MLB CELEBRATES MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND

• MLB will again participate in the National Moment of Remembrance during Memorial Day Weekend, a program it has participated in since 1997, to honor soldiers who lost their lives during active military duty. MLB will conduct a moment of silence before all games throughout the weekend and all games on Monday will pause at 3 p.m. (local time) for a moment of silence.

• For games on Memorial Day, MLB clubs will wear special caps and jerseys. All of MLB's net proceeds from the sale of those caps and jerseys will be donated to the Welcome Back Veterans program, which provides grants to university hospitals throughout the country to treat veterans suffering from PTSD and traumatic brain injury. MLB has committed \$30 million to Welcome Back Veterans.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers concluded their seven-game homestand with a 10-8 loss to the Astros on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Miguel Cabrera hit his 11th home run of the season and went 2x5 in the loss, while Nick Castellanos, Yoenis Cespedes, Anthony Gose and J.D. Martinez each contributed two hits. Bryan Holaday had three RBI and went 1x3 with a double. Alex Wilson took the loss in relief for Detroit, giving up two runs on two hits with two strikeouts in 0.2 innings. The Tigers open a seven-game road trip this afternoon as they begin a three-game series vs. Oakland. Following the series vs. the Athletics, the Tigers remain on the road for a four-game set vs. the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim.

LOBSTEIN PLACED ON DL, MACHADO RECALLED: The Tigers announced on Sunday that they have placed lefthanded pitcher Kyle Lobstein on the 15-day disabled list with a sore left shoulder. Prior to Sunday's game, the Tigers recalled the contract of infielder Dixon Machado from Triple A Toledo. In 40 games this season with the Mud Hens, Machado hit .274 (43x157) with 19 runs scored, six doubles, one home run and 16 RBI. The Tigers also announced on Sunday that righthanded pitcher Buck Farmer will start Thursday's game vs. the Angels.

MIGGY EXTENDS HITTING STREAK TO 12 GAMES: Miguel Cabrera improved his hitting streak to 12 games as he was 2x5 with two walks, one double, a home run and a RBI in yesterday's game. Over his 12-game streak, Cabrera is hitting .419 (19x46) with 10 runs scored, three doubles, one triple, five home runs and 11 RBI. Cabrera's hitting streak is the longest by a Tigers player this season and is the second-longest active hitting streak in the American League.

CABRERA MOVING UP THE MLB, TIGERS HOME RUN LIST: Miguel Cabrera hit his 11th home run of the season in yesterday's loss. The home run was also Cabrera's 263rd as a member of the Tigers, breaking a tie with Willie Horton for sole possession of fourth place in franchise history. Cabrera has a total of 401 home runs in his major league career, which ranks 52nd in MLB history. He's six home runs away from tying Duke Snider for 51st in major league history with 407 home runs.

GOLDEN GOSE: Anthony Gose had a pair of hits, including a double, and a RBI in yesterday's game. Gose recorded his 14th multi-hit game of the season, which ranks tied for 13th in the American League. Gose has hit safely in 14 of his last 21 games and is batting .345 (29x84) with 11 runs scored, seven doubles, two triples and six RBI during the stretch.

CESPEDES RETURNS TO OAKLAND: Today's game marks the first game for Yoenis Cespedes in Oakland since he was traded by the Athletics to the Boston Red Sox on July 31, 2014. Cespedes was traded to the Tigers from Boston on December 11, 2014. Cespedes played in 365 games with Oakland, hitting .262 (371x1415) with 206 runs scored, 72 doubles, 12 triples, 66 home runs and 229 RBI. In his career at O.co Coliseum, Cespedes has a .277 (189x682) career batting average with 103 runs scored, 28 doubles, six triples, 35 home runs and 114 RBI.

MIGGY ON THE MARK AGAINST OAKLAND: Miguel Cabrera has compiled impressive numbers in his career against the Athletics. Cabrera is hitting .337 (67x199) with 40 runs scored, 14 doubles, 17 home runs and 54 RBI in 55 career games vs. Oakland. Cabrera leads all active players with a .438 on-base percentage and a .663 slugging percentage vs. Oakland and ranks third with a .337 batting average. Cabrera has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games vs. the Athletics.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers begin a seven-game road trip, which includes three games vs. Oakland and four games vs. the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim, this afternoon. The Tigers are 12-7 on the road this season and have won five of their last eight games away from Comerica Park. Detroit's .632 road winning percentage ranks second in the American League, while their 12 road wins ranks tied for fourth.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers have been involved in 20 instant replay challenges so far this season. Detroit has challenged eight plays with four calls being overturned and four plays standing as called. Opponents have made 11 challenges with six plays standing as called and five calls being overturned. There has been one crew chief initiated review with that play being overturned.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his second season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

-Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.

-Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.

-Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.

-Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10) ... made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.

-Ranks second all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 1,766 games started and 15,082.2 innings played.

RONDON INJURY REHAB: Righthanded pitcher Bruce Rondon made an injury rehab appearance with Triple A Toledo last night, throwing a scoreless inning of relief to earn the win. In two injury rehab appearances with the Mud Hens, Rondon has a 1-0 record with a 5.40 ERA (1.2IP/1ER) and one strikeout. Rondon has been sidelined since April 1 with bicipital tendinitis.

TODAY'S TIGERS STARTER - SHANE GREENE

GOING GREENE: In his first season with the Tigers, Greene will make his 10th start of the 2015 season today at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Greene turned in his fifth quality start of the season on Wednesday vs. Milwaukee, but did not factor into the decision. Greene allowed two runs on three hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Greene is making his fifth road start of the season today. In his first four road starts this season, Greene has compiled a 2-1 record with a 5.40 ERA (20.0IP/12ER). In 11 career road appearances, including 10 starts, Greene has a 6-1 record with a 3.65 ERA (56.2IP/23ER) and 60 strikeouts.

O.CO COLISEUM DEBUT: Today's start vs. the Athletics marks Greene's first career appearance at O.co Coliseum.

RECORD IN MAY: Greene has made four starts in May this season and has compiled a 1-1 record with a 3.27 ERA (22.0IP/8ER) and 14 strikeouts.

IMPRESSIVE FIRST THREE STARTS: Greene turned in three excellent starts to begin his Tigers career. In each of his first three starts, Greene worked 7.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-fewer. Greene became the fourth Tigers pitcher to start a season with three straight starts of at least 7.0 innings pitched and one run-or-fewer allowed since 1914 and the first since Al Benton in 1945.

ROUGH ON RIGHTIES: Greene has been tough on righthanded hitters during his time in the majors. Righties are batting .213 (51x240) against Greene, while lefthanded hitters are batting .294 (77x262). In his first nine starts this season, righthanded hitters are batting .165 (15x91), while lefties are hitting .314 (32x102).

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Greene finished his rookie season with 81 strikeouts in 78.2 innings. He ranked fourth among major league rookies with 9.27 strikeouts per nine innings (min. 75.0 innings pitched).

STRONG START TO HIS CAREER: In each of his first two big league starts, Greene worked 4.2 innings before allowing his first hit of the game. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Greene was the first major league pitcher to record 4.2-or-more innings before allowing a hit in each of his first two major league starts since Cincinnati's Wayne Simpson accomplished the feat on April 9, 1970 at Los Angeles and April 14, 1970 vs. San Diego.

EARNING HIS FIRST WIN: Greene earned the first win of his major league career on July 7 at Cleveland, allowing two runs on four hits with two strikeouts in 6.0 innings. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Greene became the first pitcher in Yankees franchise history to earn a win in his first start, while tossing at least 6.0 innings and allowing four-or-fewer hits without walking a batter.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Greene was acquired by the Tigers from the Yankees as part of a three-team deal with New York and Arizona on December 5, 2014. Greene was selected by the Yankees in the ninth round of the June 2009 draft.
