OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-30) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (26-19)

MONDAY, MAY 25, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have put together consecutive wins for just the second time this year (April 13-14)...have not won three straight since Aug. 7-9, 2014...with a win today, the A's will end a 90-game streak without a winning streak longer than two games (Aug. 10, 2014-May 22, 2015)...split the four-game series at Tampa Bay over the weekend, snapping a five-series losing streak...are 3-8 over the last 11 games and 4-14 over the last 18...are 8-22 (.267) over the last 30 games (beginning April 23) after starting the year 8-8...are 16-30 (.348) overall, which is the worst record in the majors...it is the third worst record after 46 games in Oakland history...the 1994 A's started the year 13-33 (lost game 47) and the 1979 club was 15-31 (won game 47)...are in fifth place in the American League West for the 17th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 13½ games for the fifth consecutive day...that is the A's largest deficit since they finished the 2011 season 22 games back...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by more than 13 games before the end of May...trailed by 14 games in 2001 from May 29-31...have spent six days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, five days in second, three days tied for second, two days in third, five days tied for third, seven days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

NIGHT AND DAY: Have won back-to-back day games for the first time since July 4-24, 2014 when they won six straight...lost 13 of the first 14 day games this year...are now 3-13 (.188) during the day compared to 13-17 (.433) at night...have the worst record in day games in the majors and are tied with Chicago (AL) for the most losses...are batting .239 (131-for-547) with 59 runs scored during the day (3.69 per game) compared to .265 (283-for-1069) with 140 runs at night (4.67 per game).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and New York-AL (four games) today...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3), the A's second consecutive 1-5 homestand...have lost 12 of their last 14 home games and are 5-14 (.263) at home for the season, which is the worst home record in the majors...it matches the 1994 A's for worst record after 19 home games in Oakland history (lost game 20 in 1994)...have finished with a losing record on all three homestands...the last time the A's had three straight losing homestands in one season was in 2005...finished with a losing record on each of the final two homestands of 2014 and the streak of five consecutive losing homestands matches the longest in Oakland history (last four of 1978, first of 1979)...have not won consecutive home games this year...have yet to win a home series this year (five losses, one split)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have lost nine of the last 12 road games and are 11-16 (.407) for the season.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have gone consecutive games without allowing a run for the first time this year...are 3-6 despite a 2.89 ERA (24 er in 74.2 ip) over the last 13 games...have a 3.49 ERA (104 er in 268.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in innings pitched (268.1)...the pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.12 ERA (36 er in 104.0 ip) over the last 12 games...for the season, rank fourth in the AL in strikeouts (356) but have issued the third most walks (144)...lead the league in shutouts (6) and are tied for second in pickoffs (4).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 33 runs over the last 11 games (3.00 per game) and are 15-for-107 (.140) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...are batting .238 (149-for-627) over the last 18 games, including .180 (29-for-161) with RISP...hit .310 with RISP over the first 28 games...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (29-for-35, 82.9%), third in triples (11) and fourth in batting (.256)...have been shutout four times, which is second most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in 18 of the last 21 games (25 errors total) and have 46 errors for the season...that is eight more than any other team (Milwaukee and Texas, 38)...the errors have led to 29 unearned runs, which is the most in the majors...did not commit an error last Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive games with an error...that was third longest streak in Oakland history and was the longest since the 1982 club had a 17-game streak from May 6-23.

IN MAY: The A's are 7-16 (.304) in May, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 6-15)...have clinched a losing record in May, their fourth consecutive month under .500 dating back to last August...prior to

that, had 14 straight months with a winning record...the 16 losses match the A's most in May over the last six years (2012).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-13 (.133) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors...also lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for the sixth most games...are 3-19 (.136) in games decided by two runs or fewer and have the most losses and worst record in the majors in those games...are 0-6 in extra inning games and the six-game extra inning losing streak matches the longest such streak by an A's team over the last 20 years (May 18-July 5, 2011 and May 21-July 25, 1999)...are tied with Pittsburgh for the Major League lead in extra inning losses and are tied for the second most games (St. Louis, 7)...are 0-9 in games decided in the last at bat...also lost their final last at bat game of 2014 and the 10-game losing streak in games decided in the last at bat matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (May 14-July 17, 1989)...are the only team without a last at bat win and are tied with Pittsburgh and Seattle for the most losses.

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff has allowed eight home runs in the last six games after yielding just three over the previous 11 contests...A's starting pitchers have allowed just 19 home runs in 268.1 innings, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...the bullpen has also allowed 19 home runs, but in just 139.2 innings...the 38 home runs allowed by the team are tied for third fewest in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 1-9 when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 15-21 when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is the worst in the majors...are batting .214 (77-for-360) against lefties compared to .268 (337-for-1256) with 38 of their 42 home runs off righties...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Boston, .209) and the mark against righties is third highest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-16 when they are outthomered, 2-12 in the final game of a series and 2-18 when scoring fewer than four runs...have allowed 40 runs in the seventh inning, which is 10 more than any other team...have a 6.46 ERA (33 er in 46.0 ip) and .304 (59-for-194) opponents batting average in the seventh inning...have used 15 relievers, which is one more than the season total for 2013 and 2014.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have 10 players on the disabled list (Crisp, Davis, Doolittle, Griffin, Ladendorf, Mujica, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Thompson)...Griffin, Parker and Thompson are on the 60-day DL...Doolittle is on a rehab assignment...have had at least seven players on the DL all year and have used it a total of 15 times...used it 18 times last year after using it 13 times in 2013...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lost the season series last year, 5-2...split four games in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Detroit...have a four-game losing streak, which is the A's longest against the Tigers since Sept. 14, 1997-Aug. 14, 1998 when they lost seven straight...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won one season series, lost three and split two...are 21-25 against the Tigers over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-240 against the Tigers...that includes 137-107 in Oakland, 106-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 913-993 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 25-19 on Memorial Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 17-11 in Oakland and 8-8 on the road...this is the 19th Memorial Day meeting between the A's and Tigers, the eighth since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968...are 9-9, including 4-3 since moving to Oakland...also met last year on Memorial Day, a 10-0 A's win in Oakland...**Brett Lawrie** is batting .329 (27-for-82) in May after hitting .229 in April.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 the A's win their 17th consecutive game in a 4-2 win over the Yankees at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won an American League record 20 consecutive games...in 1975 Gene Tenace connects for the 6000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-4, 4.43 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA (18 er in 27.2 ip) and .267 (32-for-120) opponents batting average over his last five starts... the losing streak matches his career high (Aug. 5, 2014-April 7, 2015)... went 1-1 with a 2.12 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his first three starts...left his third start April 18 at Kansas City with a blister and missed his turn in the rotation April 23.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the most unearned runs (7) and opponents reaching base on an error (6) in the American League...is tied for fifth in hit batters (4).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .198 (16-for-81) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (29-for-95) against left-handers...has yielded a .185 (10-for-54) average with two outs, .287 (35-for-122) with zero or one out...has a .288 (19-for-66) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .179 (12-for-67) the second time through and .326 (14-for-43) after that...opponents are batting .311 (14-for-45) with no walks and three hit by pitches when leading off an inning...has allowed a .326 (14-for-43) average with runners in scoring position.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just two home run in 44.2 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...both have been hit by right-handed hitters... yielded four home runs in 2014, all by left-handed hitters...has surrendered six home runs in 118.0 career innings (0.46 per nine innings)... five have come with runners on base.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-3 with a 5.73 ERA (14 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (8 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.63 ERA (10 er in 16.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 2.25 (6 er in 24.0 ip) over innings three through five and 11.57 (6 er in 4.2 ip) from the sixth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for third in the American League with three losses in May...the A's are 1-7 (.125) in his starting assignments...the Padres went 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignment last year...has tossed six innings or fewer in seven of his eight starts this year...has tossed more than six innings in just four of his 20 career starts...has walked two batters or fewer in seven of his starts...was acquired from San Diego Dec. 18, 2014 with pitcher R.J. Alvarez for catcher Derek Norris, minor league pitcher Seth Streich and international bonus slot 117.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas April 7 in Oakland...allowed base runners in each of his first five innings, including the third when he allowed a RBI single to Fielder...allowed two mor runs in the fourth when Fielder had another RBI single and Andrus scored on a Gentry error...retired the side in order in his final inning, the sixth, and left after six innings trailing 3-1.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss to Seattle April 12 in Oakland...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...Seager was erased on a double play and Graveman took a no-hitter and a 3-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...Miller had a sacrifice fly, two more runs scored on a Josh Reddick error and Seager had a RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th.

THIRD START: He combined with Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Kansas City April 18...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 29...allowed a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-7 loss at Minnesota May 4...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning but he allowed four runs in the second on a Schafer RBI double, a Santana RBI single and a Dozier two-run double...Oakland scored a run in the sixth to take a 5-4 lead but he put runners on second and third to start the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Alvarez who allowed both runs to score plus two of his own.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-2 loss at Seattle May 9...yielded a career-high tying six runs for the second consecutive start...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Cruz RBI double

and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score.

SEVENTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Chicago (AL) May 15 in Oakland...faced eight batters in the first inning but allowed just two runs on a bases loaded walk to LaRoche and a Gillaspie RBI single...the A's scored four times in the fourth and he left with a 6-2 lead and runners on first and second with one out in the seventh...the bullpen allowed both runs to score and the White Sox scored five unearned runs in the inning (Scribner blown save).

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 6-1 loss at Houston last Wednesday...tossed a career-high 108 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Marisnick in the third inning and the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth...retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth but Spring single and Carter hit a two-run home run..

2014 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with San Diego and went 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, over four stints with the Padres...surrendered just four home runs in 73.1 innings, an average of 0.49 per nine innings...went 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his first nine starts, 0-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his final five games, including three starts

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for third among National League rookies in wins, ranked sixth in strikeouts (70), tied for ninth in games started and 10th in innings pitched (73.1).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which included a .200 (25-for-125) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .227 (32-for-141) against left-handers...did not yield a home run to any of the 153 right-handers he faced and had a .256 opponents slugging percentage against righties...all four of the home runs he allowed came with runners on base...opponents hit .211 with runners in scoring position, including .185 with RISP and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 7-3 with a 2.96 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments, 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two relief appearances...inherited three runners in his two relief appearances and allowed all three to score...first batters faced were 0-for-1 with a walk

RHP Jesse Chavez (1-4, 2.89 ERA): Is 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA and .250 opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA and .191 opponents batting average over his first seven games, including three starts...began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in his four relief appearances (6.2 ip)...is 1-4 with a 3.41 ERA in his six starting assignments...has not allowed a run in the first two innings and has a 1.32 ERA from the sixth inning on...has yielded 13 of his 16 runs in the third through fifth innings (6.00 ERA)...has allowed just two home runs in 43.2 innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-0 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Thursday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .404 opponents batting average in nine career appearances, including two starts, against Detroit...was 0-2 with a 6.54 ERA in two starts last year.

- The A's bullpen has posted a 3.63 ERA (21 er in 52.0 ip) over the last 17 games but has four losses and three blown saves over that stretch... compiled a 7.98 ERA over the previous 15 contests...now has a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Is tied with Seattle for most losses in the majors (12)...tied for the fewest saves (5) and the lowest save percentage (38.5%) in the majors...is tied with Texas for the most blown saves (8) in the AL.
- Has allowed 33-of-87 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .271 (35-for-129), which is third highest in the AL...have the most first batter RBI in the majors (28) and rank third in home runs (7).
- Has allowed two runs or more in 25 of 48 games...the A's are 2-23 when the pen allows two runs or more, 14-7 when it allows one run or fewer.
