### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-25) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (16-17)

SUNDAY, MAY 17, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and nine of the last 10 games to fall to 12 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2011 season 14 games under (74-88)...are 13-25 (.342), which is the worst record in the majors and third worst in Oakland history after 38 games...the 1994 A's started the year 11-27 (lost game 39) and the 1979 club was 12-26 (won game 39)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 11½ games...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 11½ games before the end of May...the last time was in 2005 when they trailed by as many as 12½ games on May 29...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and nine days in fifth...snapped a season-high and AL high six-game losing streak Tuesday night...it was just the second time over the last four years the A's lost more than five straight (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series at Seattle last weekend, the second time they have been swept this year (vs. Houston, April 24-26).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last 13 games, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since the 1983 club also had a 13-game streak from April 7-21...the last longer streak was a 17-game streak from May 6-23, 1982...have 17 errors in the last 13 games and 38 overall, which is seven more than any other team (Texas, 31)...the errors have led to 27 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's are 1-11 (.083) in day games compared to 12-14 (.462) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied for the lead in losses...are batting .238 (98-for-412) with 43 runs scored during the day (3.58 per game) compared to .269 (252-for-936) with 132 runs at night (5.08 per game)...have hit 28 of their 36 home runs at night.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** Nine of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run and the A's are 1-13 (.077) in one-run games for the season...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-3)...are second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 17)...are 2-18 (.100) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with St. Louis and Seattle for the most games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are the only team without a last at bat win.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-4 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-2) and have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...have yet to win a home series this year (five losses, one split)...have lost 11 of their last 13 home games...have not won consecutive home games this year...are 5-13 (.278) at home for the season, which is tied with Texas for the worst home record in the majors...it also matches the 1994 A's for worst record after 17 home games in Oakland history (lost game 19 in 1994)...leave following the game today for a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 1-1 with a 2.23 ERA (8 er in 32.1 ip) and .200 (23-for-115) opponents batting average on the homestand...now have a 3.50 ERA (88 er in 226.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have not allowed a home run in the last nine games and have surrendered just 15 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington,

14)...rank second in the AL in innings pitched (226.0)...Sonny Gray and Kazmir are a combined 6-2 with a 2.04 ERA (23 er in 101.1 ip) in 15 starts while the rest of the rotation is 5-11 with a 4.62 ERA (64 er in 124.2) in 23 starts.

**PITCHING:** Since allowing a season high 13 earned runs May 6 at Minnesota, the A's have compiled a 3.33 ERA (30 er in 81.0 ip) over the last nine games...have surrendered just two home runs over that stretch and have allowed 29 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (Detroit, 28)...rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (293) but have issued the third most walks (120)...are tied for second in pickoffs (4)...are tied with San Francisco for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .269 (49-for-182) in the first five games of the homestand after hitting .243 in 10 games on the last road trip...rank third in American League in run scored (175) and triples (10) and fourth in batting (.260)...are 20-for-23 (87.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the AL...are batting .195 (17-for-87) with runners in scoring position over the last 10 games after hitting .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...were shutout for the third time on Wednesday, which is tied for second most in the AL.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous three games, all losses...are now 1-8 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-17 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .214 (66-for-309) against lefties compared to .273 (284-for-1039) with 32 of their 36 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .194) and the mark against righties is third highest.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have allowed 37 runs in the seventh inning, which is eight more than any other team (Miami, 29)...have a 7.05 ERA (29 er in 37.0 ip) and .299 (49-for-164) opponents in the seventh inning...are 4-11 (.267) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 2-10)...went 9-14 in April and have posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's season run differential is -1...have outscored the opponents 93-17 in their 13 wins (7.2 to 1.3) and have been outscored 159-82 in 25 losses (6.4 to 3.3)...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 11 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. WHITE SOX:** The A's trail in the season series 2-0 after losing the first two games in Oakland...need a win today to avoid being swept by the White Sox for the first time since May 22-24, 2006 at Chicago...have not been swept by the White Sox in Oakland since May 16-18, 1997...lost the season series last year, 4-3...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Chicago...have lost three of the previous four season series to the White Sox and are 15-17 since the start of the 2011 season...have won seven of the last 10 games in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-278 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-133 in Oakland and 140-145 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 975-1033 against Chicago.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Marcus Semien** is batting .351 (33-for-94) with 11 multiple hit games over his last 23 games...**Stephen Vogt** has five pinch walks, which match the most by an Athletic over the last 15 years.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout and Dick Williams drives in three runs as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a double-header, 10-0...in **1963** Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in **1996** Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-1, 2.78 ERA)

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 0-1 with a 5.50 ERA (11 er in 18.0 ip) and .258 (17-for-66) opponents batting average in three starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April... his April ERA ranked fourth in the American League...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April in 2014 and is now 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April over the last two seasons.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) and no home runs in three starts in Oakland compared to 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA (12 er in 25.1 ip) and five home runs in four starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home to become the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents batting average (.199) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.276)...has allowed a .247 (24-for-97) batting average with the bases empty compared to .125 (8-for-64) with runners on base...opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-13 (.077) with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are now 6-for-75 (.080) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...four of the five home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...has allowed a .286 (18-for-63) batting average with no outs, .180 (9-for-50) with one out and .104 (5-for-48) with two outs...opponents are batting .128 (11-for-86) with two strikes...has yielded a .326 (14-for-43) average and four of his five home runs to batters leading off an inning.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts against American League West opponents compared to 0-1 with a 4.66 ERA (10 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts against everyone else...last year, he went 4-4 with a 4.71 ERA against the West, 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA against everyone else.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 3-4 (.429) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all seven starts...received three runs of support in his last start and receiving no run support in each of his previous three starts...has five runs of support over his last five starts (5 rs in 32.1 ip, 1.39 RSA)...started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts...that matched the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

**FIRST START:** He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win in Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss.

**FOURTH START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston April 24 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th.

**FIFTH START:** He had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas May 1...allowed leadoff home runs to Blanks in the second in-

ning and Fielder in the fourth inning...Smolinski added a sacrifice fly in the fourth and Kazmir left after six innings trailing 3-0...the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win.

**SIXTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota May 6...allowed four runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Rosario, RBI singles by Hunter and Plouffe and a sacrifice fly by Escobar...yielded two more runs in the sixth inning on a two-run home run by Escobar...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Boston on Monday...the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the fourth on a Ortiz RBI single...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fourth, but he allowed a RBI single to Betts in the fifth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead, but Scribner allowed two runs in the seventh for the blown save.

**KAZMIR vs. CHICAGO:** Is 3-6 with a 5.35 ERA (70.2 ip, 67 h, 42 r, 42 er, 32 bb, 62 so, 12 hr) in 12 career starts...is 2-3 with a 5.30 ERA (22 er in 37.1 ip) in seven starts in his home ballparks and 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (20 er in 33.1 ip) in five starts at U.S. Cellular Field...tossed a complete game four-hitter and walked just one batter in his only start last year, a 1-0 A's loss at Chicago (AL) Sept. 11...blanked the White Sox on one hit and one walk before Semien homered to lead off the bottom of the sixth...Sale and Petricka combined to shutout the A's on one hit...became the ninth pitcher in Oakland history with 1-0 complete game loss in which the only run scored on a home run (last: Brandon McCarthy on April 21, 2011 vs. Seattle).

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Drew Pomeranz (2-3, 4.66 ERA):** Tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings (fourth time) in his last start for the win...also tossed 7.0 innings for the win in his first start but was 0-3 with a 6.57 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in five starts in between...has allowed a .152 batting average against left-handed hitters with no extra base hits...is 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .164 opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 0-3 with a 6.86 ERA and .305 opponents batting average in four starts on the road...has two pickoffs and is tied for the American League lead in pickoffs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-2 A's win over Boston last Tuesday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 1 er, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.05 ERA in five career appearances, including four starts, against Houston...including 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 12 h, 9 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 4-for-12 (33.3%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.08 ERA (9 er in 26.1 ip) over the last nine games after posting a 7.98 ERA (39 er in 44.0 ip) in its previous 15 contests...in the first 14 games of the season, the bullpen posted a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip).
- Has a 4.82 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has allowed two runs or more in 20 of 38 games this season...are 1-19 when allowing two runs or more and 12-6 when allowing one run or fewer.
- Has a 1.08 ERA (4 er in 33.1 ip) in the A's 13 wins, a 6.36 ERA (57 er in 80.2 ip) in their 25 losses.
- Has 12 losses, which are the most in the majors...are the only team in the majors to have five different relievers with at least two losses (Abad, Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero).
- Has allowed 14 home runs (eight solo homers and six three-run homers), but just one over its last six games and 16.2 innings pitched.
- Has four saves, which are the fewest in the AL...save percentage of 33.3% is lowest in the AL.

## 56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD
