OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-21) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (14-17)

MONDAY, MAY 11, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP SCOTT KAZMIR (2-1, 2.75) VS. RHP RICK PORCELLO (3-2, 4.38) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept in a three-game series at Seattle over the weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26)...now have a season-high five-game losing streak, which matches the longest losing streak from last year (Aug. 13 to 17)... have lost more than five straight games just once over the last four years (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...are 12-21 (.364) overall, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...it matches the 1979 A's for the second worst record after 33 games in Oakland history... the 1994 A's started the year 9-24 (lost game 34 in 1979 and 1994)...are nine games under .500 for the first time since June 10, 2012 (26-35). have not been more than nine games under .500 since finishing the 2011 season 14 under (74-88)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 81/2 games for the second consecutive day...that is the A's third largest deficit after 33 games since the start of divisional play in 1969 (111/2 in 1979, 11 in 2001)... have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and three days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last four losses and six of the last eight have been by one run...are 1-10 in one-run games...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-2)...are tied for second in the American League in one-run games...are 0-5 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied for second in games...are 0-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are the most in the majors and the A's are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-14 in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Atlanta and Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last eight games, including a season-high four on Saturday...the four-error game was the A's first since Aug. 22, 2012 against Minnesota when they also made four...have 12 errors in the last eight games and 33 overall, which is six more than any other team (Cubs, 27)...the errors have led to 20 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (Washington, 25).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Boston (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles (1-2), matching the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history...are 4-9 (.308) at home for the season, which is tied with Colorado for the second worst home record in the majors (Texas, 3-9)...it also matches the worst record after 13 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2000, 2001)...the 1968 and 2001 clubs fell to 4-10...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips...are 8-12 (.400) on the road...have hit 24 of their 31 home runs on the road.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-7 with a 5.11 ERA (49 er in 86.1 ip) over the last 15 games after going 7-5 with a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 3.72 ERA (80 er in 193.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.32)...have surrendered the second fewest home runs in the AL (15) and rank third in innings pitched (193.2)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.14 ERA (21 er in 88.1 ip) in 13 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-11 with a 5.04 ERA (59 er in 105.1) in 20 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .203 (36-for-177) with 13 runs scored and 10 walks during their current five-game losing streak...however, have scored 153 runs for the season, which ranks third in the American League...are also third in triples (7)...are 5-for-34 (.147) with runners in scoring position during the current losing streak...however, are hitting .290 (83-for-286) with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.44 ERA (52 er in 86.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the highest May ERA in the American League (Cleveland, 5.66) after posting the fourth lowest mark in April... have a 4.18 ERA overall, which ranks 10th in the AL...have finished in the top four in ERA 15 times over the previous 16 seasons...rank fourth in the

AL in strikeouts (258) but are tied for second with Boston in most walks (108)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last five stolen base attempts and are 19-for-22 (86.4%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied for second in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-10 (.091) in day games compared to 11-11 (.500) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .244 (93-for-381) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.91 per game) compared to .265 (208-for-785) with 110 runs at night (5.00 per game)...have hit 23 of their 31 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in 14 of the last 15 games...are 11-16 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-5 in games started by a lefty...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .271 (256-for-944) with 29 of their 31 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .203 (45-for-222) off left-handers...rank third in the American League in batting average against righties and have the second worst mark against lefties (Boston, .190).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 3-7 (.300) in May, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, 2-7)...went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record.

THIS AND THAT: The A's face an American League East team for the first time this year tonight...went 20-12 against the East last year, which was the A's best record against any American League division...are 6-4 in the first game of a series compared to 1-9 in the final game of a series...are 10-8 when scoring first, 2-13 when the opponent scores first...are 11-9 when scoring four or more runs, 1-12 when scoring fewer than four...have been successful in 3-of-9 (33.3%) replay challenges...have been outscored 141-69 in their 21 losses (6.7 to 3.3) and have out-scored the opposition 84-15 in their 12 wins (7.0 to 1.3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Nolin is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's won the season series last year, 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Boston...have won two of the previous three season series against the Red Sox and are 15-7 against Boston over that span... including 11-2 in Oakland...since the start of the 2007 season, the A's are 35-32 against the Red Sox...that breaks down to 24-9 in Oakland, 10-22 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 234-281 since moving to Oakland in 1968... that includes 140-116 in Oakland, 93-164 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 876-1062 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Marcus Semien had the first two-homer game of his career yesterday... it was the first two-homer game by an A's shortstop since May 21, 2004 (Crosby)...has back-to-back three-hit games and is now batting .361 (26-for-72) with nine multiple hit games over his last 18 games...Stephen Vogt is batting .321 (9-for-28) with four home runs and 11 RBI in nine games in May...is tied for first in the American League in May home runs and ranks second in RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** Al Simmons drives in a run for the 11th consecutive game as Lefty Grove defeats Chicago, 5-2 en route to a 31-win season...the win moves the A's into first place for good as the Athletics win their third straight American League pennant...in **2012** Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931...in **2014** Derek Norris hits two three-run home runs on a 3-0 count in consecutive innings in the A's 9-1 win over Washington.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-1, 2.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Allowed six runs in 6.0 innings in his last start after yielding six runs in 33.1 innings over his first five starts (1.62 ERA)...is now 2-1 with a 2.75 ERA over his first six starts...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA over his first six starts last year (was 4-1, 2.64 after seven starts).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in opponents batting average (.199), eighth in strikeouts (40) and ninth in on-base percentage (.268).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and no home runs in two starts in Oakland compared to 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA (12 er in 25.1 ip) and five home runs in four starts on the road...has tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home...is the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .259 (22-for-85) batting average with the bases empty compared to .107 (6-for-56) with runners on base... opponents are 3-for-23 (.130) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-11 with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are 8-for-75 (.107) with two strikes...last year, he ranked sixth in the American League among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title in opponents batting average with RISP (.196) and opponents average with two strikes (.146)...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-16 (.063)... has yielded a .342 (13-for-38) average and four of his five home runs to batters leading off an inning.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (9 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in April...his April ERA ranked fourth in the American League...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April in 2014 and is now 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April over the last two seasons.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts against American League West opponents compared to 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (8 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts against everyone else...last year, he went 4-4 with a 4.71 ERA against the West, 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all six starts...started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts...that matched the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss

FOURTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston April 24 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th.

at Texas May 1...allowed leadoff home runs to Blanks in the second inning and Fielder in the fourth inning...Smolinski added a sacrifice fly in the fourth and Kazmir left after six innings trailing 3-0...the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win.

FIFTH START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota last Wednesday...allowed four runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Rosario, RBI singles by Hunter and Plouffe and a sacrifice fly by Escobar...yielded two more runs in the sixth inning on a two-run home run by Escobar...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits.

KAZMIR vs. BOSTON: Is 9-8 with a 3.98 ERA (151.2 ip, 140 h, 73 r, 67 er, 80 bb, 157 so, 17 hr) in 27 career starts...the starts and losses are his most against any team...is 6-5 with a 3.89 ERA (38 er in 88.0 ip) in 16 starts at Fenway Park and 3-3 with a 4.10 ERA (29 er in 63.2 ip) in 11 starts in his home ballparks...was the winning pitcher in his only start last year, a 4-2 A's win in Oakland June 19...blanked the Red Sox on two hits over the first five innings before allowing a two-run home run to Pedroia in the sixth...had a 3-0 lead at the time.
