OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-30) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (24-20)

SUNDAY, MAY 24, 2015 – TROPICANA FIELD – 1:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak yesterday and will be attempting to put together back-to-back wins for just the second time this year (April 13-14)...have lost eight of the last 10 games and 14 of the last 17...are now 7-22 (.241) over the last 29 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...have lost five consecutive series...are 15-30 (.333) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...it matches the second worst record after 45 games in Oakland history...the 1979 A's also started the year 15-30 (lost game 46) and the 1994 club was 13-32 (lost game 46)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 16th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games for the fourth consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since they finished the 2011 season 22 games back...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 16 days in fifth.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's won a day game for just the second time this year yesterday (May 3 at Texas)...are now 2-13 (.133) in day games compared to 13-17 (.433) at night...have the worst record and most losses in day games in the majors...are batting .239 (123-for-515) with 52 runs scored during the day (3.47 per game) compared to .265 (283-for-1069) with 140 runs at night (4.67 per game)...have hit 30 of their 39 home runs at night.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their sixth shutout of the season yesterday, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 8)...however, it was the A's first shutout since April 18 as the A's had five shutouts in the first 12 games...now have a 4.27 ERA (91 er in 192.0 ip) in May after logging a 3.65 ERA in April...have the third highest May ERA in the AL after posting the fourth lowest April ERA...for the season, rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (348) but have issued the third most walks (143)...are tied for second in pickoffs (4)...A's starting pitchers are 2-6 despite a 3.10 ERA (24 er in 69.2 ip) over the last 12 games...have a 3.55 ERA (104 er in 263.1 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the AL (Tampa Bay, 3.43)...also rank third in innings pitched (263.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 18 of the last 20 games (25 errors total) and have 46 errors for the season...that is nine more than any other team (Milwaukee, 37)...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

OFFENSE: The A's scored five runs last night after scoring just nine runs over the first five games of the road trip...have scored just 26 runs over the last 10 games (2.60 per game) and are 14-for-99 (.141) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...were shutout for the fourth time Thursday night, which is second most in the American League to Tampa Bay (5)...are batting .237 (141-for-595) over the last 17 games, including .183 (28-for-153) with RISP...hit .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...are 28-for-34 (82.4%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the AL...are third in triples (11) and fourth in batting (.256).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this seven-game road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...including this trip, the A's have now finished with a .500 record or worse on each of their last 10 road trips dating back to last year, which is the A's longest such streak since a 12-trip streak from Aug. 6, 1996-Aug. 31, 1997...last had a winning road trip June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)...have lost nine of the last 11 road games and are 10-16 (.385) for the season...return home following the game today for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors.

IN MAY: The A's are 6-16 (.273) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 5-15)...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to that, had 14 straight months with a winning record...the 16 losses match the A's most in May over the last six years (2012).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for the fifth most games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff has allowed eight home runs in the last five games after yielding just three over the previous 11 contests...A's starting pitchers have allowed one home run in four of the five games after going 11 consecutive games without a home run from May 7 to 18...that was the longest homerless streak by A's starters since Aug. 20-31, 2001 when they also had an 11-game streak...starters have surrendered just 19 home runs in 263.1 innings for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the bullpen has also allowed 19 home runs, but in just 135.2 innings.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 14-21 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .214 (77-for-360) against lefties compared to .269 (329-for-1224) with 35 of their 39 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .202) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 11 players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson, Zobrist), which are their most on the DL at one time since Aug. 20-21, 2011, when they also had 11...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle and Zobrist are on rehab assignments...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's trail in the season series 2-1 after winning the season series last year, 4-2...won two of three in both Oakland and Tampa Bay...it was the A's third season series win in the last four years...hit .198 with 17 runs scored in the six games last year and are batting .207 (168-for-813) with 68 runs scored in 24 games against the Rays over the last four years (2.83 runs per game)...are 18-13 against the Rays over the last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 94-59 (.613) against Tampa Bay...are 52-22 in Oakland and 42-37 at Tropicana Field.

Tyler Clippard has not allowed a run in eight games on the road (8.2 ip) and has converted all four of his save opportunities...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .329 (27-for-82) in May after hitting .229 in April.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota...the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1994** Brent Gates singles in his first four at bats against Seattle after going 4 for 4 the day before to establish an Oakland record with eight consecutive hits...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in major league history to reach 300 saves...in **2009** Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44th player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-2, 1.92 ERA)

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-2 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 13 so) over his last two starts after going 4-0 with a 1.65 ERA over his first seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (1.92), opponents slugging percentage (.250) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.30), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.267), tied for fourth in innings pitched (61.0) and opponents batting average (.200) and eighth in strikeouts (57)...is also tied for fifth in wild pitches (5).

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 11 of his 14 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.67 ERA (11 er in 27.0 ip) in innings one through three and a 0.53 ERA (2 er in 34.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a 3.52 career ERA (61 er in 156.0 ip) in innings 1-3, 2.20 (46 er in 188.0 ip) from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.06 ERA (4 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) and .149 (11-for-74) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) and .226 (33-for-146) opponents average in six starts at night...has the lowest day ERA in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) and .155 (16-for-103) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) and .239 (28-for-117) opponents average in five starts on the road...has walked three batters in 30.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 30.2 innings on the road.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in May after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April...tied for third in the American League in wins in April and ranked ninth in ERA...went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in April.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (8 er in 48.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts against everyone else...is now 16-6 with a 2.11 ERA (46 er in 196.1 ip) in 29 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 7-9 with a 3.72 ERA (61 er in 147.2 ip) in 25 games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Leads American League pitchers in putouts (11), ranks third in total chances (20) and tied for eighth in assists (9)...has tossed at least seven innings in five of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times, yielded one earned run or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...the A's are 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments and are 28-24 (.538) in his career...struck out at least nine batters in three consecutive starts from May 3-13, which matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years (fourth time, last by Jeff Samardzija from Aug. 25-Sept. 5, 2014)...had a wild pitch in five consecutive games from April 22 to May 13, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest by an A's pitcher since Stu Flythe also had a five-game streak from July 1 to 31, 1936.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with the loss May 13 against Boston, despite allowing just one run in seven innings...had started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a five-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 28, 2014...posted a 1.40 ERA and .194 opponents batting average during that streak, which spanned eight starts.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS: Allowed a lead off home run to Ackley in the third inning April 11 against Seattle to snap his season-opening scoreless streak at 10.0 innings...it snapped an overall scoreless streak of 20.0 innings dating back to Sept. 23, 2014...that is a new career high, surpassing his previous best of 14.0 innings (twice, last: April 23-May 4, 2014).

20 CAREER WINS: His Opening Day win was the 20th victory of his career and it came in his 46th appearance...joins Tim Hudson (37 games), Vida Blue (39), A.J. Griffin (44) and Barry Zito (45) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to win 20 games in 46 or fewer career outings.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Made his second consecutive Opening Day start April 6 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...it marked the third time in Oakland history the starting pitcher did not allow a run on Opening Day...

he also did it last year and Tim Hudson did it in 2003...is now 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two career Opening Day starts (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so).

2015 START-BY-START: Combined with Evan Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas on Opening Day **April 6**...tossed eight innings and allowed the only hit on a Ryan Rua single to lead off the eighth inning...walked just one batter...it was the 13th time in Oakland history a pitcher tossed at least eight shutout innings while allowing one hit or fewer and one walk or fewer, the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss to Seattle **April 11** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...had a 2-1 lead when he was relieved with one out and a runner on first in eighth inning...the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Kansas City **April 17**...allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on two-out RBI singles by Hosmer, Gordon and Perez...left after six innings with the score tied 4-4...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-2 win at Los Angeles **April 22**...allowed a run in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the third inning but then retired each of the final 14 batters he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland **April 28**...allowed two runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Freese...retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including 13 straight at one point...won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-1 win at Texas **May 3**...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and struck out 10 while walking a career-high seven batters...the seven walks matched the most by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 in a game with 10 or more strikeouts (Bobby Shantz, May 30, 1952 vs. New York, G#2)...they equaled the most in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not allow a run (Eric Plunk, July 26, 1986 vs. Toronto; Vida Blue, Sept. 15, 1973 vs. Texas)...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts (12, Sept. 23, 2014 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...tossed a career-high 119 pitches...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss in 11 innings at Seattle **May 8**...it was the 50th start of his career...allowed his only run in the second inning when Seager led off with a double and scored on a Morrison single...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Boston **May 13** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run...allowed a leadoff single to Ramirez in the second...he went to second on a wild pitch and scored on a Nava single...retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...the A's were shutout on five hits by Miley, Tazawa and Uehara.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Houston last Tuesday...allowed a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and the A's scored a run in the third inning to make the score 2-1...also allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the fifth and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth with the A's trailing 3-2.

Bay May 22...blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing a RBI single to Escobar in the seventh...Cobb blanked the A's on three hits over 6.2 innings, but the A's scored a run in the ninth to tie the game...then took the loss in a 7-3 decision in Oakland Aug. 6...allowed a career-high seven runs in 4.1 innings...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the second inning but then allowed three runs in both the fourth and fifth innings...Kiermaier had a two-run home run in the fourth and Jennings had a two-run single in the fifth...his lone win came in a 2-1 A's victory in Oakland on August 31, 2013...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and allowed five hits and a walk...allowed just one base runner past second base.

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-4, 4.43 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .267 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)...went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...has the most unearned runs (7) and opponents reaching base on an error (6) in the American League...has allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .198 against right-handed hitters compared to .305 against left-handers...has allowed just two home run in 44.2 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 0-3 with a 5.73 ERA in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss at Houston on Wednesday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...has never faced Detroit in his career.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.56 ERA (19 er in 48.0 ip) over the last 16 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.71 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...has the fewest saves in the AL (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%)...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8).
- Has allowed 31-of-84 (36.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .272 (34-for-125), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (26) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 24 of 45 games...the A's are 1-23 when the pen allows two runs or more, 14-7 when it allows one run or fewer.

- Has pitched fewer than 1.0 innings in each of his last 13 outings (5.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr, 10.80 ERA), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the previous high was 12 by Mike Venafró (July 12-Sept. 22, 2002) and Jay Marshall (May 19-June 14, 2007).
- Has allowed 15 hits, 10 of which are for extra bases (five doubles, one triple, four home runs)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in extra base hits, has the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.739) and is tied for third in home runs.
- Is tied for fourth in the AL in games pitched (21).
- Leads the majors in inherited runners (26) and is tied for the lead in inherited runners scored (10).
- Faced three batters Tuesday night, ending his Athletics record tying streak of five consecutive games facing just one batter (Mike Mohler, June 1-21, 1993; Buddy Groom, July 5-14, 1998).
