### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-26) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (25-14)

TUESDAY, MAY 19, 2015 – MINUTE MAID PARK – 7:10 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped a four-game losing streak last night and won for just the second time in the last 12 games...are attempting to put together back-to-back wins for just the second time this year (April 13-14 at Houston)...are 6-18 (.250) over the last 24 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 14-26 (.350) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...it matches the second worst record after 40 games in Oakland history...the 1979 A's also started the year 14-26 (won game 41) and the 1994 club was 11-29 (lost game 41)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 11th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 11½ games...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 11½ games before the end of May (also 2005, 2001 and 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 11 days in fifth...were swept in a three-game series over the weekend by Chicago, the third time the A's have been swept this year.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's extended their streak of consecutive games with an error to 15 last night...that is the third longest streak in Oakland history and is the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23...have 22 errors in the streak, including four-error games May 9 at Seattle and Sunday against Chicago (AL)...have 43 errors for the season, which is 11 more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 32)...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's won 2-1 last night, which was their second one-run win of the season (2-1 at Minnesota May 5)...nine of the A's last 12 losses have been by one run and the A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games for the season...lead the majors in one-run losses, have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-3) and are tied for the third most one-run games (Mariners and Cubs, 17)...are 3-18 (.143) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are the only team without a last at bat win.

**THE LONG BALL:** A's starting pitchers have not allowed a home run over the last 11 games, 63.1 innings and 275 batters faced...the 11-game streak is the longest by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...the last longer streak was a 15-game streak from June 24-July 10, 1999...starters last allowed a home run May 6 at Minnesota (Escobar off Kazmir)...starters have surrendered just 15 home runs in 234.2 innings for the season, which is tied with Washington for the fewest in the majors...the bullpen has also allowed 15 home runs, but in just 123.1 innings...the 30 total home runs are tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the American League.

**PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in back-to-back games for the first time since May 2-3 of last year...are now 1-2 with a 2.85 ERA (13 er in 41.0 ip) over the last seven games and have a 3.57 ERA (93 er in 234.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.53)...also rank second in innings pitched (234.2)...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.36 ERA (37 er in 99.0 ip) over the last 11 games since allowing a season-high 13 earned runs May 6 at Minnesota...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (311) but have issued the second most walks (129)...are tied for second in pickoffs (4)...are tied for the most shutouts in the majors (5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .233 (99-for-424) with 40 runs scored over the last 12 games (3.33 runs per game)...are hitting .194 (20-for-103) with runners in scoring position over that stretch after batting .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank third in American League in run scored (180) and triples (10)...are 21-for-24 (87.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's snapped their season-high five-game road losing streak last night...are 1-0 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 9-12 (.429) on the road...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 1-8 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-18 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .215 (67-for-311) against lefties compared to .270 (297-for-1012) with 33 of their 37 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .196) and the mark against righties is third highest.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's are 1-12 (.077) in day games compared to 13-14 (.481) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied with Cleveland for the most losses...are batting .238 (106-for-445) with 46 runs scored during the day (3.54 per game) compared to .267 (258-for-968) with 134 runs at night (4.96 per game)...have hit 28 of their 37 home runs at night.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have allowed 37 runs in the seventh inning, which is eight more than any other team (Miami, 29)...have a 6.69 ERA (29 er in 39.0 ip) and .292 (50-for-171) opponents batting average in the seventh inning...are 5-12 (.294) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 2-12)...the 12 losses match the A's May total from each of the previous two seasons...went 9-14 in April and have posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...the A's season run differential is -4...have outscored the opponents 95-18 in their 14 wins (6.8 to 1.3) and have been outscored 166-85 in 26 losses (6.4 to 3.3)...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 11 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's trail in the season series, 4-3...snapped their four-game losing streak last night, which was the A's longest ever against the Astros...are 3-1 in Houston and 0-3 in Oakland...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 34-17...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 50 or more times...11 of the A's 17 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-9 in Oakland and 18-8 in Houston.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.61 ERA)

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his first eight starts and has an American League leading 1.61 ERA... that is the fourth lowest mark in the majors...it is the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher after eight starts since 1980 when Mike Norris had a 0.52 ERA.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Has struck out at least nine batters in each of his last three starts, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years (fourth time, last by Jeff Samardzija from Aug. 25-Sept. 5, 2014)...has 53 strikeouts for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks second in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.221) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.16), third in innings pitched (56.0), opponents batting average (.186) and on-base percentage (.250) and tied for sixth in wins (4).

**WILD PITCH:** Has a wild pitch in each of his last five games, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936...the longest streak by an Athletic since 1914 is six by Carl Doyle from April 20 to July 28, 1936...has five wild pitches for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League.

**WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** Was charged with the loss in his last start, despite allowing just one run in seven innings...had started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 4-0 with a 1.05 ERA (5 er in 43.0 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts against everyone else...is now 16-5 with a 2.02 ERA (43 er in 191.1 ip) in 28 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-9 with a 3.72 ERA (61 er in 147.2 ip) in 25 games against everyone else.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed nine of his 11 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.38 ERA (9 er in 24.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.28 ERA (1 er in 32.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.47 career ERA (59 er in 153.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.18 (45 er in 186.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed one home run, a solo shot by a left-handed hitter (Ackley, SEA on April 11)...has yielded 13 of his 20 career home runs to lefties and 15 have come with the bases empty...leads American League pitchers in putouts (8), ranks fourth in total chances (17) and tied for sixth in assists (9)...has tossed at least seven innings in five of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...the A's are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignments and are 28-23 (.549) in his career.

**IN APRIL:** Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the American League in wins and ranked ninth in ERA...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in April.

**SCORELESS STREAK ENDS:** Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

**20 CAREER WINS:** His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

**OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

**2015 START-BY-START:** Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowing one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on

May 9, 2010...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle **April 11** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles **April 22**...allowed a run in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced... was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 28**...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...the A's came back with five runs in the bottom of the first and he blanked the Angels on four hits over his final seven innings...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)...they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...tossed a career-high 119 pitches...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 11 innings at Seattle **May 8**...it was the 50th start of his career...allowed his only run in the second inning when Seager led off with a double and scored on a Morrison single...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the bullpen blew a save in one of his start (April 11 vs. Seattle).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Boston last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run... allowed a leadoff single to Ramirez in the second...he went to second on a wild pitch and scored on a Nava single...allowed his third and final hit on a two-out single by Pedroia in the third...then retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...the A's were shutout on five hits by Miley, Tazawa and Uehara.

Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter...went 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA in two starts in 2013...combined with Otero on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win on August 15 for his first Major League win...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four hits while striking out nine...allowed only two base runners as far as second base...then took the loss in a 3-2 decision on September 5...retired 19 of the final 20 batters he faced, including each of the last 10.

**RHP Jesse Hahn (1-3, 4.42 ERA):** Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23...is 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA and .278 opponents batting average in four starts since then...has the most unearned runs in the American League (7) and is tied for the lead in opponents reaching base on an error (5)... has allowed a .191 batting average against right-handed hitters and a .159 average with two outs...has allowed just one home run in 38.2 innings, an average of 0.23 per nine innings...has surrendered five home runs in 112.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings)...the A's are 1-6 (.143) in his starting assignments...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss to Chicago last Friday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...has never faced Houston in his career.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 5-for-13 (38.5%)

- The A's bullpen has posted a 2.78 ERA (11 er in 35.2 ip) over the last 11 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (Texas, 4.61).
- Has the fewest saves in the AL (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Leads the majors in losses (12)...are the only team in the majors to have five different relievers with at least two losses (Abad, Clippard, Cook, O'Flaherty, Otero).
- Has allowed 29-of-78 (37.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .277 (31-for-112), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (24).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 21 of 40 games...the A's are 1-20 when the pen allows two runs or more, 13-6 when it allows one run or fewer.
