OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-28) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (22-19)

THURSDAY, MAY 21, 2015 – TROPICANA FIELD – 7:10 P.M. EDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (1-3, 2.63) VS. RHP ALEX COLOME (2-1, 6.05) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, six of the last seven and 12 of the last 14 to fall 14 games under .500 for the first time since they finished the 2011 season 74-88...have not been 15 games under since they were 73-88 on Sept. 27. 2011...have lost five consecutive series...are 6-20 (.231) over the last 26 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 14-28 (.333) overall, which is the worst record in the majors and the second worst record after 42 games in Oakland history...the 1994 A's started the year 11-31 (lost game 43)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 13th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 131/2 games...that is the A's largest deficit since they finished the 2011 season 22 games back...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 13 days in fifth...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series last weekend by Chicago (AL), the third time the A's have been swept this year.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 14 losses have been by one run and two others have been by two...the A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the worst record...are tied for the fourth most games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 16 of the last 17 games (23 errors total) and have 44 errors for the season...that is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 35)...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

THE LONG BALL: A's starting pitchers have allowed a home run in backto-back games after going 11 consecutive games without a home run from May 7 to 18...that was the longest homerless streak by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...starters have surrendered just 17 home runs in 245.2 innings for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 16)...the bullpen has also allowed 17 home runs, but in just 128.1 innings...the 34 total home runs are tied for third fewest in the American League.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 3.29 ERA (19 er in 52.0 ip) over the last nine games and have a 3.63 ERA (99 er in 245.2 ip) for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in innings pitched (245.2)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 4.53 ERA (84 er in 167.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April... have the second highest May ERA in the AL (Toronto, 4.69) after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (326) but have issued the second most walks (136)... lead the AL in shutouts (5) and are tied for second in pickoffs (4).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (116-for-492) with 45 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.21 runs per game)...are hitting .194 (24-for-124) with runners in scoring position over that stretch after batting .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank third in American League in run scored (185) and triples (10)...are 24-for-28 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with Toronto for the best percentage in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (four games) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...went 3-7 on the last road trip and are 9-14 (.391) on the road...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last

nine road trips, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and New York-AL (four games)... went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-13 (.071) in day games compared to 13-15 (.464) at night...have the worst record and most losses in day games in the majors...are batting .235 (113-for-480) with 47 runs scored during the day (3.36 per game) compared to .268 (268-for-1001) with 138 runs at night (4.93 per game)...have hit 29 of their 38 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-19 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .215 (74-for-344) against lefties compared to .270 (307-for-1137) with 34 of their 38 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .199) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-14 (.263) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 3-13)...the 14 losses are two more than the A's May total from each of the previous two seasons...went 9-14 in April and have posted a losing record in three consecutive months after 14 straight months with a winning record...are 1-12 in the final game of a series, 1-14 when they are outhomered and 2-16 when scoring fewer than four runs...have allowed 37 runs in the seventh inning, which is seven more than any other team (Miami, 30)...have a 6.43 ERA (30 er in 42.0 ip) and .294 (52-for-177) opponents batting average in the seventh inning... have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson, Zobrist)... Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Zobrist are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 12 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and Tampa Bay...it was the A's third season series win in the last four years...hit .198 with 17 runs scored in the six games last year and are batting .200 (142-for-710) with 61 runs scored in 21 games against the Rays over the previous three years (2.90 runs per game)...are 17-11 against the Rays over the previous four seasons ...all-time.

Tyler Clippard has not allowed a run in seven games on the road (7.2 ip) and has converted all four of his save opportunities...**Marcus Semien** extended his hitting streak to eight games yesterday, which is a new career high...is 12-for-33 (.364) during the streak...**Stephen Vogt** leads the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.469), ranks second in slugging percentage (.605) and on-base percentage (.413) and tied for third in RBI (30).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in **1974** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in **1995** the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in **1997** Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-3, 2.63

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...his first start came April 23 when Jesse Hahn missed a start due to a blister...remained in the rotation following the option of Kendall Graveman to Nashville April 26 and is 1-3 with a 3.19 ERA (11 er in 31.0 ip) in his five starting assignments...is now 9-11 with a 3.76 ERA (69 er in 165.1 ip) in 28 career starts, 9-15 with a 5.02 ERA in 204 relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a save, a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) and .169 (15-for-89) opponents batting average in five games, three starts, on the road...has a 0-1 record, a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .313 (15-for-48) opponents average in four games, two starts, at home.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first two innings (10.0 ip) and has not yielded an earned run in the sixth inning or later (12.2 ip). has allowed 12 of his 13 runs in the third through fifth innings (11 er in 15.0 ip. 6.60 ERA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed just one home run in 37.2 innings... has issued nine of his 12 walks to right-handed hitters...has yielded five of his seven extra base hits to lefties (four doubles, one home run)...has walked just one batter leading off an inning...has a .136 (8-for-59) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .282 (22-for-78) after that.

IN RELIEF: Stranded his only inherited runner in his four relief appearances and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250)...last year, he allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 5-for-10 (.500) with a walk...recorded the save in his final relief appearance April 18 at Kansas City, tossing 3.2 scoreless innings...has two career saves, both at Kansas City and both at least 3.2 innings...struck out six, which matched the most by an A's pitcher in a game in which he recorded the save ... the only other time it happened since the save became an official stat in 1969 was by Rollie Fingers on Sept. 1, 1972 against Detroit

IN APRIL: Went 0-2 with a 2.55 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this April...went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April last year, all A's wins. ranked third in the AL in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011 and June of 2008)...is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) in 12 games, eight starts, in April over the last two years...has a 2.68 (24 er in 80.2 ip) career ERA in April, which is his best for any month of the season.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 23...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit...the hit was a two-run home run by Calhoun in the third inning and it scored Butera, who reached on an error ... it was the Angels only hit of the game ... Tropeano, Salas, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on eight hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-5 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 30...allowed a run in the third inning on Giavotella RBI single and three more in the fifth on a two-run single by Calhoun and a Freese RBI fielders choice...left after five innings trailing 4-0

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Minnesota May 5...it was his first win since July 23, 2014...the A's scored a run in the first inning and one more in the sixth and he shutout the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings...allowed his only run in the eighth inning on a Dozier RBI single.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle May 10...did not allow a hit until Cruz singled with one out in the fourth... had a 1-0 lead at the time but Seager followed with a RBI double and Ackley added a two-run double one out later...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Cano in the fifth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Chicago (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Garcia...retired the side in order just one (fourth inning)...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2

2014 RECAP: Began the season in the starting rotation but was moved to the bullpen following the acquisition of Jon Lester at the trading deadline...went 8-7 with a 3.44 ERA in his 21 starts and 0-1 with a 3.54 ERA in 11 relief appearances...was 8-8 with a 3.45 ERA in 32 games, 21 starts, overall...had career highs in every category except games pitched and his ERA was a career low...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...his 146.0 innings were more than double his previous high (67.1 in 2009) as were his 136 strikeouts (55 in 2013)...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and a .216 opponents batting average over his first nine starts through May 18...then went 4-6 with a 4.17 ERA and .280 opponents batting average over his final 12 starts...allowed a .149 batting average with runners in scoring position over his first 10 games through May 24, .354 after that.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-2, 3.08 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 5.64 ERA and .276 op ponents batting average in four starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...has the seventh highest May ERA in the AL after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...opponents are 1-for-15 (.067) with runners in scoring position and two outs... last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with RISP and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss to Chicago (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.11 ERA in three career starts against Tampa Bay, all in 2010 with Los Angeles...pitched for Tampa Bay from 2004-09 and ranks third on the Rays career list in wins (55), starts (144), innings (834.0) and strikeouts (874).

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.76 ERA (17 er in 40.2 ip) over the last 13 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.84 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors (CIN, 5.17).
- Leads the majors in losses (12)...has the fewest saves in the AL (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 30-of-80 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (Toronto, 40.6%).
- First batters faced are hitting .282 (33-for-117), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (26) and are tied for second in home runs (7).
