OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-30) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (24-19)

SATURDAY, MAY 23, 2015 – TROPICANA FIELD – 4:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight, eight of the last nine and 14 of the last 16 games to fall 16 games under .500 for the first time since Sept. 26, 2011 (72-88)...have not been 17 games under .500 since Sept. 21, 2011 (69-86)...have lost five consecutive series...are 6-22 (.214) over the last 28 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 14-30 (.318) overall, which is the worst record in the majors and the second worst record after 44 games in Oakland history...the 1994 A's started the year 12-32 (won game 45)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 15th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games for the third consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since they finished the 2011 season 22 games back...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 15 days in fifth...have won back-to-back games just once this year (April 13-14)...were swept in a three-game series last weekend by Chicago (AL), the third time the A's have been swept this year.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 1-13 (.071) in day games compared to 13-17 (.433) at night...have the worst record and most losses in day games in the majors...are batting .235 (113-for-480) with 47 runs scored during the day (3.36 per game) compared to .265 (283-for-1069) with 140 runs at night (4.67 per game)...have hit 30 of their 39 home runs at night.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 18 of the last 19 games (25 errors total) and have 46 errors for the season...that is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 37)...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .226 (38-for-168) with nine runs scored in the first five games of the road trip (1.80 runs per game)...have scored just 21 runs over the last nine games (2.33 per game) and are 12-for-89 (.135) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...were shutout for the fourth time Thursday night, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...are batting .234 (131-for-560) over the last 16 games, including .182 (26-for-143) with RISP...hit .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...are 26-for-31 (83.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the AL...are third in triples (11).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-6 despite a 3.39 ERA (24 er in 63.2 ip) over the last 11 games...have a 3.64 ERA (104 er in 257.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Tampa Bay, 3.44)...also rank third in innings pitched (257.1)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 4.48 ERA (91 er in 183.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the second highest May ERA in the AL (Toronto, 4.62) after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...for the season, rank fourth in the American League in strikeouts (339) but have issued the third most walks (140)...lead the AL in shutouts (5) and are tied for second in pickoffs (4).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for the fifth most games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost four straight and nine of the last 10 road games...are 1-4 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (0-2)...including this trip, the A's have now finished with a .500

record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...went 3-7 on the last road trip and are 9-16 (.360) on the road, which is second worst in the American League (Toronto, 8-15)...return home following the game tomorrow for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

IN MAY: The A's are 5-16 (.250) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 4-14)...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record...the 16 losses match the A's most in May over the last six years (2012).

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff has allowed eight home runs in the last four games after yielded just three over the previous 11 contests...A's starting pitchers have allowed one home run in four straight games after going 11 consecutive games without a home run from May 7 to 18...that was the longest homerless streak by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...starters have surrendered just 19 home runs in 257.1 innings for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the bullpen has also allowed 19 home runs, but in just 132.2 innings.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 13-21 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .213 (74-for-348) against lefties compared to .268 (322-for-1201) with 35 of their 39 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .197) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 11 players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson, Zobrist), which are their most on the DL at one time since Aug. 20-21, 2011, when they also had 11...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Zobrist are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have lost the first two games of 2015 after winning the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and Tampa Bay...it was the A's third season series win in the last four years...hit .198 with 17 runs scored in the six games last year and are batting .203 (158-for-778) with 63 runs scored in 23 games against the Rays over the last four years (2.74 runs per game)...are 17-13 against the Rays over the last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 93-59 (.612) against Tampa Bay...are 52-22 in Oakland and 41-37 at Tropicana Field.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1901** Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in **1983** it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-2, 8.27 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...tossed fewer than five innings in three of his four starts, which were the first starts of his career...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...was acquired from Toronto Nov., 28, 2014 with pitcher Sean Nolin, infielder Brett Lawrie and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for Josh Donaldson...made his Major League debut with the Blue Jays last year in just his second professional season and compiled a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Texas April 9 in Oakland, his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...the two home runs were the first of his career...surrendered just five home runs in 207.0 minor league innings...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City).

SECOND START: He combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Houston April 14...it was his first Major League win...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed four runners into scoring position and retired the side in order just once (fifth inning).

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss to Houston on April 25 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowrie in the first inning and a three-run home run to Altuve in the third...also yielded a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth and was relieved by Bassitt with runners on first and third and two outs in the sixth...Bassitt allowed one of the runners to score on a wild pitch.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

LAST NASHVILLE START: He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 6-2 win over New Orleans last Sunday at Nashville...shutout the Zephyrs on two hits over the first six innings and had a 4-0 lead when he was charged with two unearned runs in the seventh inning...the first run scored on his own two-out throwing error and Scott Sizemore added a RBI single.

2014 RECAP: Was named a *Baseball America* Minor League Baseball First Team All-Star after combining for a 14-6 record and a 1.83 ERA in 27 starts with Single-A Lansing, Single-A Dunedin, Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo...then made his Major League debut with Toronto in September in just his second professional season...was recalled from Triple-A Buffalo Sept. 2 and had no decisions and a 3.86 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .222 batting average and did not walk a batter in 4.2 innings...yielded a .200 (2-for-10) average against right-handed hitters, .250 (2-for-8) against lefthanders...stranded his only inherited runner but first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400)...was named the A's sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade.

WITH TORONTO: Made his debut Sept. 5 at Boston and allowed a single to the only batter he faced, Yoenis Cespedes...he later scored...struck out Nelson Cruz to end the seventh inning in his second outing Sept. 16 at Baltimore for his first strikeout...did not allow a run over his final two appearances (3.0 ip).

MINORS: His 14 wins tied for third most in the all of the minor leagues and his 1.83 ERA ranked fourth among full season minor leaguers...ranked seventh in the minors in innings pitched (167.1)...led the Blue Jays farm system in ERA and wins and ranked fourth in strikeouts (115)...surrendered just two home runs, an average of 0.11 per nine innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .196 (66-for-335) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (76-for-279) against left-handers...compiled a 1.41 ERA over the first five innings of a game, a 4.91 ERA in the sixth inning and a 0.79 ERA from the seventh inning on...did not allow an earned run in the second inning (27.0 ip)...his teams were 17-10 (.630) in his starting assignments...allowed four runs or fewer in all 27 of his starts, including two runs or fewer 23 times...walked two batters or fewer 25 times and tossed at least six innings in 21 of his starts.

TEAM BY TEAM: Began the season at *Single-A Lansing* where he went 2-0 with a 0.34 ERA in four starts...allowed a .126 batting average and opponents were hitless in 14 at bats with runners in scoring position...struck out a season-high seven in each of his final three starts...including April 18 at Beloit when he tossed a season-high 8.1 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk...was named Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 14 to 20...was promoted to *Single-A Dunedin* of the Florida State League April 30 and logged an 8-4 record and a 2.23 ERA in 16 starts...the wins tied for second most in the FSL during his stint there, which ran through July 27, while his ERA ranked seventh...went 4-0 with a 2.27 ERA in five starts at home...picked up the win in five consecutive starts from May 12 to June 3...compiled a 3.14 ERA during the winning streak...surrendered his first home run of the season May 22 against Ft. Myers and matched his season high by allowing four runs...would not allow his second and final home run until Aug. 7 against Durham...had a 13-start, 87.0-inning, 347-batter homerless streak in between...matched his season high by allowing four runs in a June 8 loss at Lakeland...that ran his overall minor league record to 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA in 12 starts...went 7-4 with a 1.39 ERA over his final 15 starts...did not allow a run in consecutive starts July 1 at Clearwater and July 6 vs. Tampa...tossed 6.0 shutout innings in each start and had a 20.0-inning scoreless streak from June 26 to July 11...was promoted to Double-A *New Hampshire* July 28 and made just one start for the Fisher Cats that day at Binghamton...picked up the win in a 5-1 decision (6.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 3-1 with a 0.93 ERA in six starts overall in July...moved up to *Triple-A Buffalo* Aug. 1 and went 3-2 with a 1.88 ERA in six starts...ranked third in the International League in ERA in August...tossed 7.0 shutout innings in consecutive starts Aug. 12 against Norfolk and Aug. 17 at Lehigh Valley as part of a 17.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 12 to 23...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in his final minor league start Aug. 28 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

RHP Sonny Gray (4-2, 1.92 ERA):	Is 0-2 with a 3.00 ERA over his last two starts after going 4-0 with a 1.65 ERA over his first seven starts...has allowed 11 of his 14 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.67 ERA in innings one through three and a 0.53 ERA from the fourth inning on...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 2-1 with a 1.06 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more...is 1-1 with a 0.86 ERA and .149 opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA and .226 opponents average in six starts at night...is 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA in four starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss at Houston last Tuesday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA in three career starts against Tampa Bay.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.80 ERA (19 er in 45.0 ip) over the last 15 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.82 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors (CIN, 5.14).
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...has the fewest saves in the American League (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 31-of-83 (37.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (Toronto, 40.6%).
- First batters faced are hitting .276 (34-for-123), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (26) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 24 of 44 games...the A's are 1-23 when the pen allows two runs or more, 13-7 when it allows one run or fewer.

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 13 outings (5.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 10.80 ERA), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafro (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in extra base hits, has the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.739) and is tied for second in home runs.
- Is tied for the AL lead in games pitched (21).
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (26) and is tied for the lead in inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters Tuesday night, ending his Athletics record tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
- First batters faced are 8-for-19 (.421) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the most in the majors and the home runs are tied for the most.
- Has not allowed a run in four outings against the Rays over the last two years (2.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 2 so).

Last Year: Posted a 1.57 ERA and allowed just 13.2% (5-of-38) of inherited runners to score in a career-high 69 appearances in his first full season in the majors... ranked third among AL relievers in pct. of inherited runners scored and fifth in ERA.
