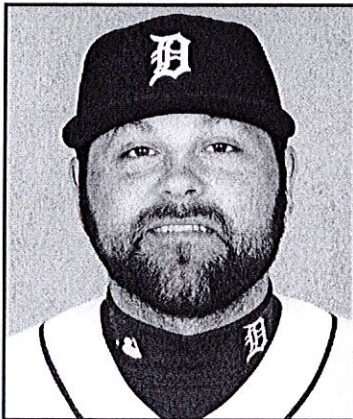

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

The 2015 season will mark Chamberlain's second with the Tigers organization.

- Since his debut in 2007, he ranks 15th among AL relievers with 9.41 strikeouts per nine innings (minimum 220.0 IP).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Completed his first season with the Tigers in 2014, appearing in 69 games out of the bullpen.

- Ranked second among American League relievers with 29 holds.
- Did not allow a run in six straight outings from 4/9-22 (6.2IP), walking just two batters and striking out 11 during that stretch.
- Recorded the save on 4/22 vs. CWS, the sixth of his career and first since 4/27/13 vs. TOR.
- Did not allow a run in 12 consecutive outings from 5/14-6/7 (10.2IP) -- walked two batters and struck out seven during that stretch.
- Finished the month of May with a 0-1 record, one save and a 1.38 ERA (13.0IP/2ER) in 13 appearances.
- Recorded 300th game of his major league career on 7/11 at KC.
- Limited righthanded hitters to a .237 (27x114) batting average...held lefties to a .252 (30x119) batting average.
- Posted a 1-2 record with one save and a 3.58 ERA (32.2IP/13ER) in 35 appearances at Comerica Park...compiled a 1-3 record with one save and a 3.56 ERA (30.1IP/12ER) in 34 outings on the road.
- Compiled a 1-3 record, two saves and a 2.63 ERA in 40 appearances prior to the All-Star break...posted a 1-2 record with a 4.97 ERA (25.1IP/14ER) in 28 outings after the All-Star break.

Made his fifth career opening day roster with the Yankees in 2013.

- Earned his only save of the season on April 27 versus Toronto after tossing a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first career save since September 21, 2010 versus Tampa Bay.
- Placed on the 15-day disabled list on May 3 (retroactive to April 28) with a right oblique strain...made one rehab appearance with Triple A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, tossing 1.0 scoreless inning.
- Reinstated from the disabled list on May 28.
- Fanned a season-high three batters on May 30 versus New York Mets -- equaled the high on July 14 versus Minnesota.
- Matched a career-high, tossing 2.0 innings of relief on July 30 at Tampa Bay.
- Retired 16 batters without allowing a hit from August 23-September 1 -- according to Elias, it marks the second-longest such streak of his career.
- Limited lefthanded hitters to a .257 average (19x74), while righties batted .295 (28x95) with him on the mound.

Spent the majority of the 2012 season on the disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (performed in June 2011) and a right ankle dislocation (suffered March 22, 2012).

- Began an injury rehabilitation assignment with the GCL Yankees on July 10 -- tossed 4.0 scoreless innings over three starts.
- Had his injury rehabilitation assignment transferred to Single A Tampa on July 20...posted a 0-1 record and a 2.25 ERA (4.0IP/1ER) in three outings...made one appearance with Double A Trenton on July 29, tossing 1.1 scoreless innings to earn the win.
- Reinstated from the 60-day disabled list on July 31...missed the first 102 games of the season.
- Appeared in back-to-back games for the first time in his career on August 6 and 7 at Detroit.
- Tied a career-high with four strikeouts in a relief appearance on September 9 at Baltimore.
- Made his 200th career major league appearance on August 20 at Chicago's U.S. Cellular Field.



2015 TIGERS

Made his fourth straight Opening Day roster for the Yankees in 2011 before undergoing season-ending Tommy John surgery on June 16.

- Allowed opponents to score in just two of his final 16 appearances of the season, coming in back-to-back outings against Boston on May 13 and May 15...did not allow a run in his final eight outings of the season from May 16-June 5 (9.2IP/0ER).
- Posted a 2-0 record and a 2.83 ERA (28.2IP/9ER) in 27 relief appearances before being placed on the 15-day disabled list on June 8 with a strained right flexor muscle.
- Underwent an MRI on June 9 that relieved a torn medial collateral ligament in his right elbow...underwent Tommy John surgery in Pensacola, FL on June 16...Dr. James Andrews performed the surgery.
- Had his contract transferred to the 60-day disabled list on June 10.

Tied for fourth in the American League with 73 appearances in his first full season out of the bullpen for the Yankees in 2010.

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day roster...held opponents scoreless in 14 of his first 17 outings to begin the season.
- Earned the save in back-to-back games on May 3 and 4 versus Baltimore -- his first save since September 23, 2007 versus Toronto.
- Struck out the side in a perfect inning of work on May 14 versus Minnesota...was credited with the win despite not being the pitcher of record when the Yankees took the lead.
- Posted a 2-0 record and a 2.15 ERA (29.1IP/7ER) and 30 strikeouts in his final 30 appearances of the season (July 28-October 3).
- Limited lefties to a .246 (31x126) batting average...righthanded hitters batted .258 (40x155) with him on the mound.

Posted a career-high nine wins and 133 strikeouts in his first full season at the major league level in 2009 with the Yankees.

- Led the American League with 12 hit batsmen.
- Did not record a decision in his first three starts of the season and 11 of his first 17 starts of 2009...According to Elias, his 10 decisions (7-3) through his first 29 career starts were the fewest in major league history.
- Hit a batter in four consecutive starts from April 24-May 10 -- matched the longest such streak for a Yankees pitcher in the last 50 years.
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on May 5 at Boston...became the youngest Yankees pitcher to strike out 12-or-more batters since Al Downing on June 21, 1964 (Game 2) at Chicago White Sox -- that same game he became one of five pitchers in major league history to strike out 12-or-more batters while pitching less than 6.0 innings in a game, joining Cole Hamels (2006), Curt Schilling (1997), Kevin Appier (1994) and J.R. Richardson (1978).
- Won his first four starts following the All-Star break, posting a 2.03 ERA (26.2IP/6ER) and a .156 opponents batting average from July 19-August 6.
- Limited opponents to three hits-or-fewer in three straight starts from July 19-29 -- became the first Yankees pitcher to limit opponents to three hits-or-fewer since Randy Johnson did so in April of 2005.
- Recorded his first win at Yankee Stadium on July 19 versus Detroit, snapping a nine start winless stretch at home to begin the season...marked the longest winless start streak at home by a Yankees pitcher since Andy Dawkins and Tim Leary in 1990.
- Issued a career-high seven walks on August 6 at Boston but still recorded the win...According to Elias, it marked the most walks issued by a Yankees pitcher who also recorded the victory since David Cone walked seven in a 12-3 Yankees win on April 9, 1999 at Detroit.
- Set a franchise record by pitching 4.0 innings or less in six consecutive starts from August 25-September 20.
- Made one relief appearance out of the bullpen on October 4 at Tampa Bay.
- Posted a 5-3 record and a 4.03 ERA in 13 games (12 starts) on the road...was 4-3 with a 5.28 ERA (90.1IP/53ER) in 19 starts at home -- had the second-highest home ERA by a starter in the American League.
- Made 10 relief appearances in the postseason, going 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (6.1IP/2ER)...earned the win in Game 4 of the World Series.

Completed his first full season at the major league level in 2008, splitting time between the bullpen and starting rotation.

- Ranked first among American League rookies with a 2.60 ERA, while he was second with 118 strikeouts, fourth with a .233 opponents batting average and seventh with 100.1 innings pitched.
- Opened the season out of the bullpen with the Yankees before making the transition to starter on May 24.



- Made his first career start but did not record a decision in a 2.1 inning outing on June 3 versus Toronto.
- Held opponents to three earned runs-or-less in each of his first 11 major league starts from June 3-July 30, becoming the first pitcher to do so since the Marlins Josh Johnson did so in 13 straight starts from 2005-06.

- Earned his first career win as a starter in June 25 at Pittsburgh with a 6.2 inning scoreless performance...tossed a career-high 114 pitches that same day.
- Pitched his 100th career major league inning on July 25 at Boston and did so with 124 strikeouts and 24 ER...the 124 strikeouts marks the most for any Yankees pitcher through their first 100 innings in franchise history, while the 24 runs are second only to Dave Righetti who allowed 23 runs through his first 100.0 inning pitched in 1981.

- Sidelined August 6-September 2 with a right shoulder strain.
- After being reinstated from the disabled list, he spent the remainder of the season in the Yankees bullpen.
- Posted a 2.38 ERA (11.1IP/3ER) and 14 strikeouts in his first 10 appearances after returning from the disabled list.
- Rated as possessing the best fastball, best curveball and best slider among all pitchers in the Yankees system by *Baseball America*....also ranked as the Yankees top prospect by *Baseball America*.

Made his first appearance at the major league level in 2007 as he pitched for the Tampa Yankees, Double A Trenton, Triple A Scranton Wilkes-Barre and New York.

- Opened the season with Single A Tampa...appeared in seven games, posting a 4-0 record and a 2.03 ERA (40.0IP/9ER) and 51 strikeouts...promoted to Double A Trenton in June, posting a 4-2 record and a 3.35 ERA (40.1IP/15ER) and 66 strikeouts in eight appearances (seven starts)...made three appearances with Triple A Scranton before having his contract purchased by the Yankees on August 7.
- Made his major league debut that same day, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto.
- Did not allow a run in his first 15.1 innings pitched in the major leagues -- marks the second-longest such streak by any Yankees pitcher to begin their career, trailing only Slow Joe Doyle who tossed 18.0 scoreless innings to begin his major league career in 1906.
- On suspended list August 31-September 1.
- Earned his first win on September 5 at Seattle, tossing 1.0 inning of scoreless relief.
- Recorded his first career save on his birthday, September 23 versus Toronto...is only the third pitcher in history to earn his first career major league save on his birthday, joining D.J. Carrasco and Grant Roberts. *Source: Elias Sports Bureau*
- Made two appearances in the American League Division Series versus Cleveland...posting a 4.91 ERA.

PERSONAL/MISCELLANEOUS

- Justin Louis Chamberlain resides in Lincoln, NE in the offseason...has a son named Karter.
- Attended Division II Nebraska-Kearney his freshman year (2004), before transferring to the University of Nebraska the next season...a member of the 2005 Nebraska team that played in the College World Series.
- Named a 2006 First-Team Preseason All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* and Second-Team Preseason All-American by the National College Baseball Writers' Association...won the 2005 Big 12 "Newcomer Pitcher of the Year", while being named Third-team All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* and First Team All-Big 12.
- Has participated in the Tigers Winter Caravan.
