YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Red Sox defeated the Blue Jays at Rogers Centre, 6-3, in the final game of a 3-game series to avoid being swept...Boston scored 4 times in the top of the 1st and never trailed...5 of Boston's 6 runs came on a pair of homers by Mike Napoli (3-run in 1st inning) and Pablo Sandoval (2-run in 5th inning)...It snapped a 9-game streak in which Boston was held to 5 runs or less.

- Clay Buchholz earned the win, holding Toronto to 3 runs in 6.1 IP, with the final run coming in when Junichi Tazawa allowed an inherited runner to score... Buchholz's 2.30 ERA at Rogers Centre leads all active starters at the park (min. 10 GS) and his 9 wins at Rogers Centre top all active pitchers as a visitor.
- Koji Uehara pitched a scoreless 9th inning for his 6th save of the season, 53rd as a Red Sox, and 67th of his major league career...It was his 100th career save between MLB and his career in Nippon Professional Baseball (33 saves).

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox have lost 3 of their last 5 contests and have dropped 7 of their last 9 games, being outscored 42-22 in that latter stretch, which began with a season-long 4-game losing streak to start the month of May...Boston has lost 12 of its last 17 and 14 of its last 21 games after a 7-3 start to the year.

- The Sox are in 4th place in the AL East, a season-hightying 5.5 games back for a 3rd straight day, trailing the first-place Yankees (20-12)...The Sox are 3 games under .500, 1 shy of their season-high (4 games under .500 at 13-17 after Saturday's loss).
- 10 of the Red Sox' last 18 games have been decided by 2 runs or less (4-6)...That stretch includes 5 one-run games (2-3), 3 of which ended in walk-offs (1-2).
- Boston is 1-6-0 in its past 6 sets after going undefeated in its first 4 series (3-0-1) for the first time since 1981 (started 2-0-3)...That start included wins in their first 3 series for the first time since 1952 (won first 6 series).

THE NEW COACH: On Saturday night, the Red Sox announced Carl Willis as their major league pitching coach.

Willis, 54, began the year as pitching coach for Triple-A Columbus (CLE) and has 11 years of experience as a major league pitching coach between the Indians (2003-09) and Mariners (August 2010-13)...On Thursday, the Sox relieved Juan Nieves of his duties as pitching coach.

GO WEST: Yesterday, the Red Sox ended a 22-game stretch against AL East opponents that began on 4/17 over which the club went 8-14...The Sox are 10-15 overall this year against AL East foes and tonight play their first game of the season against an AL team outside of the East Division.

- Including 6 games against the NL East (4-2), Boston has played all 31 games of the season against teams based in either the AL East or the NL East.
- Tonight's game will be Boston's first of the season played outside of the Eastern Time Zone.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Friday began a season-long 10game road trip that will carry the team through 5/17...The Sox dropped 2 of 3 in Toronto and now play 3 in Oakland before heading to Seattle for 4...They are off on 5/18 and open a 6-game homestand the following day.

Boston has dropped 6 of its last 8 road games after winning 5 of its first 7 games away from Fenway Park...They scored 34 runs over their opening 6-game road trip (5.7 R/G) but have crossed the plate 32 times in their 9 road games since (3.6 R/G).

YARD WORK: The Red Sox rank 6th in the AL with 34 home runs this season, but have homered in 21 different games, the 4th-most games with a HR in the AL.

The Sox have homered in 13 of their last 17 games dating back to 4/22 and rank 2nd in the AL with 21 HR in that span, trailing only Houston (27). **FACING THE A'S:** Today Boston and Oakland begin their 6-game season series with the first of a 3-game set at 0.co Coliseum...They will face off 3 times at Fenway Park, 6/5-7.

- Boston is 6-7 against the A's since the start of 2013 but has failed to record a winning record against Oakland in each of the last 3 seasons (3-4 in 2014, 3-3 in 2013, 1-8 in 2012).
- Red Sox starting pitchers have recorded quality starts in 9 of their last 10 meetings with the A's dating back to 7/12/13...Boston starters are 3-2 with a 2.60 ERA (19 ER/65.2 IP) in those 10 games.
- The Sox have dropped 5 of 7 road games in Oakland since the start of 2013 and are just 2-11 here beginning in 2012...Boston has gone 0-7-1 in its last 8 road series against the A's since taking 3 of 4 to open the 2008 season (1-1 in Tokyo, 2-0 in Oakland)...The Sox last won a road series of at least 3 games here in taking 2 of 3 in Oakland from 7/24-26/06.

MOOKIE MAGIC: Mookie Betts went 1-for-4, R, 3B, BB last night to extend his current career-high hitting streak to 8 games (.303, 10-for-33, 4 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 4 RBI, 3 BB), the longest active streak on the team...Betts has at least 1 XBH in 7 of those 8 games (8 XBH total, 4 2B, 3B, 3 HR).

Betts is tied for the AL lead with 10 extra-base hits beginning on 4/27 (also 3 other players)...In that time, he has hit .320 (16-for-50) with 9 runs, and 9 RBI.

RICK ROLLS: Tonight's starter Rick Porcello, who tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in his last outing on 5/5 vs. TB, has not allowed a run in his last 12.0 IP dating back to the 3rd inning on 4/29 vs. TOR...Among AL starters, only MIN's Kyle Gibson has a longer active scoreless streak (17.0 IP).

RELIEF WORKS: The Sox have used 12 relievers this year, combining for 108.2 relief innings, 3rd most in the majors behind Texas (110.2 IP) and Tampa (110.1 IP).

The club is undefeated when carrying a lead into the 8th inning (11-0) or 9th inning (11-0).

TWO-OUT PRODUCTION: The Red Sox have scored 64 runs with 2 outs, 3rd most in the AL (T-4th in MLB) behind New York (67) and Kansas City (66)...This season, the Sox have scored 47% of the team's total of 135 runs with 2 out.

- With 2 out this season, Boston has hit .266 (96-for-361), .358 OBP, .443 SLG, .802 OPS...All those marks rank 2nd in the AL among 2-out production, trailing only KC (.304 AVG, .360 OBP, .459 SLG, .819 OPS).
- The Sox rank 2nd in the AL with 14, 2-out HR (HOU, 15), accounting for 41% of the team's 32 HR overall.

TAKING ADVANTAGE: This year Boston's opponents have committed 35 errors, leading to a total of 24 unearned Red Sox runs, 18% of the club's 135 total runs scored this year.

Both the errors committed and unearned runs allowed are the most by opponents of any MLB team this year.

EXTRAS FAR: Hanley Ramirez, who missed 3 games with a left shoulder sprain from 5/5-8, still ranks T-3rd in the majors with 10 home runs, trailing only SEA's Nelson Cruz (14) and WSH's Bryce Harper (11).

Ramirez has yet to record a double or a triple, meaning all 10 of his extra-base hits this season have left the yard...According Elias, he is the first to homer for his first 10 extra-base hits of a season since Mark McGwire did it in 1990 (HR for first 10 XBH).

A DECADE AGO: It was 10 years ago today that Jason Varitek hit a walk-off 2-run homer in the bottom of the 9th inning off Oakland closer Octavio Dotel, one day after Dotel surrendered a walk-off homer to Kevin Millar...Both HR came with 1 out and David Ortiz on 1B after walking.

The only other time the Sox ever hit walk-off HR in back-to-back games came in 1935, with Wes Ferrell connecting for both on 7/21 vs. DET and 7/22 vs. SLB.

TONIGHT'S START:

Is making his 7th start of the season and 3rd on the road...In 2014, posted the AL's 6th-lowest road ERA (2.66) and tied Phil Hughes for the AL's 2nd-most road victories (9), trailing only James Shields (10).

▲ Is 19-7 with a 3.11 ERA (68 ER/196.2 IP) in his career during the month of May... His .731 winning percentage during the month is the best among active pitchers with at least 25 decisions in May.

▲ Is 1 of only 3 ML starting pitchers with 7.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer runs allowed in each of his last 2 starts, joining CIN's Mike Leake and NYY's Michael Pineda.

• His 0.64 ERA (1 ER/14.0 IP) since 4/29 is tied with TEX's Colby Lewis for the 3rdbest mark among AL starters in that span (min. 12.0 IP), behind MIN's Kyle Gibson (0 ER/14.0 IP) and KC's Chris Young (0 ER/13.1 IP).

Has produced an 8.08 SO/9.0 IP ratio this season, ranking 6th among AL East starters (12th in AL)...His 8.55 SO/9.0 IP ratio in his last 3 starts ranks 4th in the AL since 4/24 (min. 20.0 IP).

• With 35 SO, ranks 4th among AL pitchers with less than 40.0 IP in 2015 (T-13th overall in AL)...Has 6+ SO in each of his last 5 starts, the longest such of his career.

4 This season, has allowed just 11 extra-base hits (only 1 in his last 2 outings), 5th fewest among AL East starters (min. 35.0 IP)...Has permitted the 3rd fewest base runners (21) in the AL over his last 3 starts since 4/24 (min. 20.0 IP).

Leads all Red Sox starting pitchers in wins (3-2), IP (39.0), ERA (4.38), and WHIP (1.23)...In his last 3 starts since 4/24 at BAL, has gone 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 ER/20.0 IP) and 1.00 WHIP (16 H, 4 BB).

Last start: Recorded 7.0 shutout innings on Tuesday vs. TB, his 1st scoreless appearance of the season...Has pitched 12.0 consecutive scoreless innings dating back to his start on 4/29 vs. TOR.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

Is 4-5 with a 3.73 ERA (26 ER/62.2 IP) in 11 career games (10 starts) vs. OAK...Has a 2-0 mark and 1.08 ERA (2 ER/16.2 IP) in 3 games (2 starts) since the start of 2013...Last faced the A's on 7/1/14 with DET at Comerica Park, when he tossed a 4-hit shutout. (9.0 IP, 4 H, 0 ER, 0 BB, 0 SO).

2014 & CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Set career-bests in wins (15-13), ERA (3.43), and innings (204.2) in his final season with DET...Also tied career highs with 32 appearances and 31 starts...Led the AL with 3 SHO while finishing T-2nd in complete games (3), 8th in BB/9.0 IP ratio (1.8), T-8th in wins, and 13th in IP...Induced 30 opponent ground into double plays, 2nd most in the majors (1st in AL)...Had the 8th-highest GB/FB ratio (1.80) in the AL.

Is the only modern ML pitcher (since 1900) that has made 25+ starts in each of his first 6 big league seasons, all before turning 26 years old...Is also 1 of only 3 modern ML pitchers to post double-digit victories in each of his first 6 seasons before turning 26 (Bert Blyleven & Dennis Eckersley).

 Has won 79 games over his 6 ML seasons from 2009-15, 10th most among AL pitchers...Is 7th in starts (186) and 10th in IP (1112.1) in the AL during that span.

- 💺 Has hit safely in his last 8 games, marking the longest streak of his career...Is the 4th-longest active streak in the American League. 8 of his last 10 hits have gone for extra bases (4 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 2 1B)...Prior to Friday's 8th-inning single, each of his previous 3 hits had been a HR...The last Red Sox leadoff hitter to record 3 HR in a span of 3 hits was Jacoby Ellsbury, who accomplished the feat from 7/20-22/11
- 🜲 Ranks among major league leadoff hitters in runs scored (18, T-4th), RBI (18, 3rd), BB (13, T-3rd), 2B (8, T-3rd), HR (5, T-2nd), and XBH (14, T-2nd).
- Homered in consecutive games for the 1st time in his career on 5/5 (2 HR) and 5/6 (1 HR) vs. TB...At 22 years and 211 days old, Betts became the youngest Red Sox to hit 3 HR in a 2-game span since Joe Lahoud hit 3 HR on 6/11/69 at MIN (22 years, 58 days).
- On Tuesday, broke up the Rays' no-hitter with a leadoff HR in the 6th inning and added a leadoff HR in the 8th, his 1st career multi-HR game...Became the youngest Red Sox player with a multi-HR game since Jim Rice (1975, 22 years old) and the youngest Sox leadoff hitter with a HR since Bobby Doerr (1939, 21 years old)...Marked the 1st time in 75 years the Red Sox won a 2-0 game in which both runs were provided by a pair of solo homers from the same player (6/23/40 at CLE-G2, Jim Tabor)...According to Elias, Betts became the 2nd leadoff hitter in MLB history to hit at least 2 HR and drive in all of his team's runs in a shutout.
