OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-26) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (25-13)

MONDAY, MAY 18, 2015 – MINUTE MAID PARK – 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series over the weekend by Chicago, the third time the A's have been swept this year...have now lost four straight and 10 of the last 11 games...are 5-18 (.217) over the last 23 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 13-26 (.333) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...it marks the first time the A's have been 13 games under .500 since they finished the 2011 season 14 games under (.74-88)...it matches the second worst record after 39 games in Oakland history...the 1979 A's also started the year 13-26 (won game 40) and the 1994 club was 11-28 (lost game 40)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 12½ games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since June 30, 2012 when they trailed by 13 games...have not trailed by more than 13 game since finishing the 2011 season 22 games out...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 12½ games before the end of May (also 2005, 2001 and 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...snapped a season-high and AL high six-game losing streak last Tuesday...it was just the second time over the last four years the A's lost more than five straight (9, May 22-June 1, 2012)...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying four errors yesterday (also May 9 at Seattle) and have made at least one error in each of the last 14 games...that is the third longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23...have 21 errors in the last 14 games and 42 overall, which is 10 more than any other team (Texas, 32)...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run and the A's are 1-13 (.077) in one-run games for the season...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-3)...are tied for second in the American League in one-run games (Seattle, 17)...are 2-18 (.100) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied with St. Louis and Seattle for the most games...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are the only team without a last at bat win.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers went 1-2 with a 2.70 ERA (11 er in 36.2 ip) on the homestand...now have a 3.56 ERA (91 er in 230.1 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League...rank second in innings pitched (230.1)...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.50 ERA (35 er in 90.0 ip) over the last 10 games since allowing a season-high 13 earned runs May 6 at Minnesota...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (303) but have issued the third most walks (123)...are tied for second in pickoffs (4)...are tied for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

THE LONG BALL: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a home run over the last 10 games, which matches the longest such streak by A's starters over the last 14 years (also July 12-22, 2007)...the last longer streak was an 11-game streak from Aug. 20-31, 2001...starters have surrendered just 15 home runs in 230.1 innings for the season, which is tied with Washington for the fewest in the majors...the bullpen has also allowed 15 home runs, but in just 118.2 innings...the 30 total home runs are tied for second fewest in the American League (Detroit, 29).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .237 (93-for-392) with 38 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.45 runs per game)...are hitting .194 (18-for-93) with runners in scoring position over that stretch after batting .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank third in American League in run scored (178) and triples (10) and fourth in batting (.259)...are 21-for-24 (87.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage...were shutout for the third time last Wednesday, which is tied for second most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) tonight...currently have a season-high five-game road losing streak...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 8-12 (.400) on the road...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-8 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 12-18 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .214 (66-for-309) against lefties compared to .272 (292-for-1072) with 33 of their 37 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .193) and the mark against righties is third highest.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-12 (.077) in day games compared to 12-14 (.462) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied with Cleveland for the most losses...are batting .238 (106-for-445) with 46 runs scored during the day (3.54 per game) compared to .269 (252-for-936) with 132 runs at night (5.08 per game)...have hit 28 of their 37 home runs at night.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have allowed 37 runs in the seventh inning, which is eight more than any other team (Miami, 29)...have a 6.87 ERA (29 er in 38.0 ip) and .298 (50-for-168) opponents in the seventh inning...are 4-12 (.250) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 2-11)...the 12 losses match the A's May total from each of the previous two seasons...went 9-14 in April and have posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's season run differential is -5...have outscored the opponents 93-17 in their 13 wins (7.2 to 1.3) and have been outscored 166-85 in 26 losses (6.4 to 3.3)...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 11 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-2...won the first two games in Houston but have lost four straight since then, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Astros...are 0-3 in Oakland and 2-1 in Houston...the sweep in Oakland April 24-26 marked the first time the A's have been swept by the Astros...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 33-17...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 50 or more times...11 of the A's 17 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-9 in Oakland and 17-8 in Houston.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...In **1998** Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in **2003** the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in **2014** Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (2-3, 4.66 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings (fourth time) in his last start for the win...also tossed 7.0 innings for the win in his first start but was 0-3 with a 6.57 ERA and .301 opponents batting average in five starts in between...tossed five innings or fewer in four of those five starts...has pitched more than five innings in just 13 of his 47 career starts, including just seven with six or more innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in pickoffs (2)...had just one pickoff in 54 games entering the season...ranks second in the American League in unearned runs (6) and tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (4).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .152 (5-for-33) batting average against left-handed hitters with no extra base hits...right-handers are batting .267 (31-for-116) with all four of his home runs...has surrendered 26 of his 29 career home runs against righties...three of his four home runs have come with runners on base, three have come with two strikes and two have been hit by the number nine hitter in the order...has issued 10 of his 11 walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 10-for-29 (.349) with runners in scoring position.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) and .164 (11-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 0-3 with a 6.86 ERA (15 er in 19.2 ip) and .305 (25-for-82) opponents batting average in four starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season today, his third against the Astros...opponents have been successful in 4-of-5 (80.0%) stolen base attempts and are 24-for-28 (85.7%) against him in his career...the A's are 2-5 (.286) in his starting assignments and are 7-10 (.412) in his career...his teams are 17-30 (.362) in his career...has tossed five innings or fewer in four of his seven starts...has walked one batter or fewer in five of his starts.

FIRST START: He combined with Abad and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 12-0 win over Seattle April 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...allowed a one-out single to Jackson in the fourth and he was erased on a double play...Jackson also singled for the other hit with one out in the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston April 15...allowed a two-run home run to Lowrie in the first inning, snapping a 15.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 2, 2014 and a 20.1 inning streak without an earned run dating back to Aug. 27, 2014...also allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the third and a RBI single to Altuve in the fifth.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive start in a 14-1 decision at Los Angeles April 21...allowed four runs in the second inning, all with two outs...Givotella hit a three-run homer and a fourth run scored on a Semien error...allowed a leadoff double to Cron in the sixth inning and was relieved by Alvarez who allowed that run to score plus five of his own.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Houston in Oakland April 26...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed three runs in the third, although only one run was earned (Davis error)...allowed a two-run single to Gattis and a RBI single to Rasmus...yielded a two-run home run to Marisnick in the fourth but the A's came back to tie the game with three in the bottom of the fourth.

FIFTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss at Texas May 2...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Blanks in the bottom of the first...also yielded a Beltre RBI single in the third inning and a lead off home run to Blanks in the sixth...left after 5.1 innings with the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored six times in the seventh inning to get him off the hook.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Minnesota May 7...walked a career-high tying five batters in 4.1 innings after issuing six walks over his first 27.1 innings...the A's scored twice in the second but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on just one hit...walked two and the runs scored on a fielders choice, error and sacrifice fly...Oakland scored twice in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a RBI single to Rosario in the fourth to tie the game...put runners on first and second via walk in the fifth inning and was relieved by Otero who allowed both runs to score.

LAST START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 9-2 win over Boston last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings...allowed a one-out single to Pedroia in the first but then retired each of the next 10 batters...had an 8-0 lead when Victorino doubled to start the sixth, went to third on a Bogaerts ground out and scored on a

Swihart ground out...allowed an unearned run in the seventh inning on a Napoli RBI single.

POMERANZ vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-2 with a 6.05 ERA (19.1 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 13 er, 7 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts...is 0-2 with a 6.28 ERA (10 er in 14.1 ip) in four games in Houston and 0-0 with a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 12 h, 9 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 6-1 decision at Houston April 15 (see second start above)...then had a no decision in a 7-6 loss in Oakland April 26 (see fourth start above).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-3 with a 2.38 ERA in six Spring Training starts...tied for the Cactus League lead with 28 strikeouts and ranked seventh in ERA...now has 48 strikeouts in 35.1 innings in two springs with the A's (12.23 per nine innings)...allowed a .226 (19-for-84) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 22.2 innings.

2014 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and split his time between the bullpen and the starting rotation...was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA in 10 relief appearances and 4-3 with a 2.58 ERA in 10 starts...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.35 ERA in 20 games overall...missed 24 games from June 17 to July 12 while on the disabled list and made eight starts with Sacramento from July 12 to Aug. 21...his five wins were a career high as he had just four victories in 34 games entering the season...the ERA was a career low as was his opponents batting average (.204), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.304)...his opponents batting average included a .196 (38-for-194) mark by right-handed hitters compared to .232 (13-for-56) by left-handers...entered the season with a .298 career average against righties compared to .165 against lefties...five of the seven home runs he allowed in 2014 were solo shots and four came on the first pitch...yielded a .175 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .095 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .152 average to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .146 with two strikes...was 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 17 games, eight starts, before the All-Star Break...did not allow an earned run in three games, two starts, after the break (13.1 ip, 1 r) while holding the opposition to a .109 batting average.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.61 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his first eight starts and has an American League leading 1.61 ERA...that is the fourth lowest mark in the majors...it is the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher after eight starts since 1980 when Mike Norris had a 0.52 ERA...has struck out at least nine batters in each of his last three starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...has a wild pitch in each of his last five games, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...is 4-0 with a 1.05 ERA in six starts against AL West competition compared to 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA in two starts against everyone else...has allowed nine of his 11 runs over the first three innings of a game...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's loss to Boston last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 9 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA in three career starts against Houston, all in Oakland.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.19 ERA (11 er in 31.0 ip) over the last 10 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.78 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (4) and the lowest save percentage (33.3%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Leads the majors in losses (12)...are the only team in the majors to have five different relievers with at least two losses (Abad, Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero).
- Has allowed 29-of-76 (38.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .284 (31-for-109), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (24).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 21 of 39 games...the A's are 1-20 when the pen allows two runs or more, 12-6 when it allows one run or fewer.

- Has faced just one batter in each of his last five games (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so), which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- Has appeared in each of the A's last four games and is tied for the American League lead with 19 appearances.
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (24) and inherited runners scored (9).
- Eight of the 12 hits he has allowed are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, two home runs)...is tied for third in the AL in most extra base hits (8) and has the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.610).
- First batters faced are 6-for-17 (.353) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and a Major League leading nine RBI.
- Has not allowed a run in four appearances against Houston (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so) and has a 0.84 ERA (1 er in 10.2 ip) in 12 career games against the Astros.

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
