OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-27) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (26-14)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 20, 2015 – MINUTE MAID PARK – 1:10 P.M. CDT
RHP JESSE HAHN (1-3, 4.42) VS. LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL (5-0, 1.87)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and 11 of the last 13...are a season-high tying 13 games under .500 for the second time this year (13-26 on May 17)...have not been more than 13 games under .500 since finishing the 2011 season 14 games under (74-88)...are 6-19 (.240) over the last 25 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 14-27 (.341) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...it is the second worst record after 41 games in Oakland history...the 1994 A's started the year 11-30 (lost game 42)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 12th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 12½ games...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 12½ games before the end of May (also 2005, 2001 and 1979)...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 12 days in fifth...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series over the weekend by Chicago, the third time the A's have been swept this year.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-12 (.077) in day games compared to 13-15 (.464) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied with Cleveland for the most losses...are batting .238 (106-for-445) with 46 runs scored during the day (3.54 per game) compared to .268 (268-for-1001) with 138 runs at night (4.93 per game)...have hit 29 of their 38 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-8 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-19 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .217 (68-for-314) against lefties compared to .270 (306-for-1132) with 34 of their 38 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .197) and the mark against righties is third highest.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their first errorless game last night since May 2 at Texas, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error (22 errors total)...that was their longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23...have 43 errors for the season, which is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 34)...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 13 losses have been by one run and two others have been by two...the A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games...lead the majors in one-run losses, have the second worst record (Cleveland, 0-4) and are tied for the third most one-run games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...lead the majors in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...lead the majors in last at bat losses and are the only team without a last at bat win.

THE LONG BALL: A's starting pitchers had their 11-game, 64.1-inning, 281-batters faced homerless streak end when Carter homered off Gray in the second inning last night...the 11-game streak was the longest by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...it was the first home run off an A's starter since May 6 at Minnesota (Escobar off Kazmir)...starters have surrendered just 16 home runs in 239.2 innings for the season, which is tied with Washington for the fewest in the majors...the bullpen has allowed 17 home runs, but in just 126.1 innings...the 33 total home runs are tied for second fewest in the American League.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in each of the last three games (7 er in 13.2 ip, 4.61 ERA)...are 1-3 with a 3.13 ERA (16 er in 46.0 ip) over the last eight games and have a 3.61 ERA (96 er in 239.2 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League...rank second in innings pitched (239.2)...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.62 ERA (43 er in 107.0 ip) over the last 12 games since allowing a

season-high 13 earned runs May 6 at Minnesota...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (317) but have issued the second most walks (133)...lead the AL in shutouts (5) and are tied for second in pickoffs (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .239 (109-for-457) with 44 runs scored over the last 13 games (3.38 runs per game)...are hitting .204 (23-for-113) with runners in scoring position over that stretch after batting .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank third in American League in run scored (184) and triples (10)...are 24-for-28 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the AL and third best in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-1) and Tampa Bay (four games)...snapped their season-high five-game road losing streak Monday night...went 3-7 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Minnesota (1-3) and Seattle (0-3) and are 9-13 (.409) on the road...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-13 (.278) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 3-12)...the 13 losses are one more than the A's May total from each of the previous two seasons...went 9-14 in April and have posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...have allowed 37 runs in the seventh inning, which is eight more than any other team (Miami, 29)...have a 6.59 ERA (30 er in 41.0 ip) and .299 (52-for-174) opponents batting average in the seventh inning...the A's season run differential is -6...have outscored the opponents 95-18 in their 14 wins (6.8 to 1.3) and have been outscored 172-89 in 27 losses (6.4 to 3.3)...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson, Zobrist)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Zobrist are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-3...are 3-2 in Houston and 0-3 in Oakland...snapped their four-game losing streak Monday night, which was the A's longest ever against the Astros...have won all four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 34-18...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 50 or more times...11 of the A's 18 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 16-9 in Oakland and 18-9 in Houston.

Billy Burns extended his hitting streak to a career-high six games last night (10-for-23, .435)...**Tyler Clippard** has not allowed a run in seven games on the road (7.2 ip) and has converted all four of his save opportunities...**Marcus Semien** is batting .352 (37-for-105) with 12 multiple hit games over his last 26 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1977 Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in 2005 Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in 2011 Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000th career hit to become the 12th player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-3, 4.42 ERA)

FIRST THREE, LAST FOUR: Went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23... is 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) and .278 (27-for-97) opponents batting average in four starts since then.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the most unearned runs in the American League (7) and is tied for the lead in opponents reaching base on an error (5)...is tied for fourth in hit batters (4).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .261 opponents batting average, including .191 (13-for-368) against right-handed hitters compared to .318 (27-for-85) against left-handers...has yielded a .159 (7-for-44) average with two outs, .303 (33-for-109) with zero or one out...opponents are batting .333 (13-for-39) with no walks and three hit by pitches when leading off an inning.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 38.2 innings, an average of 0.23 per nine innings...the home run was a solo shot off a right-handed hitter (Trout, April 29 vs. LAA)...yielded four home runs in 2014, all by left-handed hitters with runners on base...has surrendered five home runs in 112.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-2 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (8 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 3.52 ERA (9 er in 23.0 ip) and .221 (19-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.74 ERA (10 er in 15.2 ip) and .313 (21-for-67) opponents average in three starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-6 (.143) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in six of his seven starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just four of his 19 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in six of his starts...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two more runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

THIRD START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 29...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota May 4...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...also tossed a career-high 104 pitches...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle May 9...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Cruz RBI double and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was

relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) last Friday in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...the A's scored four times in the fourth and he left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save).

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (1-3, 2.63 ERA): Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-3 with a 3.19 ERA in his five starting assignments...is 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five games, three starts, on the road compared to 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA and .313 opponents average in four games, two starts, at home...has not allowed a run in the first two innings (10.0 ip) and has not yielded an earned run in the sixth inning or later (12.2 ip)...has allowed 12 of his 13 runs in the third through fifth innings (6.60 ERA)...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Chicago last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA in three career appearances against Tampa Bay, all in relief.

- Leads the majors in losses (12)...has the fewest saves in the AL (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 30-of-79 (38.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (Toronto, 38.7%).
- First batters faced are hitting .287 (33-for-115), which is second highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (26) and are tied for second in home runs (7).
