-11 when scoring fewer than four...have been successful in 3-of-9 (33.3%) replay challenges...have been out-scored 137-66 in their 20 losses (6.9 to 3.3) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Nolin is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...finished April 6½ games out of first place, matching the second largest A's deficit at the end of April since divisional play began in 1969...were also 6½ games out in 2012 and 1979 and were 12 out in 2001.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-1...have lost both games in Seattle and two of three in Oakland...lost the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-6 in Oakland and 5-4 in Seattle...hit .212 and averaged 3.16 runs per game, both of which were the A's lowest single season marks ever against the Mariners...however, the pitching staff had a 2.72 ERA and held Seattle to a .216 batting average...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...however, are 39-42 against Seattle since 2011...all-time, the A's are 322-249 (.564) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .575 mark (min. 20 games)...are 177-109 in Oakland, 144-139 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns has hit safely in six of his eight games, including four two-hit games...**Marcus Semien** recorded a season-high tying three hits last night (two times) and is now 23-for-68 (.338) with eight multiple hit games over his last 17 contests...has 12 multiple hit games for the season, which is tied for seventh in the AL...**Eric Sogard** is 10-for-32 (.313) on the road trip.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in **2007** Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-2, 1.80 ERA)

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-2 with a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip) in three starting assignments... is now 9-10 with a 3.71 ERA (63 er in 152.2 ip) in 26 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances...began the 2014 season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a save, a 0.50 ERA (1 er in 18.0 ip) and .156 (10-for-64) opponents batting average in four games, two starts, on the road...has a 0-1 record, a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) and .280 (7-for-25) opponents average in three games, one start, at home.

THIS AND THAT: Has issued seven of his eight walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are batting .226 (12-for-53) with the bases empty compared to .139 (5-for-36) with runners on base...has a .122 (5-for-41) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (12-for-48) after that...opponents are 5-for-45 (.111) with two strikes...has not allowed an earned run in 13.1 innings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

IN APRIL: Went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins... ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 (24 er in 80.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota on Tuesday...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

CHAVEZ vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-2 with a 2.48 ERA (29.0 ip, 28 h, 10 r, 8 er, 11 bb, 26 so, 1 hr) in 12 career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip) in eight games, one start, at Safeco Field and 0-1 with a 3.21 ERA (5 er in 14.0 ip) in four games, two starts, in Oakland...faced the Mariners once this year and it came in relief April 11 in Oakland (0.2 ip)...entered the game in the top of the 11th inning with the A's trailing 5-4 and retired the only two batters he faced...went 0-2 with a 4.15 ERA (17.1 ip, 22 h, 9 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 13 so) in three starts last year...the no decision came in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win in Oakland April 3...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...then took the loss in an 8-3 decision at Seattle May 6...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 but he allowed a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth and left trailing 4-2... also took the loss in a 6-2 decision at Seattle July 12...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 5.2 innings...yielded a RBI single to Ackley in the second inning and a two-run home run to Seager in the fifth...Iwakuma shut out the A's on three hits over the first eighth innings before Moss hit a two-run home run in the ninth.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline... went 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .253 opponents batting average, including .247 (78-for-316) against left-handed hitters compared to .260 (64-for-246) against right-handers...allowed 17 home runs, 12 of which were solo shots...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that...yielded a .208 average with RISP and two outs...opponents reached base on an error eight times, which tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed a .303 batting average over his first 15 pitches in game, .213 from pitches 16-60 and .281 after that...held the number six hitter to a .119 batting average, which was second lowest in the AL, but the number eight hitter batted .393, which was the highest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 15 games in Oakland compared to 3-6 with a 4.12 ERA in 17 games on the road...yielded just four home runs in 67.1 innings in Oakland compared to 13 in 78.2 innings on the road.

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-1, 2.75 ERA): Allowed six runs in 6.0 innings in his last start after yielding six runs in 33.1 innings over his first five starts (1.62 ERA)...is now 2-1 with a 2.75 ERA over his first six starts...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA over his first six starts last year...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and no home runs in two starts in Oakland compared to 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA and five home runs in four starts on the road...has allowed a .259 batting average with the bases empty compared to .107 with runners on base...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 13-0 A's loss at Minnesota last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 9-8 with a 3.98 ERA in 27 career starts against Boston...the starts and losses are his most against any team...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, a 4-2 A's win in Oakland June 19 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 8 so)...went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts.

- Has a 5.14 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.47).
- Has a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) in the A's 12 wins, a 7.02 ERA (52 er in 66.2 ip) in their 20 losses.
- Has nine losses, which is tied with Seattle for the most in the majors... has been charged with the loss in nine of the A's last 18 defeats.
- Has allowed 24-of-61 (39.3%) of inherited runners to score, which is the highest percentage in the AL and fourth highest in the majors.
- Has allowed 13 home runs, which is third most in the AL (six solo homers and six three-run homers).
