OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-23) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (14-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven of their last eight games and are a season-high tying 10 games under .500 for the second time this year (12-22 on May 11)...have not been more than 10 games under .500 since finishing the 2011 season 14 games under (74-88)...are 13-23 (.361), which is tied with Philadelphia for the second worst record in the majors (Milwaukee, 12-23)...it is the third worst record after 36 games in Oakland history behind the 1994 club (10-26, won game 37) and 1979 (12-24, lost game 37)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 9½ games...the last time the A's were at least 9½ games out before the end of May was in 2009 when they trailed by 11 games on May 30...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and seven days in fifth...snapped a season-high and AL high six-game losing streak Tuesday night...it was just the second time over the last four years the A's lost more than five straight (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series at Seattle last weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game tonight after facing a righty in 15 of their previous 16 contests...are 12-17 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-6 in games started by a lefty...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .272 (279-for-1025) with 32 of their 34 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .206 (52-for-252) off left-handers...rank third in the American League in batting average against righties and have the second worst mark against lefties (Boston, .195).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last 11 games, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 30 years...had a 12-game streak with an error from April 8-19, 2008...have 15 errors in the last 11 games and 36 overall, which is six more than any other team (Washington, 30)...the errors have led to 21 unearned runs, which is tied with Milwaukee for second most in the majors (Washington, 26).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Four of the A's last six losses and seven of the last 10 have been by one run...are 1-11 (.083) in one-run games...the 11 losses are three more than any other team...have the second worst one-run record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-3) and are tied for second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 16)...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with Seattle for the most games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland)...are 2-16 (.111) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...have three losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have lost nine of their last 11 home games...have not won consecutive home games this year...are 5-11 (.313) at home for the season, which is tied with Texas for the second worst home record in the majors (Colorado, 4-9)...it also matches the worst record after 16 home games in Oakland history (1968, 1994, 2001)...the 1994 club lost home game 17...leave following the game Sunday for a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the third time on Wednesday, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, rank third in the American League in runs scored for the season (166)...were held to a season-low tying five hits Wednesday and are now batting .229 (66-for-288) with 26 runs scored over the last eight games (3.25 runs per game)...went 0-for-14 with runners in scoring position, matching the third most hitless at bats with RISP by an A's team since 1974...are now batting .288

(92-for-320) with RISP for the season...have tripled in back-to-back games and rank third in the AL with nine for the season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-8 with a 4.49 ERA (53 er in 106.1 ip) over the last 18 games after going 7-5 with a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 3.54 ERA (84 er in 213.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.48)...have not allowed a home run in the last seven games and have surrendered just 15 for the season, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL...also rank second in innings pitched (213.2)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-2 with a 2.04 ERA (23 er in 101.1 ip) in 15 starts while the rest of the rotation is 5-11 with a 4.81 ERA (60 er in 112.1) in 21 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.62 ERA (59 er in 115.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the highest May ERA in the American League after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (279) but have issued the third most walks (116)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last six stolen base attempts and 20-for-23 (87.0%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Toronto, 91.7%)...A's pitchers rank second in the AL in pickoffs (4).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-11 (.083) in day games compared to 12-12 (.500) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the lead in losses...are batting .238 (98-for-412) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .269 (233-for-865) with 123 runs at night (5.13 per game)...have hit 26 of their 34 home runs at night.

PITCHERS USED: Edward Mujica is the 15th A's player to make a relief appearance...the A's used just 14 relievers for the entire season in 2013 and 2014...have used 20 pitchers overall, which is tied for second most in the majors and two short of the season total from last year.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 4-9 (.308) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 109)...went 9-14 in April and the .391 winning percentage tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...it was the A's worst April since going 8-17 in 2001...have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The two clubs meet for the first time in 2015 after the A's lost the season series last year, 4-3...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Chicago...have lost three of the previous four season series to the White Sox and are 15-15 over that stretch...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-276 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-131 in Oakland and 140-145 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 975-1031 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The official scorer has made another scoring change on Dustin Pedroia's at bat in the seventh inning on Tuesday...instead of a hit and error, it is now a two-base error on Muncy, making the run in that inning unearned...**Marcus Semien** is batting .353 (30-for-85) with 10 multiple hit games over his last 21 games...**Stephen Vogt** leads the American League with 30 RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958** Ned Garver tosses a seven-hit shutout and Vic Power hits a three-run home run to account for all the offense in a 3-0 Kansas City win over Chicago...in **1985** the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3...Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-3, 4.73 ERA)

FIRST THREE, LAST THREE: Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...is 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA (13 er in 15.1 ip) and .324 (22-for-73) opponents batting average in three starts since then.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .193 (11-for-57) against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (24-for-72) against left-handers...has yielded a .184 (7-for-38) average with two outs, .308 (28-for-91) with zero or one out...opponents are batting .364 (12-for-33) when leading off an inning.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 32.1 innings, an average of 0.28 per nine innings...the home run was a solo shot off a right-handed hitter (Trout, April 29 vs. LAA)...yielded four home runs in 2014, all by left-handed hitters with runners on base...has surrendered five home runs in 105.2 career innings (0.43 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) and .226 (14-for-62) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.74 ERA (10 er in 15.2 ip) and .313 (21-for-67) opponents average in three starts on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-1 with a 3.31 ERA (6 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-2 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-5 (.167) in his five starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in each of his six starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just three of his 18 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in five of his starts...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

THIRD START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 29...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota May 4...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...also tossed a career-high 104 pitches...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle last Saturday...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Cruz RBI double and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score.

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 4-0 record and a 2.56 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 3.28 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...had a 2.14 ERA over the first five innings of a game, 6.75 from the sixth inning on.

MORE WITH SAN DIEGO: Was recalled from Double-A San Antonio for the first time June 3 and made his ML debut that evening against Pittsburgh (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr)...was the losing pitcher in a 4-1 decision and was optioned back to San Antonio the following day...recalled for the second time June 14 and went 5-1 with a 1.46 ERA in six starts before being optioned to Triple-A El Paso on July 11...was 4-1 with a 1.95 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in five starts in June...the wins tied for the most in a single month by a Padres rookie pitcher...recorded 36 strikeouts through his first five career games (June 3-30), the most by any Padres pitcher to start a career...then went 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts in July...allowed a .172 batting average and .230 slugging percentage, which were the lowest in franchise history during the month of July...was recalled the third time July 25 and went 2-1 with a 3.99 ERA in five starts before being optioned to San Antonio Aug. 19...picked up his seventh win of the season in his ninth start on July 30 against St. Louis...his seven wins through nine career appearances were the most in Padres franchise history...recalled for the final time Aug. 30 and remained with the club for the remainder of the season as a reliever...appeared in just two games (5.40 ERA) and did not pitch after Sept. 6.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Chavez (1-3, 2.56 ERA): Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-3 with a 3.24 ERA (9 er in 25.0 ip) in his four starting assignments...is 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five games on the road, 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA and .280 opponents average in three games at home...has not allowed a run in the first two innings (8.0 ip) and has not yielded an earned run in the sixth inning or later (11.2 ip)...has allowed 10 of his 11 runs in the third through fifth innings (6.75 ERA)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Seattle last Sunday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.05 ERA in nine career appearances, including one start, against Chicago.

- Has a 4.90 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has allowed two runs or more in 18 of 36 games this season...are 1-17 when allowing two runs or more and 12-6 when allowing one run or fewer.
- Has a 1.08 ERA (4 er in 33.1 ip) in the A's 13 wins, a 6.60 ERA (55 er in 75.0 ip) in their 22 losses.
- Has 10 losses, which is the tied for the most in the majors (Seattle)...are the only team in the majors to have four different relievers with at least two losses (Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero).
- Has allowed 14 home runs, which is tied for third most in the American League (eight solo homers and six three-run homers).
- Has four saves, which are the fewest in the AL...save percentage of 36.4% is lowest in the AL...no other AL team is below 50.0%.
