OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-22) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (15-17)

TUESDAY, MAY 12, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP DREW POMERANZ (1-3, 5.12) VS. RHP JUSTIN MASTERSON (2-1, 5.18) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to six games last night, which is an on-going season high and the longest losing streak in the American League this year...it is the longest losing streak by an A's team since the 2012 club lost nine straight from May 22-June 1, 2012...the streak has dropped the A's 10 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2011 season 14 games under (74-88)...are 12-22 (.353), which is the second worst record in the majors (Philadelphia, 11-22)...it matches the 1979 A's for the second worst record after 34 games in Oakland history... the 1994 A's started the year 9-25 (lost game 35 in 1979 and 1994)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high nine games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and four days in fifth...were swept in a three-game series at Seattle last weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-4 in 11 innings last night...four of the A's last five losses and seven of the last nine have been by one run...are 1-11 (.083) in one-run games...the 11 losses are four more than any other team...have the second worst one-run record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-2) and are second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 15)...fell to 0-6 in extra inning games with the loss last night...the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with Seattle for the most games...dropped to 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-15 (.118) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Atlanta and Toronto for the most such losses in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last nine games, including a season-high four on Saturday at Seattle...the four-error game was the A's first since Aug. 22, 2012 against Minnesota when they also made four...have 13 errors in the last nine games and 34 overall, which is seven more than any other team (Cubs and Brewers, 27)...the errors have led to 20 unearned runs, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Boston (0-1) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have lost eight of their last nine home games...are 4-10 (.286) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors...it also matches the worst record after 14 home games in Oakland history (1968, 2001)...the 2001 club fell to 4-11... went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road.

PITCHERS USED: Last night, Edward Mujica became the 15th A's player to make a relief appearance...the A's used just 14 relievers for the entire season in 2013 and 2014...have used 20 pitchers overall, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and two short of the season total from last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-7 with a 4.97 ERA (51 er in 92.1 ip) over the last 16 games after going 7-5 with a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 3.70 ERA (82 er in 199.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.61)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (196.1) and have surrendered the second fewest home runs (15)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.10 ERA (22 er in 94.1 ip) in 14 starts while the rest of the rotation is 4-11 with a 5.04 ERA (59 er in 105.1) in 20 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (49-for-224) with 17 runs scored and 13 walks during their current six-game losing streak...however, have scored 157 runs for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are also third in triples (7)...are 8-for-43 (.186) with runners in scoring position during the current losing streak...however, are hitting .292 (86-for-295) with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.29 ERA (57 er in 97.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the highest May ERA in the American League (Cleveland, 5.66) after posting the fourth lowest mark in April... have a 4.17 ERA overall, which ranks 10th in the AL...have finished in the top four in ERA 15 times over the previous 16 seasons...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (263) but have issued the second most walks (115)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

ON THE BASES: Scott Kazmir had the A's fourth pickoff of the season last night, which is tied with Chicago for the most in the American League...on offense, the A's have been successful in each of their last six stolen base attempts...are 20-for-23 (87.0%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Toronto, 91.3%)

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-10 (.091) in day games compared to 11-12 (.478) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .244 (93-for-381) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.91 per game) compared to .267 (221-for-829) with 114 runs at night (4.96 per game)...have hit 23 of their 31 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in 15 of the last 16 games...are 11-17 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-5 in games started by a lefty...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .272 (267-for-982) with 29 of their 31 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .206 (47-for-228) off left-handers...rank third in the American League in batting average against righties and have the second worst mark against lefties (Boston, .190).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 3-8 (.273) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 0-7)...went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001... have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Nolin is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lost the first meeting of 2015 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Boston...have won two of the previous three season series against the Red Sox and are 15-8 against Boston over that span...including 11-3 in Oakland...since the start of the 2007 season, the A's are 35-33 against the Red Sox...that breaks down to 24-10 in Oakland, 10-22 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 234-282 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 140-117 in Oakland, 93-164 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 876-1063 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns had two hits last night and now has five two-hit games in his 10 games...Josh Reddick has hit safely in each of his eight home games (13-for-27, .481), which is one short of the longest season-opening home hitting streak in Oakland history...Marcus Semien is batting .338 (26-for-77) with nine multiple hit games over his last 19 games... Stephen Vogt had two RBI last night and leads the American League with 28 for the season...nine of those RBI have either tied the game (4) or put the A's ahead (5).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1910 Chief Bender tosses a no-hitter in the A's 4-0 win over Cleveland...the future Hall of Famer walks just one and finishes the season 23-5, one of two career 20-win seasons...in 1915 catcher Wally Schang sets an AL record by throwing out six attempted base stealers...in 1978 Gary Alexander is 4 for 4 with a home run as the A's score seven times in the ninth inning to defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 10-4...in 1989 Dave Henderson hits a two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Milwaukee, 5-4...in 2000 Matt Stairs hits his fifth career walk-off home run as the A's erase a five-run deficit to defeat Seattle 9-7.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (1-3, 5.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-3 with a 6.57 ERA (18 er in 24.2 ip) and .301 (31-for-115) opponents batting average over his last five starts after tossing a career-high tying 7.0 shutouts innings while yielding just two hits in his first start...has tossed 5.1 innings or fewer in each of his last five starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 12 of his 46 career starts, including just six with six or more innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) and .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 0-3 with a 6.86 ERA (15 er in 19.2 ip) and .305 (25-for-82) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (5-for-30) batting average against left-handed hitters with no extra base hits...right-handers are batting .295 (28-for-95) with all four of his home runs...has surrendered 26 of his 29 career home runs against righties...three of his four home runs have come with runners on base, three have come with two strikes and two have been hit by the number nine hitter in the order...has issued 10 of his 11 walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 9-for-24 (.375) with runners in scoring position...has a .228 (18-for-79) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .326 (15-for-46) average with two outs.

THIS AND THAT: Has two pickoffs and is tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs...had just one pickoff in 54 games entering the season...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen base attempts and are 24-for-28 (85.7%) against him in his career...the A's are 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments and are 6-10 (.3758) in his career...his teams are 16-30 (.348) in his career.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston April 15...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014... also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles April 21...allowed four runs in the second inning, all with two outs...Giavotella hit a three-run homer and a fourth run scored on a Semien error...allowed a leadoff double to Cron in the sixth inning and was relieved by Alvarez who allowed that run to score plus five of his own.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Houston in Oakland April 26...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed three runs in the third, although only one run was earned (Davis error)... allowed a two-run single to Gattis and a RBI single to Rasmus...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fourth but the A's came back to tie the game with three in the bottom of the fourth.

FIFTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss at Texas May 2...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Blanks in the bottom of the first...also yielded a Beltre RBI single in the third inning and a lead off home run to Blanks in the sixth...left after 5.1 innings with the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored six times in the seventh inning to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Minnesota last Thursday...walked a career-high tying five batters in 4.1 innings after issuing six walks over his first 27.1 innings...the A's scored twice in the second but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on just one hit...walked two and the runs scored on a fielders choice, error and sacrifice fly...Oakland scored twice in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a RBI single to Rosario in the fourth to tie the game...put runners on first and second via walk in the fifth inning and was relieved by Otero who allowed both runs to score.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...has a .181 (17-for-94) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning and opponents are hitting .181 (21-for-116) in that situation over the last three years...had a .182 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .221 with five of his seven home runs the second time and .259 after that...opponents hit .146 with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 0.60 ERA, .155 opponents batting average and one home run in innings one through three, a 4.85 ERA, .237 opponents average and five home runs in innings four through six and a 1.38 ERA, .250 opponents average and one home run from the seventh inning on...surrendered 10 of his 22 runs and four of his seven home runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA).

SPLITS: Was 1-3 with a 1.42 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 10 games on the road compared to 4-1 with a 3.48 ERA and .171 opponents average in 10 games at home...compiled a 1.17 ERA in six games during the day, 2.93 in 14 outings at night.

IN RELIEF: Stranded all three of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 0-for-9 with a walk...first batters are now 0-for-13 with a walk in his career...had just four career relief appearances entering the season... is now 1-1 with a 1.25 ERA (3 er in 21.2 ip) in 14 career relief appearances, 9-20 with a 4.67 ERA (112 er in 215.2 ip) in 46 career starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (4-0, 1.65 ERA): Has started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...is one of six undefeated pitchers in the American League with at least four wins and is tied for third in the AL in wins...also ranks second in opponents slugging percentage (.234), third in ERA (1.65), sixth in strikeouts (44), seventh in batting average (.194) and eighth in onbase percentage (.266)...won his final decision of 2014 and his five-game winning streak is one short of his career high of six...has allowed eight of his 10 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.43 ERA in inings one through three and a 0.32 ERA from the fourth inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss in 11 innings at Seattle last Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Red Sox, a start in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston last year on May 4 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Has a 5.09 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has allowed two runs or more in 18 of 34 games this season...are 1-17 when allowing two runs or more and 11-5 when allowing one run or fewer.
- Has a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) in the A's 12 wins, a 6.78 ERA (55 er in 73.0 ip) in their 22 losses.
- Has 10 losses, which is the most in the majors...four different A's relievers have two losses (Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero)...no other major league team has more than two.
- Has allowed 24-of-63 (38.2%) of inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (Cleveland, 38.8).
- Has allowed 14 home runs, which is tied for third most in the majors (eight solo homers and six three-run homers).
- Has four saves, which is tied for the fewest in the AL (Cleveland)...save percentage of 36.4% is lowest in the AL.
