OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-24) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (15-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and eight of the last nine games to fall to 11 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2011 season 14 games under (74-88)...are 13-24 (.351), which is the worst record in the majors and third worst in Oakland history after 37 games... the 1994 A's started the year 11-26 (lost game 38) and the 1979 club was 12-25 (lost game 38)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games...the last time the A's were at least 10½ games out before the end of May was in 2009 when they trailed by 11 games on May 30... have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and eight days in fifth...snapped a season-high and AL high six-game losing streak Tuesday night...it was just the second time over the last four years the A's lost more than five straight (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series at Seattle last weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last 12 games, which matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 32 years (third time, last: April 8-19, 2008)...have not had a longer streak since a 13-game streak from April 7-21, 1982...have 16 errors in the last 12 games and 37 overall, which is seven more than any other team (Washington and Milwaukee, 30)...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Five of the A's last seven losses and eight of the last 11 have been by one run...are 1-12 (.083) in one-run games...the 12 losses are three more than any other team...have the second worst one-run record in the majors (Cleveland, 0-3) and are second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 17)...are 2-17 (.111) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...lost for the fourth time this year when leading after six innings last night, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the AL...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with Seattle for the most games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are one of two teams without a last at bat win (Cleveland).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game tonight after facing a righty in 15 of their previous 16 contests...are 12-17 in games started by a right-handed pitcher compared to 1-7 in games started by a lefty...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .274 (283-for-1034) with 32 of their 35 home runs off right-handed pitchers compared to .214 (60-for-281) off left-handers...rank third in the AL in batting average against righties and have the second worst mark against lefties (Boston, .196).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-1) and have lost 10 of their last 12 home games...have not won consecutive home games this year...are 5-12 (.294) at home for the season, which is tied with Texas for the worst home record in the majors...it also matches the 1994 A's for worst record after 17 home games in Oakland history (lost game 18 in 1994)...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-1 with a 2.05 ERA (6 er in 26.1 ip) and .163 (15-for-92) opponents batting average on the home-stand...however, are 4-8 with a 4.39 ERA (55 er in 112.2 ip) over the last 19 games after going 7-5 with a 2.60 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 3.52 ERA (86 er in 220.0 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.51)...have not allowed a home run in the last eight games and have surrendered just 15 for the season, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL...also rank second in the AL in innings

pitched (220.0)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-2 with a 2.04 ERA (23 er in 101.1 ip) in 15 starts while the rest of the rotation is 5-11 with a 4.70 ERA (62 er in 118.2) in 22 starts.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.43 ERA (61 er in 124.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the second highest May ERA in the American League (Toronto, 4.65) after posting the fourth lowest mark in April...for the season, the A's rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (288) but have issued the third most walks (118)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .282 (42-for-149) in the first four games of the homestand after hitting .243 in 10 games on the last road trip...Josh Reddick snapped the A's 0-for-21 streak with runners in scoring position with his bases loaded triple in the fourth inning last night...the A's are now batting .284 (95-for-334) with RISP for the season...have tripled in each of the last three games and have 10 for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in the AL in runs scored (172) and fourth in batting (.261)...were shutout for the third time on Wednesday, which is tied for second most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last six stolen base attempts and 20-for-23 (87.0%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Toronto, 91.7%)...A's pitchers are tied for second in the AL with four pickoffs (Chicago, 5).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-11 (.083) in day games compared to 12-13 (.480) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the lead in losses...are batting .238 (98-for-412) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .271 (245-for-903) with 129 runs at night (5.16 per game)...have hit 27 of their 35 home runs at night.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-10 (.308) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 1-10)...went 9-14 in April and have now posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's season run differential is 0...have outscored the opponents 93-17 in their 13 wins (7.2 to 1.3) but have been outscored 155-79 in 24 losses (6.5 to 3.3)...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lost the first meeting of 2015 last night after losing the season series last year, 4-3...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Chicago...have lost three of the previous four season series to the White Sox and are 15-16 since the start of the 2011 season...have won seven of the last nine games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-277 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-132 in Oakland and 140-145 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 975-1032 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Reddick had three RBI last night and is tied with Giancarlo Stanton for the most games of three or more RBI this year (5)...Marcus Semien is batting .344 (31-for-90) with 10 multiple hit games over his last 22 games...Stephen Vogt has five pinch walks, which match the most by an Athletic over the last 15 years.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1939 the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in 1975 Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in 1986 Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in 1990 Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-3, 2.56 ERA)

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-3 with a 3.24 ERA (9 er in 25.0 ip) in his four starting assignments...is now 9-11 with a 3.78 ERA (67 er in 159.1 ip) in 27 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a save, a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) and .169 (15-for-89) opponents batting average in five games, three starts, on the road...has a 0-1 record, a 5.14 ERA (4 er in 7.0 ip) and .280 (7-for-25) opponents average in three games, one start, at home.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first two innings (8.0 ip) and has not yielded an earned run in the sixth inning or later (11.2 ip)...has allowed 10 of his 11 runs in the third through fifth innings (9 er in 12.0 ip, 6.75 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: Has issued eight of his 10 walks to right-handed hitters...has yielded five of his six extra base hits to lefties (four doubles, one home run)...has a .100 (5-for-50) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .266 (17-for-64) after that...opponents are 7-for-61 (.115) with two strikes...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-10 (.100)...has not allowed an earned run in 13.1 innings at night...the A's are 1-3 (.250) in his starting assignments this year after going 14-7 (.667) last year.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save...the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit.

IN APRIL: Went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins...ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 (24 er in 80.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error...it was the Angels only hit of the game...Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle last Sunday...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth

CHAVEZ vs. CHICAGO: Is 2-1 with a 3.05 ERA (20.2 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, including one start...is 2-0 with a 4.91 ERA (6 er in 11.0 ip) in three games, one start, in his home ballparks and 0-0 with a 0.93 ERA (1 er in 9.2 ip) in six career appearances at U.S. Cellular Field...was 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (8.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in two games, including one start, last year...picked up the win in his start, a 5-4 A's win in Oakland May 12...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Vicedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save...then pitched in relief Sept. 8 at Chicago (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 1 hr)...entered the game in the bottom of the 12th inning with the score tied 4-4...after striking out Vicedo, he allowed a walk-off home run to Flowers.

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts, overall...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013)...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that.

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-1, 2.78 ERA): Is 0-1 with a 5.50 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in three starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA and no home runs in three starts in Oakland compared to 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA and five home runs in four starts on the road...received three runs of support in his last start and receiving no run support in each of his previous three starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings to Boston on Monday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...is 3-6 with a 5.35 ERA in 12 career starts against Chicago...tossed a complete game four-hitter and walked just one batter in his only start last year, a 1-0 A's loss at Chicago (AL) Sept. 11...blanked the White Sox on one hit and one walk before Semien homered to lead off the bottom of the sixth...went 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA in four spring training starts.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 2.70 ERA (7 er in 23.1 ip) over the last eight games after posting a 7.98 ERA (39 er in 44.0 ip) its previous 15 contests...in the first 14 games of the season, the bullpen posted a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip).
- Has a 4.78 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has allowed two runs or more in 19 of 37 games this season...are 1-18 when allowing two runs or more and 12-6 when allowing one run or fewer.
- Has a 1.08 ERA (4 er in 33.1 ip) in the A's 13 wins, a 6.37 ERA (55 er in 77.2 ip) in their 22 losses.
- Has 11 losses, which are the most in the majors...are the only team in the majors to have five different relievers with at least two losses (Abad, Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero)...no other team has more than three.
