YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Red Sox defeated the A's last night at O.co Coliseum, 5-4 in 11 innings, to take the opener of the middle series in a season-long 10-game trek...Boston tied the game with single runs in the 4th and 5th innings, took a brief lead with 2 runs in the 7th, and won it on Pablo Sandoval's solo homer to begin the 11th.

- Starter Rick Porcello allowed 3 runs in 5.0 IP but did not factor into the decision...Boston has now won Porcello's last 3 starts (2-0, 1.89 ERA, 4 ER/19.0 IP).
- Boston's 7th and final pitcher of the game, Matt Barnes, threw 2.0 hitless and scoreless innings to end it, earning his first major league win.
- Sandoval's 11th-inning homer was Boston's major league-leading 3rd HR in extra innings this season...It was the 5th of Sandoval's career, tied for 5th most in MLB since the start of 2009...In that time, only Nelson Cruz (9), Brian McCann (8), Matt Kemp (6), and Albert Pujols (6) have hit more home runs in extras.

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox have won their last 2 games, taking back-to-back contests for the first time since 4/20 vs. BAL and 4/21 at TB...The Sox are 3-3 in their last 6 contests but have dropped 7 of their last 10, being outscored 46-27 in that latter stretch, which began with a season-long 4-game losing streak to start the month of May...Boston has lost 12 of its last 18 and 14 of its last 22 games after a 7-3 start to the year.

- The Sox are in 4th place in the AL East, a season-high-tying 5.5 games back for a 4th straight day, trailing the first-place Yankees (21-12).
- 11 of the Red Sox' last 19 games have been decided by 2 runs or less (5-6)...That stretch includes 6 one-run games (3-3), 3 of which ended in walk-offs (1-2).
- Boston is 1-6-0 in its past 6 sets after going undefeated in its first 4 series (3-0-1) for the first time since 1981 (started 2-0-3)...That start included wins in their first 3 series for the first time since 1952 (won first 6 series).

YOUNG GUNS: Last night, all 3 of Boston's players age 23 or younger recorded 2 hits: Mookie Betts (22), Xander Bogaerts (22), and Blake Swihart (23)...It was the first time 3 Red Sox starters not yet 24 years old each had multiple hits since it occurred 3 times in 1975, last by Tim Blackwell, Dwight Evans, and Fred Lynn on 6/15/75 at KC.

- Betts, Bogaerts, and Swihart have combined to make 66 starts this season...In MLB only the Cubs have at least as many starts from players 23 or younger (78)...No other team has more than 38 (BAL).

ON THE ROAD: Tonight the Sox play the 5th game in a season-long 10-game road trip through 5/17...The Sox dropped 2 of 3 in Toronto to open the trek, and follow the current 3-game set in Oakland with a 4 in Seattle...Boston is off 5/18 prior to the start of a 6-game homestand.

- Boston has dropped 6 of its last 9 road games after winning 5 of its first 7 games away from Fenway Park...They scored 34 runs over their opening 6-game road trip (5.7 R/G) but have crossed the plate 37 times in their 10 road games since (3.7 R/G).

THE NEW COACH: On Saturday night, the Red Sox announced Carl Willis as their major league pitching coach...Willis, 54, who began the year as pitching coach for Triple-A Columbus (CLE), has 11 years of experience as a major league pitching coach between the Indians (2003-09) and Mariners (August 2010-13)...On Thursday, the Sox relieved Juan Nieves of his duties as pitching coach.

YARD WORK: The Red Sox have homered in 14 of their last 18 games dating back to 4/22...In that time, they rank T-3rd in the AL with 22 HR, trailing only Houston (27) and New York (23)...Overall this year, they have homered in 22 different games, T-3rd-most games with a HR in the AL.

FACING THE A'S: Tonight Boston and Oakland continue their 6-game season series with the 2nd of a 3-game set at O.co Coliseum...They face off 3 times at Fenway Park, 6/5-7.

- Boston is 7-7 against the A's since the start of 2013 but has failed to record a winning record against Oakland in each of the last 3 seasons (3-4 in 2014, 3-3 in 2013, 1-8 in 2012).
- Red Sox starting pitchers have recorded quality starts in 9 of their last 11 meetings with the A's dating back to 7/12/13...Boston starters are 3-2 with a 2.80 ERA (22 ER/70.2 IP) in those 11 games.
- The Sox have dropped 5 of 8 road games in Oakland since the start of 2013 and are just 3-11 here beginning in 2012...Boston has gone 0-7-1 in its past 8 road series against the A's since taking 3 of 4 to open the 2008 season (1-1 in Tokyo, 2-0 in Oakland)...The Sox last won a road series of at least 3 games here in taking 2 of 3 in Oakland from 7/24-26/06.

GO WEST: Last night's game was Boston's first of 2015 against an AL team outside the East Division...It was also the club's 1st game of 2015 outside the Eastern Time Zone.

- On Sunday, the Sox completed a 22-game stretch against divisional rivals, which began on 4/17 (8-14)...They are 10-15 overall this year against AL East foes.
- Including 6 games against the NL East (4-2), Boston played each of its first 31 games of the season (prior to the current series in Oakland) against teams based in either the AL East or the NL East.

MOOKIE MAGIC: Mookie Betts went 2-for-5, 2 RBI, BB last night to extend his current career-high hitting streak to 9 games (.316, 12-for-38, 4 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 6 RBI, 4 BB), the longest active streak on the team and, entering the day, the 4th-longest active run in the AL...Betts has at least 1 XBH in 7 of those 9 games (8 XBH total, 4 2B, 3B, 3 HR).

- Betts is T-2nd in the AL lead with 10 extra-base hits beginning on 4/27, 1 shy of KC's Eric Hosmer (11)...In that time, he has hit .327 (18-for-55) with 9 runs scored and 11 RBI.

RELIEF WORKS: 12 different Red Sox relievers have combined for the team's major league-leading 114.1 innings out of the bullpen...The club is undefeated when carrying a lead into the 8th inning (11-0) or 9th inning (11-0).

TWO-OUT PRODUCTION: The Red Sox have scored 65 runs with 2 outs, 3rd most in the AL (4th in MLB) behind New York (75) and Kansas City (67)...This season, the Sox have scored 46% of the team's total of 140 runs with 2 out.

- Boston batters own a .360 OBP with 2 out, tops in the AL in that situation...The Sox' .265 2-out AVG (99-for-373) ranks 2nd in the AL behind KC (.300).
- The Sox rank 3rd in the AL with 14, 2-out HR, trailing new York (17) and Houston (15)...That accounts for 40% of the team's 35 HR overall.

TAKING ADVANTAGE: This year Boston's opponents have committed 36 errors, leading to a total of 24 unearned Red Sox runs, 17% of the club's 140 total runs scored this year.

- Both the errors committed and unearned runs allowed are the most by opponents of any MLB team this year.

EXTRAS FAR: Hanley Ramirez, who missed 3 games with a left shoulder sprain from 5/5-8, ranks 3rd in the AL with 10 home runs, trailing only SEA's Nelson Cruz (14) and WSH's Bryce Harper (11).

- Ramirez has yet to record a double or a triple, meaning all 10 of his extra-base hits this season have left the yard...According Elias, he is the first to homer for his first 10 extra-base hits of a season since Mark McGwire did it in 1990 (HR for first 10 XBH).

🔴 Is making his 7th start of the season and 3rd on the road...Is 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP) in 2 away games in 2015...Last road start was on 4/25 at BAL, when he tossed a season-high 7.0 IP while allowing just 3 ER (no-decision).

🔴 Has produced a 2-0 record, 2.76 ERA (5 ER/16.1 IP), and .190 opponent AVG in his last 5 road games (2 starts) since 9/5/14 with STL.

🔴 Has allowed 2-or-fewer ER in 4 of 6 starts this year, registering a 3.00 ERA (8 ER/24.0 IP) in those games.

🔴 Has received the AL's 10th-highest run support average (6.00) in 2015.

🔴 Ranks 11th in the AL with a 0.55 HR/9.0 IP ratio (2 HR/33.0 IP), trailing only TB's Jake Odorizzi (0.19) in the AL East.

🔴 Is 1 of only 16 AL pitchers with 2-or-fewer HR allowed this season (min. 30.0 IP).

🔴 Owns a 51.5 GB%, the 5th-highest rate among AL East starting pitchers...Has also produced a 2.21 GB/FB ratio, the 3rd-best mark among that group.

🔴 Has limited opponents to a .182 AVG (6-for-33) when leading off an inning.

Last start: Suffered his 1st loss of the season on Wednesday vs. TB after allowing 4 ER on 7 H, 6 BB in 4.1 IP (1 SO).

🔴 Snapped a stretch of 7 unbeaten starts as a Red Sox dating back to 2009.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

🔴 In 14 career games (10 starts) vs. OAK, is 2-7 with a 6.61 ERA (46 ER/62.2 IP).

🔴 Has gone 0-5 in 7 career games (6 starts) at O.co Coliseum, producing a 6.27 ERA (26 ER/37.1 IP)...Last outing at OAK was on 3/31/14 (7.0 IP, 3 H, 0 ER, 1 BB, 4 SO).

🔴 Most recent start against the A's was on 5/18/14 with CLE at Progressive Field, when he surrendered 7 ER on 7 H, 5 BB in 4.1 IP (1 SO), suffering the loss.

🔴 In his last 5 away games vs. AL West teams, has gone 2-2 with a 2.88 ERA (11 ER/34.1 IP) and 6.82 SO/9.0 IP (26 SO).

2014 & CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

🔴 Went 7-9 with 116 SO in 128.2 IP and a career-worst 5.88 ERA in 28 outings (25 starts) between CLE and STL...Acquired by the Cardinals at the trade deadline after missing most of July due to injury.

🔴 Had a 59.2% ground ball rate in 2014, 2nd highest in the majors behind HOU's Dallas Keuchel (min. 120.0 IP)...Induced 21 GIDPs, T-12th in MLB.

🔴 Ranks 2nd in the majors with a 57.1% career GB rate since the start of 2009 (min. 1,000.0 IP), trailing only SF's Tim Hudson (58.1).

🔴 In his career, has held right-handed batters to a .221/.308/.303 line and a .611 OPS...Among pitchers that have faced at least 1,500 right-handed batters since 2008, none have produced a better opponent SLG and only LAD's Clayton Kershaw has posted a better opponent AVG (.216).

🔴 Named an AL All-Star with CLE in 2013...That year, went 14-10 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 appearances (29 starts) and recorded more SO (195) than IP (193.0).

- Has hit safely in his last 9 games, marking the longest streak of his career...Is the 4th-longest active streak in the American League and 7th-longest in the majors.
- Is batting .327 (18-for-55) with a .387 OBP and .636 SLG in his last 13 games since 4/27, striking out only 5 times against 6 BB in that span.
- Ranks among major league leadoff hitters in runs scored (18, T-5th), RBI (20, T-1st), BB (14, T-2nd), 2B (8, T-3rd), HR (5, T-2nd), and XBH (14, T-2nd).
- 8 of his last 12 hits have gone for extra bases (4 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 4 1B)...Prior to Friday's 8th-inning single, each of his previous 3 hits had been a HR...The last Red Sox leadoff hitter to record 3 HR in a span of 3 hits was Jacoby Ellsbury, who accomplished the feat from 7/20-22/11.
- Homed in consecutive games for the 1st time in his career on 5/5 (2 HR) and 5/6 (1 HR) vs. TB...At 22 years and 211 days old, Betts became the youngest Red Sox to hit 3 HR in a 2-game span since Joe Lahoud hit 3 HR on 6/11/69 at MIN (22 years, 58 days).
- On 5/5, broke up the Rays' no-hitter with a leadoff HR in the 6th inning and added a leadoff HR in the 8th, his 1st career multi-HR game...Became the youngest Red Sox player with a multi-HR game since Jim Rice (1975, 22 years old) and the youngest Sox leadoff hitter with a HR since Bobby Doerr (1939, 21 years old)...Marked the 1st time in 75 years the Red Sox won a 2-0 game in which both runs were provided by a pair of solo homers from the same player (6/23/40 at CLE-G2, Jim Tabor)...According to Elias, Betts became the 2nd leadoff hitter in MLB history to hit at least 2 HR and drive in all of his team's runs in a shutout.
