### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-29) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (23-19)

FRIDAY, MAY 22, 2015 – TROPICANA FIELD – 7:10 P.M. EDT LHP SCOTT KAZMIR (2-2, 3.08) VS. RHP CHRIS ARCHER (4-4, 2.47) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, seven of the last eight and 13 of the last 15 to fall 15 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 27 2011 (73-88)...have not been 16 games under .500 since Sept. 26, 2011 (72-88)...have lost five consecutive series...are 6-21 (.222) over the last 27 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 14-29 (.326) overall, which is the worst record in the majors and the second worst record after 43 games in Oakland history...the 1994 A's started the year 11-32 (won game 44)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 14th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13% games for the second consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since they finished the 2011 season 22 games back...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 14 days in fifth...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series last weekend by Chicago (AL), the third time the A's have been swept this year.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in 17 of the last 18 games (24 errors total) and have 45 errors for the season...that is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 36)...the errors have led to 28 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shutout for the second time in the last eight games last night and the fourth time this year, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...have scored just 47 runs over the last 16 games (2.9 per game), but have 185 for the season, which is fourth most in the AL...are batting .233 (122-for-524) over the last 15 games, including .197 (26-for-132) with runners in scoring position...hit .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...are 24-for-29 (82.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the AL...are third in triples (11).

**PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 1-5 with a 3.41 ERA (22 er in 58.0 ip) over the last 10 games and have a 3.65 ERA (102 er in 251.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.48)... also rank third in innings pitched (251.2)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 4.47 ERA (87 er in 175.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the second highest May ERA in the AL (Toronto, 4.66) after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (334) but have issued the second most walks (137)...lead the AL in shutouts (5) and are tied for second in pickoffs (4).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Nine of the A's last 15 losses have been by one run and two others have been by two...the A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games...lead the majors in one-run losses and have the worst record...are tied for the fifth most games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh for the most losses.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (0-1) and have now lost eight of their last nine road games...went 3-7 on the last road trip and are 9-15 (.375) on the road...have finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last nine road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have

lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

**THE LONG BALL:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one home run in three straight games after going 11 consecutive games without a home run from May 7 to 18...that was the longest homerless streak by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...starters have surrendered just 18 home runs in 251.2 innings for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 16)...the bullpen has allowed 17 home runs, but in just 130.1 innings...the 35 total home runs are tied for second fewest in the American League.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-13 (.071) in day games compared to 13-16 (.448) at night...have the worst record and most losses in day games in the majors...are batting .235 (113-for-480) with 47 runs scored during the day (3.36 per game) compared to .265 (274-for-1033) with 138 runs at night (4.76 per game)...have hit 29 of their 38 home runs at night.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-20 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .213 (74-for-347) against lefties compared to .268 (313-for-1166) with 34 of their 38 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .198) and the mark against righties is third highest.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 5-15 (.250) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 4-13)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the fourth consecutive month...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record...have allowed 39 runs in the seventh inning, which is nine more than any other team (Miami and Milwaukee, 30)...have a 6.70 ERA (32 er in 43.0 ip) and .297 (54-for-182) opponents batting average in the seventh inning...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have 10 players on the disabled list (Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson, Zobrist), which are their most on the DL at one time since Aug. 18-19, 2012, when they also had 10...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Zobrist are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 14 times... used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2015 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and Tampa Bay...it was the A's third season series win in the last four years...hit .198 with 17 runs scored in the six games last year and are batting .201 (149-for-742) with 61 runs scored in 22 games against the Rays over the last four years (2.77 runs per game)...are 17-12 against the Rays over the

last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 93-58 (.615) against Tampa Bay... are 52-22 in Oakland and 41-36 at Tropicana Field.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Tyler Clippard** has not allowed a run in seven games on the road (7.2 ip) and has converted all four of his save opportunities...**Stephen Vogt** leads the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.455), ranks second in slugging percentage (.593) and fourth in on-base percentage (.408).

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a ML record with two three-homer games...in 1997 George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in 2004 Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-2, 3.08 ERA)

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 0-2 with a 5.64 ERA (14 er in 22.1 ip) and .276 (24-for-87) opponents batting average in four starts in May after going 2-0 with a 0.99 ERA and .158 opponents average in four starts in April...has the seventh highest May ERA in the American League after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...is now 2-4 with a 3.93 ERA (23 er in 52.2 ip) in nine starts in May in his two seasons with the A's comapred to 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 10 starts in April.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .248 (26-for-105) batting average with the bases empty compared to .169 (13-for-77) with runners on base... opponents are 7-for-35 (.200) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-15 (.067) with RISP and two outs...last year, he held the opposition to a .081 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs, which was the lowest mark by a Major Leaguer with 162 or more innings pitched since Bobby Bolin had a .079 average with San Francisco in 1965...opponents are now 6-for-77 (.078) off him with RISP and two outs over the last two years...four of the five home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...all five have come with no outs...has allowed a .292 (21-for-72) batting average with no outs, .224 (13-for-58) with one out and .096 (5-for-52) with two outs...opponents are batting .131 (13-for-99) with two strikes...has issued 17 of his 19 walks to right-handed hitters...the 19 walks are tied for eighth most in the American League...has yielded a .333 (16-for-48) average and four of his five home runs to batters leading off an inning.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-1 with a 1.85 ERA (5 er in 24.1 ip) and no home runs in four starts in Oakland compared to 1-1 with a 4.26 ERA (12 er in 25.1 ip) and five home runs in four starts on the road...has the seventh lowest home ERA in the American League...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in each of his first two starts at home to become the second A's pitcher since 1914 on an Opening Day roster to start the season by tossing seven or more innings and not allowing a run in his first two home starts (Tommy Milone, 2012).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts against American League West opponents compared to 0-2 with a 4.94 ERA (13 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts against everyone else...last year, he went 4-4 with a 4.71 ERA against the West, 11-5 with a 2.94 ERA against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make the 250th appearance of his career today...it is his 249th start...the A's are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...has received just seven runs of support over his last six starts (36.2 ip, 1.72 RSA) after getting 18 runs of support in his first two starts... started the season by tossing six or more innings and allowing two runs or fewer in each of his first four starts...that matched the longest season-opening streak by an A's pitcher on the Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (fifth time, last: Jesse Chavez, 2014)...struck out 10 batters in his first start and eight in his second start to become the only A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to strike out eight or more batters in each of his first two starts of the season.

FIRST START: He combined with Otero and Alvarez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Texas April 8...tossed seven innings and allowed just one hit while striking out 10...it was his 23rd career 10-strikeout game, his second with the A's...became just the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 10 while allowing one hit or fewer, the first since Barry Zito on Aug. 4, 2001 vs. Detroit (10 so, 1 h)...allowed only two base runners as far as second base.

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-1 win at Houston April 13...retired each of the first nine batters to extend his season-opening scoreless streak to 10.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when Altuve led off the fourth inning with a home run...that was the only run he would allow and the A's added with four runs in the fifth.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss at Kansas City April 19...shutout the Royals on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a ground out in the fifth inning...had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the eighth and walked Orlando to start the inning...retired the next batter and was relieved by O'Flaherty who allowed Orlando to score plus two runs of his own for the blown save and loss.

**FOURTH START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-4, 11 inning loss to Houston April 24 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just five hits while walking three...did not allow a runner past second base...Keuchel shutout the A's on two hits in nine innings of work and the game was scoreless going into extra innings...both teams

scored twice in the 10th inning before the Astros outscored the A's 3-2 in the 11th.

**FIFTH START:** He had his third straight no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Texas May 1...allowed leadoff home runs to Blanks in the second inning and Fielder in the fourth inning...Smolinski added a sacrifice fly in the fourth and Kazmir left after six innings trailing 3-0...the Rangers built a 5-0 lead before the A's scored seven times in the eighth for the win.

**SIXTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-0 loss at Minnesota May 6...allowed four runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Rosario, RBI singles by Hunter and Plouffe and a sacrifice fly by Escobar... yielded two more runs in the sixth inning on a two-run home run by Escobar...Gibson, Pressly and Graham combined to shutout the A's on six hits.

**SEVENTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Boston May 11....the A's scored a run in the third, but he allowed a run in the fourth on a Ortiz RBI single...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fourth, but he allowed a RBI single to Betts in the fifth...left after six innings with a 3-2 lead, but Scribner allowed two runs in the seventh for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Chicago (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a season-low 4.1 innings...allowed an unearned run in the first inning and then blanked the White Sox on two hits and a walk over the next three innings...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed four runs, three earned, in the fifth inning...Abreu opened the scoring with a RBI single, Beckham walked with the bases loaded and Ramirez drove in two with a single

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-2, 8.27 ERA): Is scheduled to be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his second stint with the A's this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers... allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 Sounds win over New Orleans last Sunday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 3 so)...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start, a 9-3 A's loss to Houston April 25 (4.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Rays in his career.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.59 ERA (17 er in 42.2 ip) over the last 14 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.76 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors (CIN, 5.17).
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...has the fewest saves in the American League (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 30-of-80 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (Toronto, 40.6%).
- First batters faced are hitting .275 (33-for-120), which is fourth highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (26) and are tied for second in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 23 of 43 games...the A's are 1-22 when the pen allows two runs or more, 13-7 when it allows one run or fewer.

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 12 outings (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 12.46 ERA), which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (Mike Venafro, July 12-Sept. 22, 2002; Jay Marshall, May 19 to June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 14 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for the lead among Major League relievers in extra base hits...has the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.750) and is tied for second in home runs.
- Is tied for fourth in the AL in games pitched (20).
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (25) and inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters Tuesday night, ending his Athletics record tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- First batters faced are 7-for-18 (.389) with two doubles, a triple, three
  home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the
  home runs are tied for the most.
- Did not allow a run in three outings against the Rays last year (2.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so).
