OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-22) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (15-18)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 13, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (4-0, 1.65) VS. LHP WADE MILEY (1-4, 6.91) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their losing streak at a season-high and American League high six games last night...the losing streak marked just the second time over the last four years the A's lost more than five straight (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...will be attempting to win back-to-back games for just the second time this year (April 13-14)...are 13-22 (.371), which is the second worst record in the American League...it matches the 2009 A's for the third worst record after 35 games in Oakland history...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by eight games...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days ited for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and five days in fifth...were swept in a three-game series at Seattle last weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26).

LEFT AND RIGHT: After facing a right-handed starting pitcher in 15 of the last 16 games, the A's are scheduled to face three consecutive lefties beginning today...are 12-17 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-5 in games started by a lefty...the mark against lefties is tied with Colorado for the worst in the majors...are batting .274 (279-for-1018) with 32 of their 34 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .206 (47-for-228) off left-handers...rank second in the American League in batting average against righties (Kansas City, .277) and have the second worst mark against lefties (Boston, .188).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-10 (.091) in day games compared to 12-12 (.500) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for second in losses...are batting .244 (93-for-381) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.91 per game) compared to .269 (233-for-865) with 123 runs at night (5.13 per game)...have hit 26 of their 34 home runs at night.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last 10 games, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 14 years...had a 12-game streak with an error from April 8-19, 2008... have 14 errors in the last 10 games and 35 overall, which is six more than any other team (Brewers, 29)...the errors have led to 20 unearned runs, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Four of the A's last five losses and seven of the last nine have been by one run...are 1-11 (.083) in one-run games...the 11 losses are three more than any other team. have the second worst one-run record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-2) and are tied for second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 15)...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with Seattle for the most games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-15 (.118) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied with Atlanta and Toronto for the most such losses in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-1) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have lost eight of their last 10 home games...are attempting to put together back-to-back home wins for the first time this year...are 5-10 (.333) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...it also matches the second worst record after 15 home games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2001 club started the year 4-11 (won home game 16)... went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-7 with a 4.80 ERA (53 er in 99.1 ip) over the last 17 games after going 7-5 with a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 3.66 ERA (84 er in 206.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.57)...also rank second in innings pitched (206.2) and have surrendered the second fewest home runs (15)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-1 with a 2.10

ERA (22 er in 94.1 ip) in 14 starts while the rest of the rotation is 5-11 with a 4.89 ERA (61 er in 112.1) in 21 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's are 25-for-80 (.313) in the first two games of this series after hitting .203 over the previous five games...rank second in the American League in runs (166), third in triples (8) and fourth in extra base hits (102)...are hitting .301 (92-for-306) with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.01 ERA (59 er in 106.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the third highest May ERA in the American League after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...have a 4.11 ERA overall, which ranks 10th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA 15 times over the previous 16 seasons...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (268) but are tied for the second most walks (115)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last six stolen base attempts and 20-for-23 (87.0%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Toronto, 91.3%)...A's pitchers are tied for second in the AL in pickoffs (4).

PITCHERS USED: Edward Mujica became the 15th A's player to make a relief appearance...the A's used just 14 relievers for the entire season in 2013 and 2014...have used 20 pitchers overall, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and two short of the season total from last year.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 4-8 (.333) in May, which is the second worst record in the American League (Boston, 3-8)...went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, Nolin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Nolin is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2015 after winning the season series last year, 4-3...went 3-1 in Oakland and 1-2 in Boston...have won two of the previous three season series against the Red Sox and are 16-8 against Boston over the last four years...including 12-3 in Oakland...since the start of the 2007 season, the A's are 36-33 against the Red Sox...that breaks down to 25-10 in Oakland, 10-22 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 235-282 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 141-117 in Oakland, 93-164 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 877-1063 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns had two hits Monday night and now has five two-hit games in his 10 games...Billy Butler is scheduled to make his 34th start of the season at designated hitter today, which matches Alberto Callaspo's team-leading total from last year...Josh Reddick has hit safely in each of his nine home games (17-for-32, .531), which is matches the longest season-opening home hitting streak in Oakland history...Marcus Semien is batting .354 (29-for-82) with 10 multiple hit games over his last 20 games...Stephen Vogt had two RBI last night and leads the American League with 30 for the season.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1981** Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7... Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-0, 1.65 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his first seven starts...has a 1.65 ERA, which ranks second in the American League (Keuchel, HOU 1.39)...his ERA is the lowest by an A's starting pitcher after seven starts since 1990 when Bob Welch had a 1.41 ERA and Dave Stewart had a 1.46 ERA.

4-0: Has started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...is one of five undefeated pitchers in the American League with at least four wins and is tied for fourth in the AL in wins...won his final decision of 2014 and his five-game winning streak is one short of his career high of six (twice, last: June 18-July 16, 2014)...has a 1.40 ERA (9 er in 58.0 ip) and .194 (40-for-206) opponents batting average during his current winning streak, which spans eight starts dating back to Sept. 28, 2014.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (49.0) and opponents slugging percentage (.234), third in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.18), fifth in opponents batting average (.194), sixth in strikeouts (44) and seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.266)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (4).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed eight of his 10 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.43 ERA (8 er in 21.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.32 ERA (1 er in 28.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.48 career ERA (58 er in 150.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.23 (45 er in 182.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (3 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (6 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one home run, a solo shot by a left-handed hitter (Ackley, SEA)...has yielded 13 of his 20 career home runs to lefties and 15 have come with the bases empty...is averaging 6.80 runs of support (37 rs in 49.0 ip), which is sixth highest in the American League...has not committed an error in 15 total chances...is tied for the lead among AL pitchers in putouts (6), is tied for second in total chances and ranks third in assists (9)...has tossed at least seven innings in four of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer six times...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments and are 28-22 (.560) in his career.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-0 with a 1.05 ERA (5 er in 43.0 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he was 10-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 16 starts against AL West competition compared to 4-6 with a 3.54 ERA in 17 starts against everyone else...is now 16-5 with a 2.02 ERA (43 er in 191.1 ip) in 28 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-8 with a 3.84 ERA (60 er in 140.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the American League in wins and ranked ninth in ERA...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in April.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day... he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

2015 START-BY-START: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day *April* 6...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowed one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...allowed just one base runner as far as second base

(Martin two-base error on Zobrist dropped fly ball)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle April 11 in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...the A's were shutout on three hits over the first six innings before scoring twice in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead...retired the first batter in the eighth before allowing a single to Anderson, the final batter he faced...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City April 17...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...the A's came back with two in the fourth to tie the game but he allowed a RBI single to Infante in the sixth...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles April 22...the A's scored a run in the first and after he retired the side in order in the bottom of the first, he allowed a run to score in the second when Freese doubled, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an Aybar ground out...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...the A's scored five times in the seventh and three times in the eighth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 28...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win at Texas *May 3*...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)... they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...tossed a career-high 119 pitches

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 11 innings at Seattle last Friday...it was the 50th start of his career...allowed his only run in the second inning when Seager led off with a double and scored on a Morrison single...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the bullpen blew a save in one of his start (April 11 vs. Seattle).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA in four starts (14.1 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 3 hr)...also started in a minor league game March 31...allowed a .354 (21-for-65) opponents batting average...yielded six runs in his final Cactus League start (2.2 ip) after surrendering six runs in his first three starts (11.2 ip, 4.63 ERA).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-3, 4.73 ERA): Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...is 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .324 opponents batting average in three starts since then...jas allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .193 against right-handed hitters compared to .333 against left-handers... has allowed just one home run in 32.1 innings, an average of 0.28 per nine innings...has surrendered five home runs in 105.2 career innings (0.43 per nine innings)...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his six starts this year and has tossed more than six innings in just three of his 18 career starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss at Seattle last Saturday (5.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Friday and made his Major League debut Saturday in his 10th professional season.
- Is 38-28 with a 3.76 ERA in 166 career minor league appearances, including 73 starts, in the Detroit, Philadelphia, Tampa Bay, Los Angeles (NL), St. Louis and Oakland organizations.
- Monday was his first career appearance against Boston.
